MEMORANDUM FOR: Institutions Engaged in Research, Developmental or Training Activities for the Army or the Navy.

SUBJECT: Employment or Attendance of Persons of Japanese Ancestry at Educational Institutions Important to the War Effort.

1. The Provost Marshal General has certain responsibilities as to the employment or attendance of persons of Japanese ancestry at educational institutions important to the War effort and must see, inter alia, that no person of Japanese ancestry attends or is employed by an educational institution important to the war effort until The Provost Marshal General has approved such attendance or employment.

2. Definitions:

a. Person of Japanese ancestry; Any person with one or both parents of the Japanese race. Thus, this phrase covers both citizens and aliens of all classes, and includes evacuees from the Pacific Coast, voluntary migrants from that Coast prior to evacuation, and persons who normally have resided elsewhere in the United States or its possessions.

b. Institution: Any institution engaged in research, developmental or training activities for the Army or the Navy which is considered a facility important to the war effort.

3. So that the necessary steps may be taken without undue hardship on such institutions, it has been arranged between the Office of The Provost Marshal General, the War Relocation Authority, and the National Japanese American Student Relocation Council for the Council to assist both persons of Japanese ancestry and institutions in securing and completing the forms required, and in answering inquiries as to the procedures to be followed to secure the approval of The Provost Marshal General.

4. The following is furnished for the information of all concerned:

a. Particular attention is called to the fact that all persons of Japanese ancestry will be treated alike.

b. Neither the Council nor The Provost Marshal General's office will consider an application from a person of Japanese ancestry who wishes to attend an institution unless the application is accompanied by an indication that the person is acceptable to the institution as a student. Thus, any

person of Japanese ancestry who wishes to study at an institution must secure a provisional letter of acceptance, and the prospective student may seek this directly or through the Council. When a provisional letter of acceptance has been issued by the institution, the prospective student may obtain from the Council instructions and information as to how the approval of The Provost Marshal General may be secured.

5. An institution wishing to employ and/or to enroll as a student any person of Japanese ancestry will then submit a Personnel Security Questionnaire (W.D., P.M.G.O.-ID Form 58) for an American citizen of Japanese ancestry, or an Alien Questionnaire (W.D., P.M.G.O. Form 301) for a Japanese alien or national. If an institution proposes to employ a person of Japanese descent, the nature of the work to be performed must be indicated.

6. The questionnaire will be completed in septuplicate and forwarded by the institution to the National Japanese American Student Relocation Council for transmission to The Provost Marshal General's Office.

7. The approval or disapproval of The Provost Marshal General will be sent to the Council for transmission to the institution and to the student or prospective employee.

8. A questionnaire will not be required of a person of Japanese ancestry who:

a. Has been approved by the Japanese American Joint Board for employment in plants and facilities important to the war effort; or

b. Has been approved by The Provost Marshal General for employment in the same or more highly classified work; or

c. Is attending or employed or desirous of attending or employment at other than a listed institution.

9. Some persons of Japanese ancestry may have obtained employment at institutions without the approval of The Provost Marshal General and some students who have not secured his approval may now be at institutions. Both of these classes of persons may remain for the time being at the institutions, but applications for approval by The Provost Marshal General must be filed forthwith.
