FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE ACT, THE FOLLOWING ARE THE DEFINITIONS OF THE TERMS USED IN THE ACT:

1. "Person" means any individual, partnership, firm, corporation, or other entity, whether or not organized under the laws of the United States, that is subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.

2. "War Relocation Authority" means the War Relocation Authority established by the War Relocation Act, as amended.

3. "Relocation" means the process of moving a person from one place to another, whether or not the person is a member of the War Relocation Authority.

4. "Relocation camp" means a place where a person is relocated, whether or not the person is a member of the War Relocation Authority.

5. "Relocation center" means a place where a person is relocated, whether or not the person is a member of the War Relocation Authority.

6. "Relocation office" means an office of the War Relocation Authority, whether or not the office is located in a relocation camp or center.

7. "Relocation agent" means a person who is authorized by the War Relocation Authority to act on its behalf in connection with the relocation of persons.

8. "Relocation fee" means a fee charged by the War Relocation Authority for the relocation of a person.

9. "Relocation bond" means a bond required by the War Relocation Authority for the relocation of a person.

10. "Relocation certificate" means a certificate issued by the War Relocation Authority for the relocation of a person.

11. "Relocation permit" means a permit issued by the War Relocation Authority for the relocation of a person.

12. "Relocation order" means an order issued by the War Relocation Authority for the relocation of a person.

13. "Relocation plan" means a plan for the relocation of a person, whether or not the plan is approved by the War Relocation Authority.

14. "Relocation report" means a report submitted to the War Relocation Authority regarding the relocation of a person.

15. "Relocation record" means a record maintained by the War Relocation Authority regarding the relocation of a person.

16. "Relocation file" means a file maintained by the War Relocation Authority regarding the relocation of a person.

17. "Relocation document" means any document relating to the relocation of a person, whether or not the document is issued by the War Relocation Authority.

18. "Relocation information" means any information relating to the relocation of a person, whether or not the information is provided by the War Relocation Authority.

19. "Relocation assistance" means any assistance provided by the War Relocation Authority for the relocation of a person.

20. "Relocation program" means a program for the relocation of a person, whether or not the program is approved by the War Relocation Authority.
