— HISTORY OF HUNT HIGH —

NOVEMBER 16, 1942 MARKED THE "DEBUT DATE" FOR THE HUNT HIGH SCHOOL.

TO RESUME THEIR ABRUPTLY HALTED EDUCATION SOME THOUSAND-ODD STUDENTS, DAZED WITH UNCERTAINTY TREK-KED INTO THE BARE BARRACKS, WHICH WERE INSTALLED WITH CRUDE MESS-HALL TABLES WITH ATTACHED BENCHES.

IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE OPENING OF SCHOOL A TEMPORARY STUDENT COUNCIL WAS ORGANIZED FOR THE FUNDAMENTAL PURPOSE OF DRAWING UP A CONSTITUTION. THIS GOVERNING BODY ALSO STIMULATED ACTIVITIES, THE MAJOR EVENT BEING THE "CHRISTMAS CARNIVAL".

IN JANUARY THE HUNT HI-LITES, THE BI-WEEKLY PUBLICATION OF THE JOURNALISM CLASS SPONSORED A CONTEST TO NAME OUR SCHOOL, AND TO CHOOSE COLORS AND AN EMBLEM. THESE INITIAL STEPS BROUGHT ABOUT THE "HUNT HIGH SCHOOL", AND NAVY BLUE AND GOLD, AND THE EMBLEM OF THE "WOLVERINE".

DAYS OF MUD, SLUSH AND BITTER WINDS PASSED IN SUCCESSIVE ORDER OF OUR FIRST EXPERIENCES OF IDAHO WINTER. THEN IN THE MIDST OF "SPRING FEVER", THE TEMPORARY COUNCIL GAVE WAY TO THE PERMANENT STUDENT BODY GOVERNMENT. THE RESULT OF THE ELECTION FOUND ALBERT OYAMA, A.S.B. PREXY.

THROUGH THE COOPERATION OF THE TALENTED STUDENTS OF HUNT HIGH SCHOOL A WELL-ROUNDED-OUT EXCHANGE ASSEMBLY WAS POSSIBLE. THIS ASSEMBLY WAS OUR FIRST CONTACT WITH THE OUTSIDE SCHOOLS.

IN MAY, THE TRADITIONAL MAY DAY FESTIVAL WAS RULED OVER BY THE ROYAL COURT. AN ALL DAY HOLIDAY AND AN OUTDOOR ASSEMBLY WAS PROCLAIMED BY KING JOHN OKAMOTO AND QUEEN BETTY AOKI.

CLAD IN CAPS AND GOWNS THE SENIORS WHO HAD CHOSEN THEIR MOTTO TO BE "WE CAN, WE MUST, WE WILL" CLIMAXED THEIR HIGH SCHOOL CAREER IN THE SAGEBRUSH STADIUM TO RECEIVE THEIR DIPLOMAS.

ALL IN ALL, THE FIRST YEAR IN HUNT HIGH SCHOOL IS ONE THAT WILL REMAIN A MEMORABLE ONE.

ABSENCE OF THREE OR MORE DAYS IN SUCCESSION REQUIRES A NOTE FROM THE HOSPITAL FOR RE-ENTERING A CLASS.

TARDINESS:

ALL TARDINESSES ARE UNEXCUSED EXCEPT IN CASE OF ILLNESS OR OTHER URGENT CAUSES. ALL TARDINESSES ARE RECORDED.

ALL ARTICLES FOUND ARE TO BE TURNED INTO THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE.

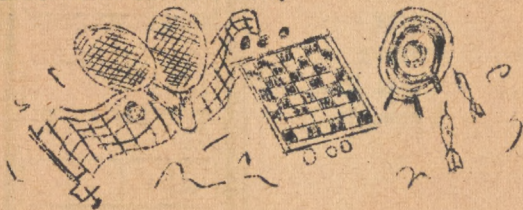

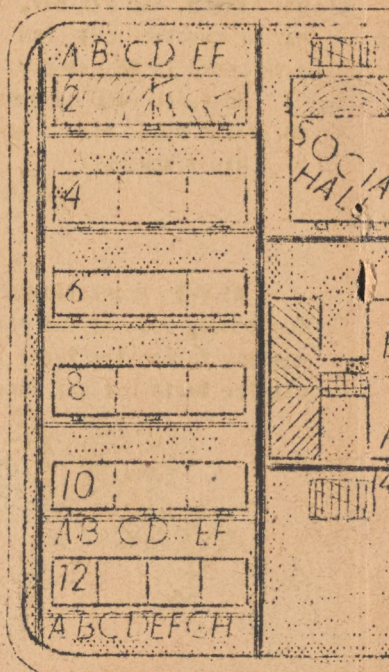

PHYSICAL ED.

ALTHOUGH HUNT HIGH DOES NOT HAVE THE FACILITIES OF A GYMNASIUM OR A REGULAR PLAYFIELD ITS PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM HAS ONLY MOMENTARILY BEEN HINDERED AND IS NOW FUNCTIONING SATISFACTORILY. UNDER THE EXCELLENT LEADERSHIP OF COACH MORRIS ROTH THE BOYS ARE ENGAGED IN THE GAME OF FOOTBALL. THE GIRLS THROUGH THE ABLE TUTORSHIP OF MISS EDNA KURTIN, GIRLS' PHYSICAL EDUCATION INSTRUCTOR HAVE BEEN MASTERING SOCCER. ENROLLMENT THIS YEAR IS APPROXIMATELY 500 BOYS AND 475 GIRLS AS PHYSICAL EDUCATION IS REQUIRED.

THE INTRAMURAL PROGRAMS FOR BOYS AND GIRLS HAVE BEEN PROGRESSING QUITE READILY AND THERE'S PLENTY OF COMPETITION. THE HUNT HIGH "ALL-AMERICAN" CONTEST WAS A SUCCESS AND CONTESTANTS EXHIBITED THEIR SKILL IN PUNTING, PASSING, DROP AND PLACE KICKING.


LAST YEAR HUNT HIGH HAD A BASKETBALL TEAM COMPOSED OF FORMER HIGH SCHOOL PLAYERS. PLAYING MOST OF THE LOCAL CAMP TEAMS THE WOLVERINES WERE UNDEFEATED. COMPETING WITH THE OTHER RELOCATION CENTER FOUL SHOOTING TEAMS, HUNT FINISHED IN THIRD PLACE. BECAUSE OF THE LACK OF EQUIPMENT, A VARSITY FOOTBALL TEAM CANNOT BE ORGANIZED. THIS YEAR THE WOLVERINE CLUB HAS SPONSORED A TOUCH-FOOTBALL TOURNA-

MENT. THE BASEBALL TEAM ORGANIZED RATHER LATE DEFEATED TWIN FALLS HIGH SCHOOL IN THEIR ONLY TWO GAMES.

THE BOYS WILL HAVE A PHYSICAL EXAMINATION AND DEFECTS FOUND WILL BE CORRECTED. THE GIRLS SIMILARLY WILL HAVE A CHECK UP OF THEIR TEETH, EYES, AND GENERAL HEALTH. SPORTSMANSHIP, CHARACTER BUILDING, AND HEALTH ARE THE ESSENTIALS BEING TAUGHT IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION CLASSES. THIS IS A PROGRAM TO KEEP IN STEP WITH THE NATION WIDE, "VIM FOR VICTORY" PROGRAM.
