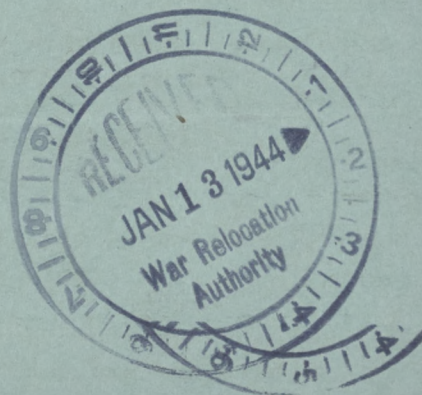

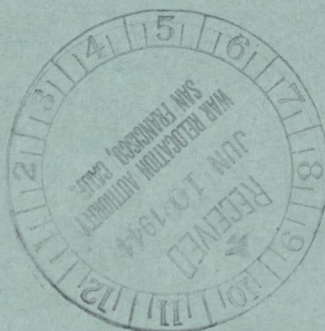

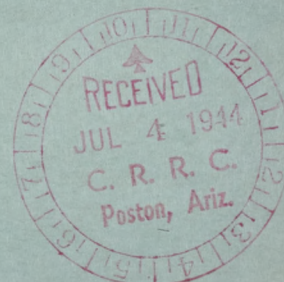

James LeBerthon, former Assistant Chief of Police at Tule Lake Segregation Center succeeded Charles A. Harper as Chief of Internal Security at Poston, as of September 4, 1944. Unit 1 Evacuee Police Department had been dissolved and an entire new force is now being recruited and organized. An attempt is being made to secure the best men available and candidates are being carefully selected for their integrity, judgment, reliability and aptitude.

Eleven candidates have been approved thus far, four of whom are now functioning. It is planned to give these men special police training. The present Internal Security force consists of:

For a Project this size which embraces three units it is felt that this number of men is entirely inadequate to successfully cope with current problems.

Survey of the situation reveals special need for a juvenile delinquency control program, a traffic safety program, a revision of the former record and reports system, an abatement of the wide misuse of Government equipment. This, of course, in addition to the usual routine police programs.

Unit I Police Department (evacuee) is now operating on a 14-hour schedule, with 12 active members.

The Internal Security Section is operating on a two-platoon schedule with a night patrol from 5:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. The office is open each Sunday. The present staff includes Chief, Assistant Chief, one Internal Security Officer and four guards. Details to be covered are day and night patrol, highway traffic, Parker Warehouse, Motor Pool, South Gate, unauthorized road to Parker, school patrol, Evacuee police supervision, investigations, court cases, issuance of all passes, special details, etc. These details are being covered whenever and wherever possible and personnel is being deployed to the best advantage. Unfilled positions are two CAP-9 and one guard.

Six additional Internal Security Officers (CAP-7) are requested.

The Internal Security Section has assumed full responsibility for the issuance of all gate passes and an entire new system is in operation.

Internal Security is co-operating with the equipment supervisor in an effort to eliminate as far as possible the abuse of Government equipment, which has been widespread.

A School Safety Patrol has been organized in Unit III and it is planned to organize similar patrols in Units I and II.

Internal Security officers should be on active duty 24 hours daily, but this cannot be done with the present staff. It has been found necessary to use guards to perform the duties of Internal Security officers.


The present Internal Security Staff consists of one Chief and four Guards. Two Assistant Chiefs are expected to arrive shortly:

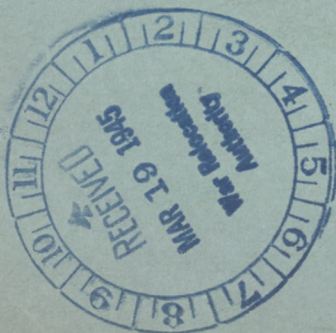



There has been a fair turnover in Guard personnel, which may be expected due to the fact that the CPC-5 rating obviously does not attract a high quality staff member.

Training classes are now under way and a good attendance has been evidenced. Classes are held weekly for appointed personnel (this is compulsory), and for evacuee policemen. Those who understand English attend the classes and convey their instructions in Japanese to those who do not have a fair understanding of English. We have representation from the evacuee police of all three units.

The tentative curriculum embraces Basic Duties and Attitudes, Criminal law and Procedure, Law of Arrest, Rules of Evidence, Search and Seizure, Statutes, Patrol and Observation, Report Writing and Records, Traffic Control and Traffic Law, Public Relations, *et cetera*. It is planned to present each student with a certificate upon his successful completion of the course. Instructions are being given by the Chief of Internal Security, his assistants and various department section heads.

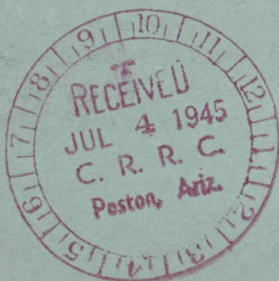



The outstanding case of the month was the arrest and conviction in District Federal Court of evacuee charged with burglary of Government building and theft of Government money. All property was recovered. (Project Case #250A)

Internal Security Section apprehended a number of recalcitrant evacuees in Camps 2 and 3 who refused to make relocation plans. Several were ejected and placed on trains. Camps 2 and 3 are now clear and the resettlement program is progressing satisfactorily.

On September 8 and 9 some 70 odd renunces were apprehended by the Internal Security Section and turned over to the Department of Justice for Internment. This operation took place without incident and was One Hundred Percent complete.

Seventeen evacuee police remain active on the center. Present appointed personnel is:

- 5 Internal Security Officers
- 9 Guards
- 1 Secretary

The Section is functioning smoothly and everything is under control.
