A marked opinion is noted among Japanese evacuee workers as well as Caucasian administrative personnel toward the establishment of one standard wage for all classes of work, making no grades within skills thereby providing the payment of one standard wage for all classes of work, another group, somewhat smaller than the less desirable jobs should pay the \$19.00 rate, the reverse of common practice in outside fields.

Persons returning from group employment outside the center have shown some hesitancy to return to or accept center employment.

Some shifts in the various center employment loads are taking place, certain activities such as housing requiring a relatively large staff of evacuee help have released same to be placed on certain other activities whose needs are increasing.
