It is interesting to note that the month of August has shown an .83% increase in the number of cases received by the Office of Evacuee Property Officer over the month of July. This is due mostly to increase in requests for sale of personal property, obtaining of equipment, and collections of accounts, which cannot be shown in this report other than under total cases received for the month.

Many residents/ evacuees are becoming anxious to know definitely when they may expect their requests for transportation of personal property to be complied with, through car shipment from San Francisco area.

No increase of business in the Evacuee Property Office can be attributed so far to the segregation program. However, it is anticipated that with the arrival of a man from the Transportation Department of San Francisco Office this week, work in preparation of shipment of property belonging to those evacuee going to Tule Lake will really get under way and our duties and responsibilities will be greatly increased.

Each week brings forth the completion of a transaction such as the payment of an account never anticipated, sale of personal property, equipment, etc., or the recovery of a lost article. In this connection it appears that personal mention should be made of the excellent work being done by the WRA boys in the Field Offices, through their untiring efforts, we are able to accomplish results and render a real service to the evacuees.

It is reported from San Francisco Office that one car each of evacuee property has been forwarded from Los Angeles and San Francisco warehouses during the past week. These cars will contain property belonging to residents of this center, which have been on request for some time past.

Requests for approval of shipments of property belonging to evacuee going out on relocation have been noticeably few over the past few weeks. We hardly know what to attribute this situation to, other than the coming of winter and the cold spell which occurred around 1st to 10th of October.

While there has been a few errors made in the shipment of property belonging to segregates that came from or have been transferred to Tule Lake the number is negligible indeed compared to the number of individual shipments handled.

The flow of requests for storage and shipments of articles to the center continue in about the same speed and quantity as has been customary in the past.

However, Mr. Sloan through his solicitous and effective methods of operation has succeeded in obtaining what appears to the writer to be a satisfactory payment long over due, which should go a long way toward bringing about an early settlement of the entire matter.

General disappointment is noted amongst several residents of the center over the recent ruling of the Office of Defense Transportation relative to not permitting the movement of trucks over a distance of 200 miles where there has been a change in registered ownership. There are a number of evacuees at the center who are desirous of relocating who do not have sufficient equipment, trucks particularly and it seems somewhat unfair that when they have the opportunity that they cannot purchase these trucks from one of their race and place the equipment in operation. This restricts or hampers in some sense their desire to relocate.

A considerable number of transactions and interviews were handled by this office during the month of November. Occasionally long delays are encountered in the handling of a request from the field offices to obtain the evacuee's consent to an agreement, signature to a document, etc., which is the result of the evacuee being away from the Project on a visit, temporary leave or he may have relocated. Therefore considerable time may elapse before we can contact him and obtain the necessary action. It is hoped the Field Supervisors understand this situation.

Requests for release of contraband are being filed almost daily consisting of applications for cameras and radios. Several large shipments have been received on the Project which is the incentive behind this steady flow of applications.

We have just been advised that a carload of evacuee property has been shipped from Los Angeles on December 29. It is hoped that this car will contain contraband as no shipments of this nature as yet has been received from the Los Angeles area. It is therefore becoming quite difficult to provide an explanation for this situation.

We look forward to an interesting meeting in San Francisco on the 18, 19 and 20. We are of the opinion that personal contact with the Supervisors, Property Officers and other officials, whom we shall meet, will prove beneficial to all, while providing everyone with an opportunity to express his views and opinions.

The Summary of Cases received, Pending completed and on hand at end of month for the last four months, has not seemed to vary too much; cases on hand being somewhere near that of the proceeding month regardless of cases received.

The activity in connection with the Relocation Program which is now taking place at the Center is presumably going to tax warehousing space on the Project considerably, as ninety percent of those leaving on indefinite relocation are having their personal property stored in Project Warehouse until such time as they have been assured through trial that their job at the place of destination is to be at least somewhat permanent.

It is, therefore, somewhat difficult to strictly adhere to procedure wherein it is stated "postponement of the 500# privilege may be for a reasonable period of time after the Relocatee's departure."

Some pressure is being brought to increase the 500# allowance at Government expense provided for, when the evacuee leases the Center to relocate. Very often the one free move permitted under .2 Chapter 100.3 may have been initiated and part of a shipment received or in process of shipment; we therefore, have no choice other than to insist in payment of charges over and above the 500# allowance from the center, which is sometimes in fact quite often insufficient to enable some to relocate.

For some unknown reason which we cannot determine at the moment, in reporting cases pending at the end of the month, the requests for contraband, storage and shipment of personal property were not previously included in the monthly report.

We have just completed an inventory of all cases on hand that are pending consideration and find this amount to be six hundred five (605). This presents the true picture of the files awaiting processing by this office, however, there are a number of cases that are temporarily closed, some of which will require re-opening and will be shown as such on the monthly report.

Only five (5) requests for assistance can be claimed as accomplished by this office for the month which were performed without the assistance of the field office. Four (4) cases were referred to field offices for assistance. Forty eight (48) cases were processed where property was shipped from the Project to a point of Relocation, while an additional large number of evacuees have relocated leaving there property in storage at the Project while awaiting shipping instructions.

Three (3) requests are now awaiting consideration and approval for permission on behalf of an equal number of residents to enter the military area to assist in the identification of personal property stored in a church or warehouse under their supervision, wherein, shipment to the Evacuee or storage of the property in Government warehouses is anticipated. The procedure required calling for Power Attorney on behalf of all property owners incidental to a request of this kind, may prove to be somewhat difficult and of long duration in its completion, as some of the owners may be relocatees and considerable time will be consumed in reaching them as well as difficulty encountered in obtaining their signatures to such a document. It would seem that a custodian who has accepted the property of another for storage has implied authority to identify and assort for release, that property upon a written request for release signed by the owner evacuee, without the need for Power of Attorney, providing the custodian had signed the Evacuee Property report.

We are anxiously awaiting word of shipment of carload of Evacuee Property from San Francisco.

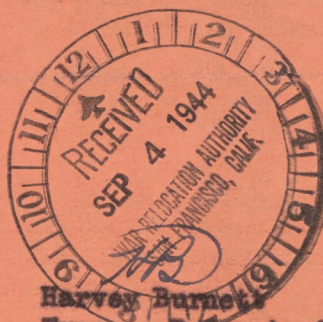

The construction of toilet facilities in the gate houses, which was recently discontinued, was resumed and should be completed in the near future.

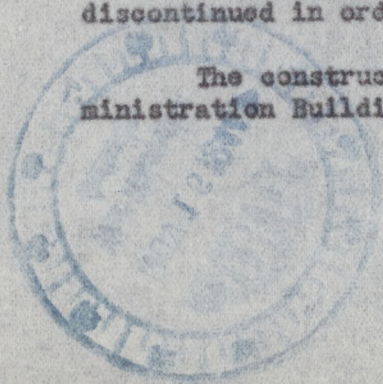
The Community Building "Project D" are completed as following:

In tabulation made from Evacuee Property reports by the Washington Office, my attention was called to the fact that the cases pending at the end of last month were high in comparison to those active cases reported by other Evacuee Property Officers. I have been somewhat concerned with this fact for sometime past and have made considerable effort to reduce same, but any progress made along these lines has been offset by the number of new cases received each month. You will notice, however, that a noticeable reduction has been attained this month toward this goal by closing 156 cases for the month of November.

We are now in the process of reviewing each and every file in the office with the hopes of closing those which can or can not be completed. This is an every three month operation at this office.

The four debt adjustments referred to above were storage refunds obtained on overpayment of storage charges.

On Nov. 14, 1944 we received a teletype from B. S. Myer establishing a system of priorities for the handling and shipment of Evacuee property from the West coast. In referring to this teletype to an area office on Nov. 20th, evidently no word had been received of same as they were not familiar with its contents.

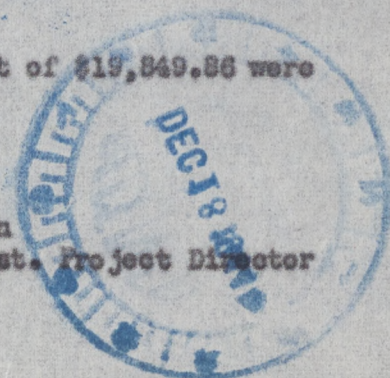

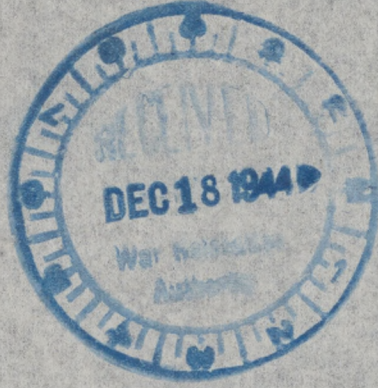

Recently an Evacuee was inducted into the Army, he has a young wife and child whose only relatives were in Manzanar, he asked for transfer for his family to Manzanar but was refused unless he paid all costs. Shipment of their personal effects alone cost him approximately \$50.00. This appears to be a case where transportation costs of personal property should have been at the expense of WRA because of the circumstances.

Relocates leaving the Center this month are approximately 55% in excess of January figures. It is to be hoped and indications point to the likelihood of March producing an exodus of Relocates double the number of any month so far this year.

There is at the moment approximately 1,000 large wooden boxes on hand awaiting issuance to those relocating, about this number of wooden crates and perhaps 1,500 carton boxes and a large reserve of lettuce crates, together with excelsior, wrapping paper, shredded paper, rope and twine all in preparation of handling a large movement of property when necessary.

A problem will later develop without question on property of those being inducted into the Army especially those evacuees from Hawaii.

Monthly Reports

On account of the center closure, construction of all projects have been cancelled except the construction of Warehouse Area Fence, also the construction of packing boxes and crates for use in shipping evacuee property. Approximately 900 packing boxes and 475 crates have been completed to date.

A large force of carpenters are employed performing numerous repair and maintenance jobs throughout the center. The present maintenance program consist of reputtying window lights, repairing exterior wall paper, mess hall tables, shower room duck boards, interior celotex walls in laundries and lavatories, repairing of doors on miscellaneous buildings, and other miscellaneous maintenance work.

The most serious problem at present is the cracking of hot water supply boilers in the lavatories, probably due to excessive deposit of lime and minerals in the boilers. These boilers are cracking at the rate of two or three per week. Repairing by welding costs from \$15 to \$25 when performed by outside contract. This work is now being performed by the Motor Pool Welding Shop and considerable savings to the government will result.
