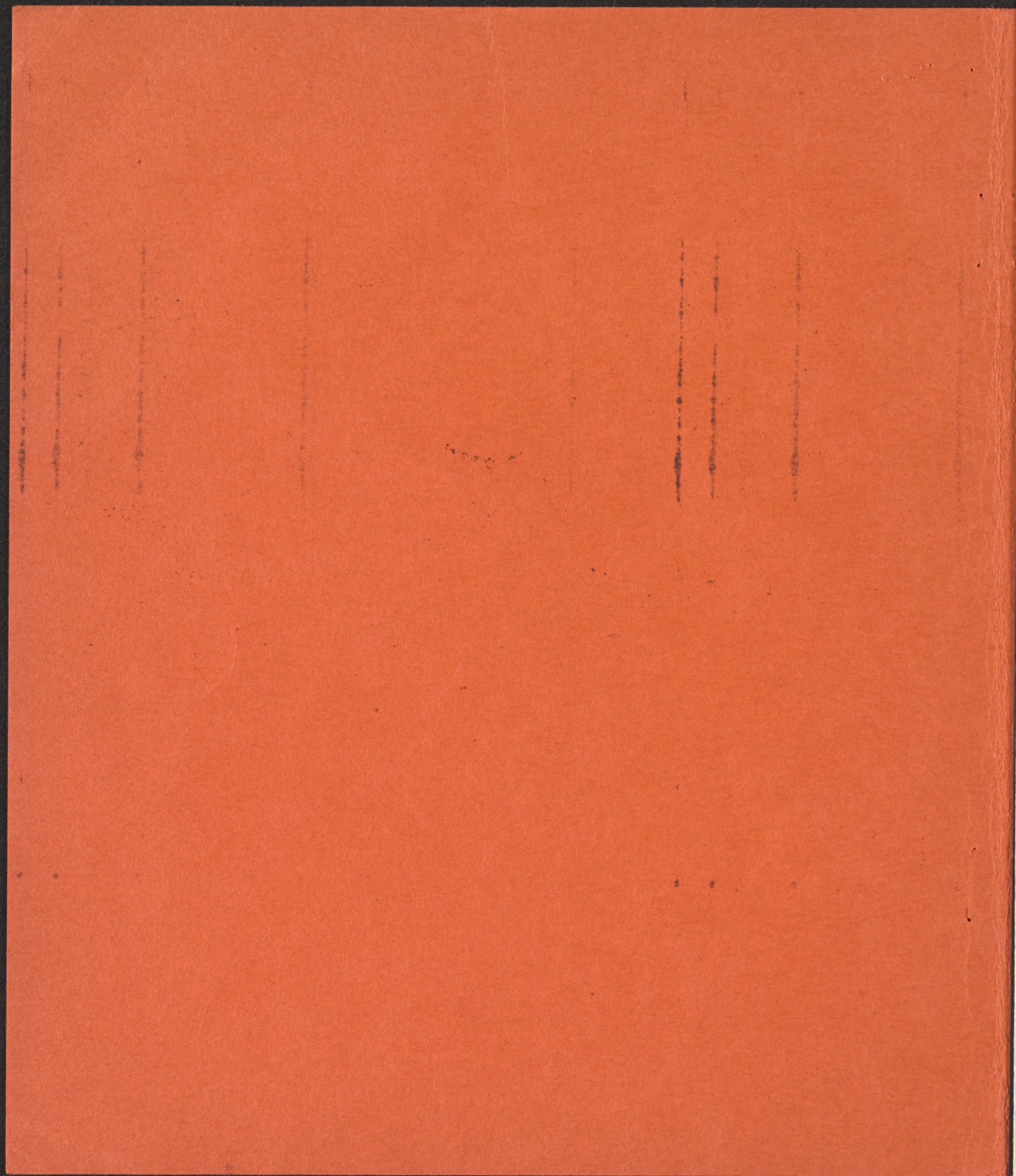

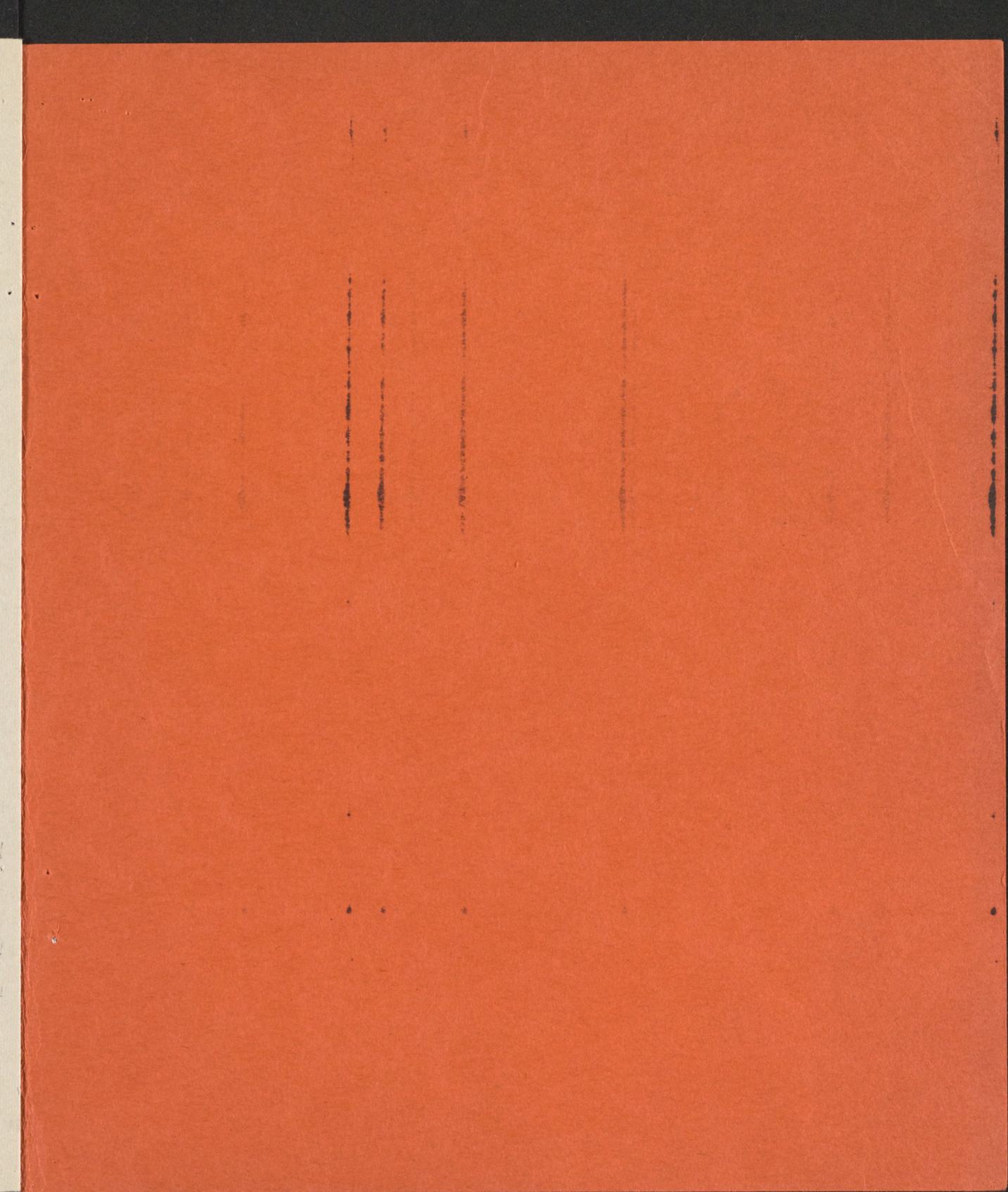

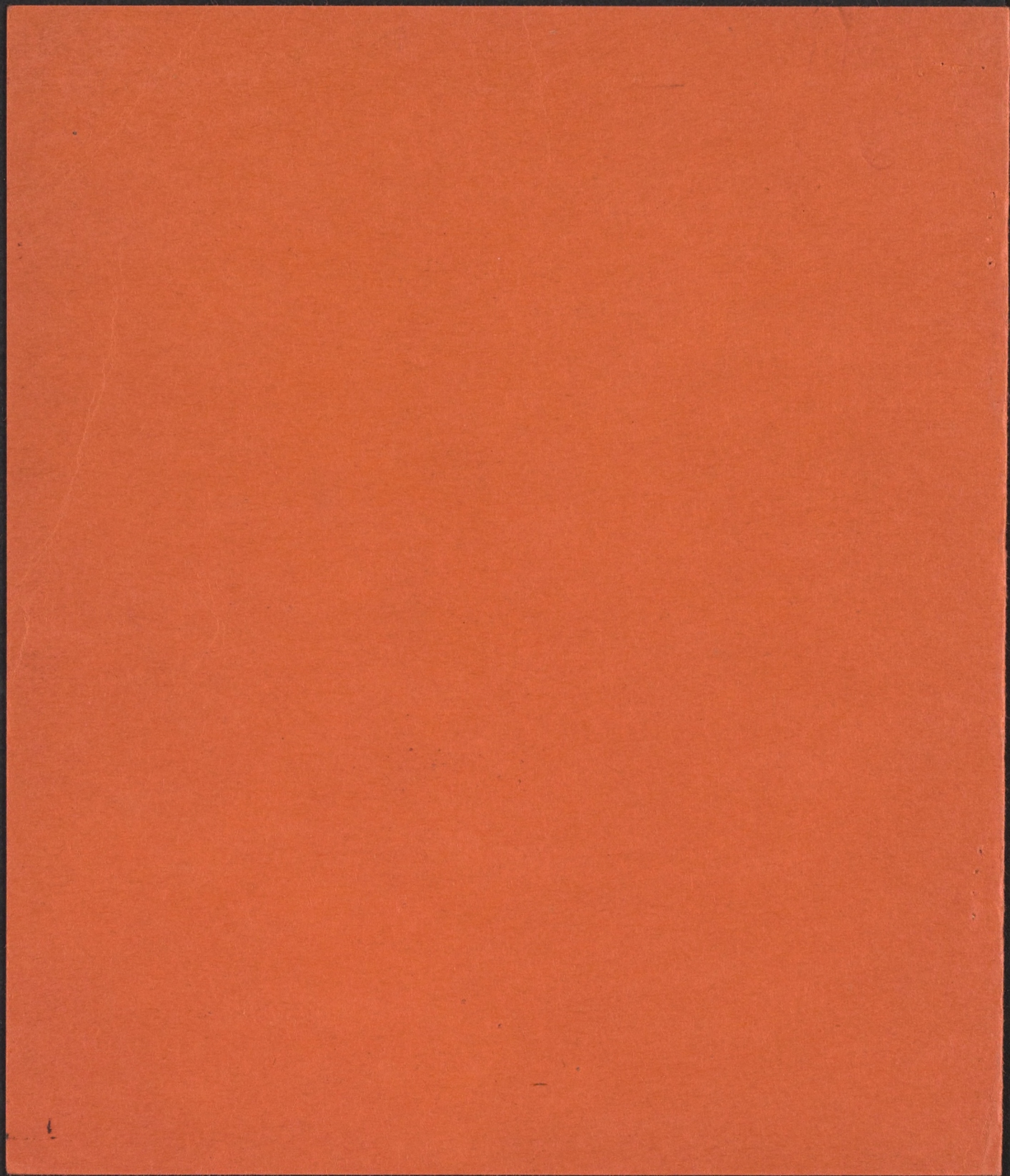

NARRATIVE REPORT
1945

July 27, 1945

Since most of the children at Butte Elementary speak Japanese at home, and only half day sessions were held in the second grade, summer classes gave the children more practice in expressing themselves in English, and an opportunity to bring school work more nearly up to regular standard.

The work was given so that each child would get a greater portion of what he needed most: freedom of expression was encouraged chiefly by acting out the most attractive stories in their reader. After the parts were assigned, children were sent out in groups to drill each other on what to say and how to act. In the class room one group worked on reading; another in numbers, used real objects and real life experiences as a foundation.

The The time per week was approximately: numbers, 15; reading 150; speech and expression 150.

Children were taken to the library and many "easy" books were read to create interest.

There was no written testing for progress, but individuals were watched carefully. In reading there was improvement in enunciation, in word analysis, and thought finding. No stress was put on speed for many of the swift readers were poor in understanding. Speed in answering mechanically the addition and subtraction problems was never mentioned, for many were only now forming their basic number concepts.

Children at this level were not active in clubs, and took little part in the games in the recreation room.

In general attendance was very good; pupils were interested in their work, very responsive, and progress satisfactory. Attendance was poorest for children who did poorest work in the regular sessions.

Parent contacts were few, and only to inquire how they could best cooperate for progress of the child.

The Summer Session was well worth while to keep up interest in school, and give children less time to forget the habits necessary for work in the fall.

CONSTITUTION OF THE BOYS LEAGUE

K429

ARTICLE 1. --- Name.

This club shall be called THE BOYS LEAGUE of BUTTE
ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, RIVERS, ARIZONA

ARTICLE 2. --- Purpose.

The purpose of this club shall be to promote friendly relationship between all the students, provide wholesome recreation and develop citizenship.

ARTICLE 3 --- Membership.

The membership shall consist of the boys in the fourth, fifth, and sixth grades of Butte Elementary School who belong to some regular school club.

ARTICLE 4 --- Officers.

Section 1. The officers of this club shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, Six Custodians, and Six Sargeant at Arms.

Section 2. The officers shall be elected by ballot and shall serve for the term of one semester.

ARTICLE 5 --- Advisory or Executive Board.

Section 1. Shall include Elementary School Principal and three staff members sppointed by the principal who shall meet with certain officers of the club to formulate plans and decide all purposes and procedures of the club. These four members, together with the President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Club shall constitute the Executive Board.

Section 2. Vacancies occurring among the members of the Advisory Board shall be filled by the members of the Elementary School Faculty upon the recommendation by the Executive Board and shall be appointed by the principal.

CONSTITUTION (cont'd)

ARTICLE 6 --- Meetings.

- Section 1. The club shall meet regularly on every Tuesday afternoon at 3 p.m. at places designated.
- Section 2. Every second Saturday at 10 a.m. shall be the Meeting of the Month for hearing reports from all the officers and standing committees.
- Section 3. Special meetings for special purposes may be called by the Executive Board at such times as are thought advisable. Such special meetings may only transact only such business as is specified in the call.

ARTICLE 7 --- Amendment.

Any proposed amendment to this Constitution may be submitted in writing at any regular meeting of the club. Such proposed amendment must be signed by majority active members of the organization before being submitted to the meeting, and shall be read at the meeting by the Secretary. After such notice, it may be voted on at the next election of officers and shall become a part of the Constitution only if approved by a three fourths of the active members voting at said next meeting.

BY - LAWS

1. Membership.

Section 1. Names of proposed new members shall be submitted at the regular meeting in writing, and shall be proposed by one member and endorsed by ten other members who know the candidate personally.

Section 2. A favorable majority vote of all those present and voting at such meeting shall be acceptance of the candidate for membership in the club.

2. Dues.

Dues shall be five cents a month payable the first week of each month.

3. Duties of Officers.

Section 1. President.

The President shall preside at all meetings at

which he is present; shall exercise general supervision over the affairs and activities of the club; and shall serve as member ex-officio on all standing committees.

Section 2. The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President during his absence.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the club which shall be an accurate and official record of all business transacted.

Section 4. Treasurer shall collect all dues, keep accurate record of all club funds, and pay all authorized accounts.

Section 5. Sargeant of Arms shall maintain order at all meetings of the club.

Section 6. Custodian shall be responsible for orderly club room, proper maintenance of all equipment.

4. Executive Board.

Section 1. The Executive Board of the club shall consist of the officers of the club and four Directors appointed by the principal as provided by Article 5, Section 1 of the Constitution. The duties of the Executive Board shall be to formulate plans, programs, arrange meetings, and shall be responsible for the proper functioning of the club.

5. Committees.

Section 1. All committees shall be appointed by the President.

6. Quorum.

Section 1. A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business

7. Order of Business.

Section 1. The order of business at all meetings of this club shall be as follows:

1. Meeting called to order.
2. Roll Call (if the president so desires)
3. Reading of minutes of previous meeting.
4. Reports of officers and committee chairmen.
5. Unfinished business.

- 6. New Business.
- 7. Program
- 8. Adjournment.

- 8. (Parliamentary Authority)
(Section 1. Robert's Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary authority for this club.)

- 9. Amendment.

Section 1. Any amendment to these by-laws may be proposed at any regular meeting, to be adopted by majority vote at the following meeting, if, in the meantime, the proposed amendment receives the approval of the Executive Board.
