

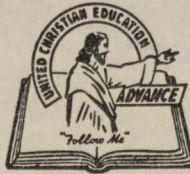

Dear Mrs. King:

Would you send to me at once, 200 copies of "American Fighting Men Speak Out". Galen Fisher let me take one of the copies he had with him at New York.

Also, I would like a quotation on quantity order of 3,000, 5,000, ~~at~~ 10,000 lots. If this order materializes, I would like to have the first page modified so as to clearly separate the two ideas embodied there. My suggestion is that the title be raised somewhat; that the cut be reduced by removal of a quarter of an inch at the bottom and possibly a little at the left; then, make a distinct break, even inserting a small design, or placing a heading to the Legion's statement before the quotation from Commander Houghton. This last matter ^{might} ~~will~~ be in some more pronounced type, but not such as to interfere with the good appearance of the page. I think this will be clear.

I assume that a large order would require reprinting and that this adjustment could easily be made. Also, since there is no type setup the set of reprints might be available at greatly reduced quantity price.
