OUR BOYS AND GIRLS

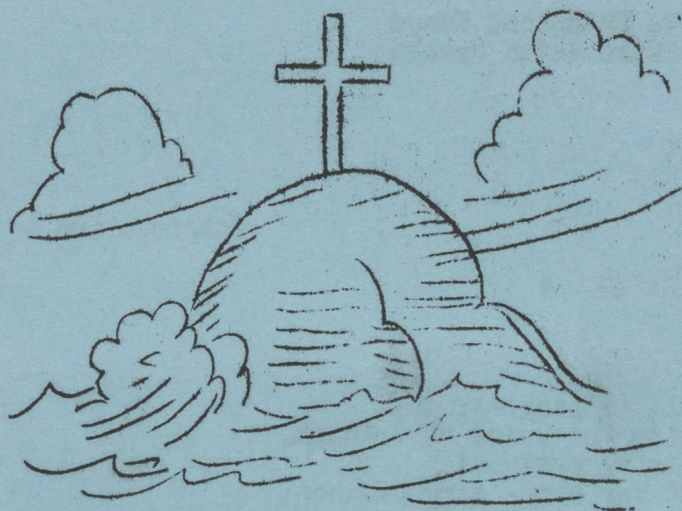

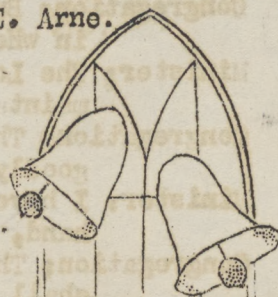
