NARRATIVE REPORT: (Use space below for comment on progress and developments of significance at center in connection with handling evacuee property matters; problems encountered; complaints received; suggestions and recommendations.)

As of September 30, 1943, an Evacuee Property Officer has not been appointed on this project. Since the beginning of the Evacuee Program, the duties of the Evacuee Property Officer have been handled by the Supply Officer and the Project Attorney. The Supply Officer had handled all application for transfer and had prepared all form WRA 153's requesting sale of household goods and/or farm equipment. The Project Attorney has handled all cases involving real estate transactions and any special case requiring legal advise.

Since the beginning of the program a total of 318 WRA 156 and a total of 92 WRA 155 have been forwarded to the Evacuee Property Office in San Francisco, California. However, as of September 30, no property has been received from California since May 13, 1943. At that time we received three car loads. Mr. R. A. Walling of the Los Angeles Transportation Division visited this project during the month and promised that shipments of property would be made immediately and as of the last day of the month, we received notice that one car load was in route from Los Angeles. This will aid the Evacuee Program on this Project as the Evacuees were becoming quite impatient since they have had applications in for months and apparently no action was being taken on this in the California office.

A number of sales have been made of farm equipment during the past few months, however, only one sale was made during the month of September.

Several Evacuees have had their farm equipment requisitioned and sold by the USDA War Boards. This office has written the Transportation Office in California on several cases requesting delay in the requisitioning of this machinery as the Evacuees were planning on relocation. Apparently, however, the USDA War Boards allow ten days notice to the Evacuees when the property is to be requisitioned. This notice is not long enough to allow the letters to reach the Evacuees and for them to consult this office.

We have had notice as of the last of the month that an Evacuee Property Officer has been appointed and will assume his duties on this project during the first part of October. All Evacuee Property files are in order and ready to be turned over to the official.

NARRATIVE REPORT: (Use space below for comment on progress and developments of significance at center in connection with handling evacuee property matters; problems encountered; complaints received; suggestions and recommendations.)

In submitting this general summarization of the Evacuee Property Office activities for the month of October, 1943, it should be borne in mind that this Evacuee Property Officer, having been newly appointed as such on September 25th at Los Angeles, California, reported for active duty at this Center on Monday, October 11, 1943.

During the first ten days of the month, several cases, then in the throes of consumation, were brought to conclusion while others were newly instituted and in the process of preparation. Of these, it may be said that, the writer was not inordinately possess of the intimate details concerning them. However, by reason of the splendid co-operation of Mr. Updegraff, who had handled these cases, we are able to make a reasonably comprehensive accounting at this time.

Thus far, considerable time has been spent by the writer in becoming adapted to this environment. In this connection, it should be noted that the Staff and Personnel from the Director down have been exceptionally solicitous as to my welfare and have extended me a very warm welcome, which, rest assured, is fully appreciated.

It has so happened that, while interviewing Evacuees, we met some old friends whom we have known and had dealings with many years ago. These few felt disposed to unburden themselves somewhat regarding their personal holdings. We sensed a feeling of both disappointment and discouragement which seemed to be quite prevalent, the gist of which boils down to it being caused by delays in shipping, lack of information relative to the status of their property and the requisitioning of their equipment without affording the owner sufficient time to have a voice in the disposition of same.

However, it is now felt that these conditions have been alleviated to an appreciable extent during the past sixty days by the arrival of several shipments, including two carloads, from the Coast. Also, warehouse receipts and notices of shipments en route are now periodically coming in and these are being immediately transmitted to the Evacuee. In addition we have endeavored to give each Evacuee interviewed a clear picture of conditions on the West Coast in regard to labor and transportation facility shortages. We try to make them understand the condition of their property as we are now finding what is left of it after having been stored with friends before evacuation. A conservative estimate of the number of Evacuees who call at this office for consultations would be from fifteen to twenty daily.

NARRATIVE REPORT: (Use space below for comment on progress and developments of significance at center in connection with handling evacuee property matters; problems encountered; complaints received; suggestions and recommendations.)

The month of November proved to be one in which great strides were made toward the withdrawal of Evacuee Properties from Buddhist Temples, Japanese Language Schools and other halls and basements of a semi-public nature. Generally speaking, the household goods and personal property contained therein were not only packed, labeled and stacked without care or system but also poorly protected from fires, leaky roofs and vandalism. We estimate that 75% of this type of property stored by the Evacuees of this Center has been removed and most of the balance is now being processed toward that end.

Carload shipments destined for shipment to this Center are now in the making in both the San Francisco and Los Angeles warehouse while one carload is being loaded jointly in the Sacramento and Stockton districts.

Shipments from this Center to points of relocation continue to be retarded due, principally, to the season of the year. However, indications point to a very large movement early next Spring as many Evacuee have signified their intentions to do so.

There appears to be a decided slow-up in the amount of requests for assistance in connection with agricultural equipment and we note that the queries and consultations relative to this type of property is on a downward trend which might be considered the result of U.S.D.A. requisitioning on the Coast.

Most of the real Estate sales, leases, etc., emanating from this Center seems to have been done thru private channels. We are consulted frequently in this connection but nothing comes of it insofar as WRA assistance is concerned.

Copies of Warehouse receipts, Evacuee Property reports and Progress reports are reaching this office almost daily and we, in turn, relay these to the Evacuees the same day they are received. This promotes a better understanding and feeling of confidence on the part of the Evacuees.

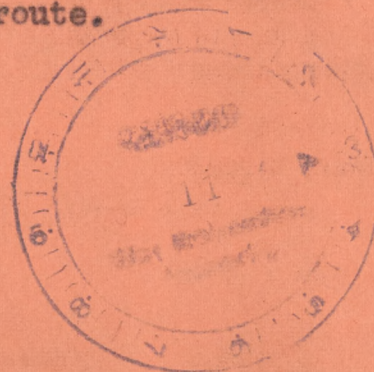
While Evacuee transactions handled by this section during the current month show a decrease in storage and transportation requests, there is a decided increase in individual amounts and tonnages of property involved.

It was noted that a greater number of the more influential Evacuees, especially those who own their homes and left them in a completely furnished state at time of evacuation, are now becoming active in the transferral of their entire properties to Government Warehouses. In this connection, they are also entertaining serious thoughts of leasing or selling their real estate.

We appear to be getting more inquiries from owners of fully equipped machine shops, garages and other similar lines of endeavor relative to relocation and establishing themselves in different parts of the country, especially in the Denver, Colorado area.

There is also more activity regarding automotive equipment. We have sold three cars on the Coast and several requests for bona-fide bids are now under consideration or in the making. The prices that are being obtained for them for these cars are proving very satisfactory and it is gratifying to know that the owners are so well pleased with the services rendered them by the WRA forces in California.

One complete carload, representing the property of seventy-three individual Evacuees, left the Los Angeles Warehouse for this Center on December 30, last. The Government Bill of Lading and the itemized Consist sheets have arrived. Notices are now being sent to each Evacuee telling them that their goods are enroute.

The volume of business transacted by this section diminished considerably during the month of January.

Inclement weather and crop dormancy probably furnished the bulk of the causes. It was noted, however, that adverse publicity affected indecision in the minds of the Evacuees with reference to just what should or should not be undertaken at this time in the matter of contemplated action on their properties.

The Conference of the Evacuee Property Officers held in San Francisco, which kept this Property Officer away from his desk for a period of approximately twenty days probably had an influence on the amount of consultations and requests which would ordinarily have been made. This situation is reflected by the increase of business since the return from this Conference.

Another variable factor was a ban on Civilian Travel placed by military authorities prior to Christmas which lasted until after the 10th of January.

Transactions during the month of February were curtailed, somewhat, by inclement weather, it having rained, spasmodically, for twenty-three of the twenty-nine days.

Operations increased over January thirty per cent and we anticipate the March report to show a similar increase over February. Business, thus far, this month would seem to indicate this.

There appears to be a hesitancy to relocate on the part of an appreciable number of Evacuees which is caused by the non-arrival of official confirmation and instructions concerning the removal of the 500 lbs. limit on shipment of Evacuee personal property from Relocation Center to point of relocation. This is in accordance with the recommendations sent Washington by a committee sitting in at the San Francisco conference for that purpose.

1. Hana Kato, Family No. 4620, case which has been pending since May, 1944, has been settled to the satisfaction to all concerned and Money Order in the amount of \$67.55 received in payment of transportation charges on commercial property.

2. No problems of a complicated nature have been encountered during the month. All request for assistance have been handled promptly and to the satisfaction of the interested evacuee.

3. The pick-up of evacuee personal property belonging to persons relocating, is being delayed from five to ten days due to the acute labor shortage in the warehouse. Some of the evacuees who are relocating, leave their property outside expecting it to be picked up promptly, and the first information this office has that property has not been picked up by the warehouse, is a letter from the evacuee telling us that he has heard from friends in the Center informing him that his property is still awaiting pick-up by the warehouse truck. This condition we believe will improve since additional labor is promised for the warehouse.

4. Saburo Muraoka, secretary to the Project Alien Committee, received a letter from the Spanish Council in New Orleans, who informed the committee that the War Relocation Authority was satisfactorily handling the property matters of the Japanese people. Mr. Muraoka was complimentary as to the manner in which the War Relocation Authority was handling the evacuee property here and stated that he had no complaint to make.

1. The Personnel problem has reached an extremely critical stage. At this time, we have one clerk typist.
2. The Bonding Co., has sent us a check in the amount of \$135.00 to pay the Mary Yoshimoto 2393 claim for one Chevrolet Truck. The check has been placed in the special deposit accounts and as soon as possible a check will be requested and sent to Miss Yoshimoto.
3. The movement of the Evacuee Property is close to a stand still due to a lack of plans for permanent relocation. Indications are, that the majority of the Evacuees are awaiting information from the West Coast as to whether or not they shall return there or relocate elsewhere.
4. As a matter of policy, some determination apparently is going to have to be made concerning the project storage of Evacuee Property. Many inquiries have been received asking whether or not Evacuee property could be stored in the Warehouse and shipped to them at their new home at an later date. This office has discouraged the storing of evacuee property in the Project Warehouse and have only accepted one or two shipments. It is believed that the reason for this request is that a large number of the relocatees expect to eventually return to the West Coast and would like for the one free move to be from the project to their west coast home.
5. The Evacuee Property Office is to be moved to Blk. 42 as soon as the building is ready. This will place the Welfare, Relocation and Evacuee Property Offices in the same block, and very convenient for those persons who after completing relocation plans to arrange for the Transportation of their personal belongings.
6. The assignment of one appointed Clerk Stenographer will be absolutely necessary due to the frequent changes in Evacuee personnel.

1. The Evacuee Property Section is running very smoothly and its assistance to the Evacuees has noticeably increased since moving adjacent to the Relocation Office.
2. Some concern has been voiced by the Alien Evacuees concerning rehabilitation loans. This particularly true where the citizen son is in the Armed Forces.
3. Several inquiries have been made about assistance in evicting persons from the homes of Evacuees who desire to return to the West Coast. These requests are given sympathetic hearing but in all instances it is suggested to the Evacuee that he handle these request through his Agent or Attorney.
4. A few request for assistances in connection with Terminal Island property have been received. These request are being handled in accordance with Administrative Notice 218.
5. A good many request for assistance in recovering contraband from the Police Department and other sources have been received. In cases where the Evacuees is permitted to return to his home, we are not giving serious consideration to this request. The only request being approved by the Project Director is where the property belongs to the excludées which is being requested to be placed in Government Storage.

1. The majority of problems are those pertaining to disposing of property in the West Coast Warehouses. Many persons relocating have only very small apartments and cannot at this time request the shipment of their property other than that which they have at the Center. As will be noted, during the month, four persons who relocated placed their property in Project Storage on WRA 223 until they can find a place to live at the point of relocation. The general statement of the relocating evacuees is that 60 days is not enough time to find suitable living quarters and many of them will not remove their property from Government Storage until maximum time limit of 150 days. A large number of those relocating are shipping part of their property to the point of relocation and the balance to some Californian address.
2. Packing and shipping of evacuee property is moving on a very good schedule. All property is packed up promptly and hauled directly from the barracks to the railhead and usually leaves the railhead one or two days ahead of the Evacuees.
3. Personnel problems are beginning to give us some concern due to relocation. However, as soon as a clerk-stenographer is appointed it is believed that we will be able with the temporary help available to handle all property matters without many delay to the relocating evacuees.

Evacuee Property

1. Evacuee property is being moved with a minimum of confusion, and in most instances, leaves the center two days ahead of the evacuee. All evacuee property is hauled directly from the barracks to the rail head and is well on its way before the evacuee actually leaves the center. No difficulty has been experienced so far in the handling or moving of evacuee property.
2. The Welfare Section has raised the question of assistance in connection with resettlement assistance grants to provide house furnishings. Our interpretation of Mr. Pitt's teletype of April 21 is that evacuees must secure from the custodian or friend who has charge of property in private storage, information as to the condition of the property and principal items included.

The Welfare Section feels that it would be better if the Relocation Officers could go out to the place of private storage, get a list of the property, and send it to them for use in summarizing their approval for resettlement assistance grant. A memorandum is given the Welfare Section when requested, informing that office whether or not relocating evacuees have property in Government Storage or in the Project Warehouse. So far the Evacuee Property Office has not attempted to assist in determining what, if anything, is in private storage.

As stated above, it is, we believe, the responsibility of the person requesting assistance to provide all information concerning property owned, value, and etc.

If our interpretation is wrong, we should like to be advised so that we may be of maximum assistance to the relocating evacuee and the Welfare Section.

Evacuee Property

1. The shipments of evacuee property are moving in the same proportion as relocation plans are approved by the relocation division. All property is handled promptly and reports from carriers indicate that shipments destined to Chicago and points in that vicinity are being delivered from 10 to 15 days after the date of shipment. This pleases the evacuees very much. We have had information from Los Angeles that at least two shipments arrived at that point 23 days after leaving the Center.
2. We are receiving continuous requests for property assistance on the West Coast, relative to getting possession of their property and removing property in the private storage to government storage, especially those who are temporarily relocating in the North and East.
3. A small number, probably 1% of those relocating in the North and East, are shipping the major portion of their property to their former West Coast home and only that which is necessary for light housekeeping to their point of relocation. This will indicate that a good many of those relocating in the North and East will eventually return to their California home.
4. There are no figures available but there are a good many families in the Center where the head of the family has gone to some point in the North or East who has not shipped his personal property and intimates that he is expecting to return to the Center within the next two to four months for the family and that he will probably go to California at that time.
5. According to figures furnished by the Relocation Division, one shipment of the evacuee property has been made for a little less than each 4 persons relocating. This indicates that substantially all property belonging to the evacuees is being shipped from the Center at the time of relocation. There are a good many lots of property belonging to persons who went out on short-term or trial leave, still stored in their former barracks, which was left in care of relatives or friends. This property is gradually being shipped out.

Evacuee Property

1. Evacuee Property continues to move in the same proportion as relocation plans are approved by the Relocation Division. An average of one car load of evacuee property leaves this Center daily, destined to almost all points of the compass. The evacuated area leading, followed by the Middle West, and then the East, with a small number going to the New England States.
2. We are not receiving any new requests for assistance in disposing of real estate or personal property. Nearly all of the persons who own property in the evacuated area expect to return to their former home as soon as they can get possession of the property. A large number of requests are being made for assistance in finding a place to live on the ranch or elsewhere until such time as the lessee agrees to turn the property back to the evacuee owners. There are also a good many requests for assistance in locating personal property which was left with friends or at the ranch at the time of evacuation, and for which, to date, they have requested no assistance from WRA. These requests are being handled directly with the custodian and fair results are being obtained.
3. The problem of door delivery of freight shipment at the point of destination is giving us considerable concern. Some railroads provide door delivery which makes it hard for the evacuees to understand why door delivery is not provided at all points of relocation, more especially in the larger cities.

The efforts of the Evacuee Property Section have been given wholly to the shipping of evacuee property from the Center to points of relocation and requesting property in private storage and government storage in the evacuated area, shipped to points of relocation.

One 7 car-train left this Center July 26 with approximately 438 persons aboard. This contingent shipped approximately seven carloads of personal effects to various points in California, Colorado, Utah, and Nevada.

The problem of door or sidewalk delivery of freight shipped from the Center to points of relocation continues to be one of the obstacles in the completion of relocation plans.

The major part of the time of this section has been devoted to shipping evacuee property from the center to points of relocation. A goodly number of evacuees have requested property now in Government storage and private storage shipped to points of relocation.

Another special train consisting of seven coaches and one pullman left the center on August 17th carrying approximately 386 persons to points in Colorado, Nevada, Utah, and California. All freight belonging to those evacuees who returned to California was shipped by the Universal Carloading and Distributing Co., Inc. This company guaranteed sidewalk delivery of all shipments billed to points in California, Oregon, and Washington at the same rate charged by the railroads. This service has had a very helpful effect on relocation and will be made available to future evacuees who return to the states served by the Universal Co. Sidewalk delivery continues to be a problem -- those going to points where such service is not available cannot understand why some cities have free delivery, while others do not.

The Evacuee Property Section is operating very well, despite the lack of stenographic personnel.
