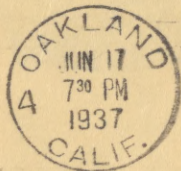

EXPLANATION OF SECTIONS

Courses of study in the various subjects are made to suit the differences in natural ability, previous training, and future aims. Pupils are placed in one of three sections according to these standards. Changes are made from one section to another as circumstances warrant.

Section "x" The course of study for this section calls for a very high standard of work both in quality and quantity. To it are assigned pupils who make exceptional progress.
