


The greatest task ever taken over by the Buddhist Church and the Y.B.A. of Camp I has been completed.

The planning of the Gatha book was started early in November by a committee consisting of the Reverends, Isseis, and Busseis. It took four months of hard work in compiling the contents, printing, and assembling the books was done by the Busseis.

The new Gatha book was seen by the public for the first time at the special service held in honor of its completion. It has green manila covers, with 77 pages in the book.

A total of 1000 odd copies were completed and each of the four churches will receive 200 copies. Copies will be given to all the Reverends, Buddhist Churches of all the centers, Y.B.A. organizations, and the former Y.B.A. members who are now in the armed forces. The remainder will be distributed to the Y.B.A. members of Poston I who wish to have a copy.

Much credit goes to Mr. Taniguchi who did such a fine job of writing Japanese section. The writing on the inside cover of the Japanese section was done by Rev. Masuoka. It means: "To seek the truth in the Great Love of Buddha". The poem, "Our Lord Buddha" in the English section was written by Ruth Kodama. The artist for the book was Mr. Eizo Etow.

With a very uneasy feeling and three friends, early one morning we drove out into wonderland, wondering what will happen.--Soon Poston was behind in the dust and California was before us. Over the Colorado River and here we come, California!--With one engine breakdown and feelings way low, on we went to Riverside where we stopped just long enough for food. Since evacuation, this was my first experience in a Calif. eating place, and personally, that is enough for the time being.--Night rapidly approached us and our next worry was a place to sleep. We headed on to Los Angeles. We were told that sleeping accommodations, well, you know that situation. Fortunately we met with little difficulty in finding a place to stay. A friend, living in a small room, part of a shop where he was working, invited us to stay. We all slept on the floor including the fleas, and they were a bit too friendly with us.--Next day our car needed a repair, and by the time that was completed it was too late to start on our trip. We decided if we were to stay overnight we should have some fun, so, that evening we had dinner, our first decent meal since Riverside. After dinner, took in a couple shows.--On the following day we headed for Imperial Valley. Our meal for the day was nothing but oranges.--On and on we traveled and we finally hit Westmorland; a small popular town.--Again, our first duty was to stay another night but we decided Poston was a better place, so after tending to our property which was burned, stolen, or trampled upon, we decided to return that day. After working ourselves til midnight, although, we were drowsy and exhausted, we headed for Poston.--Good ole' Arizona or Poston, it's getting to feel like home. And I sure hope I don't have to go through that sort of a trip again!!!!
