Rather like the mariners in "Ulysses" we must

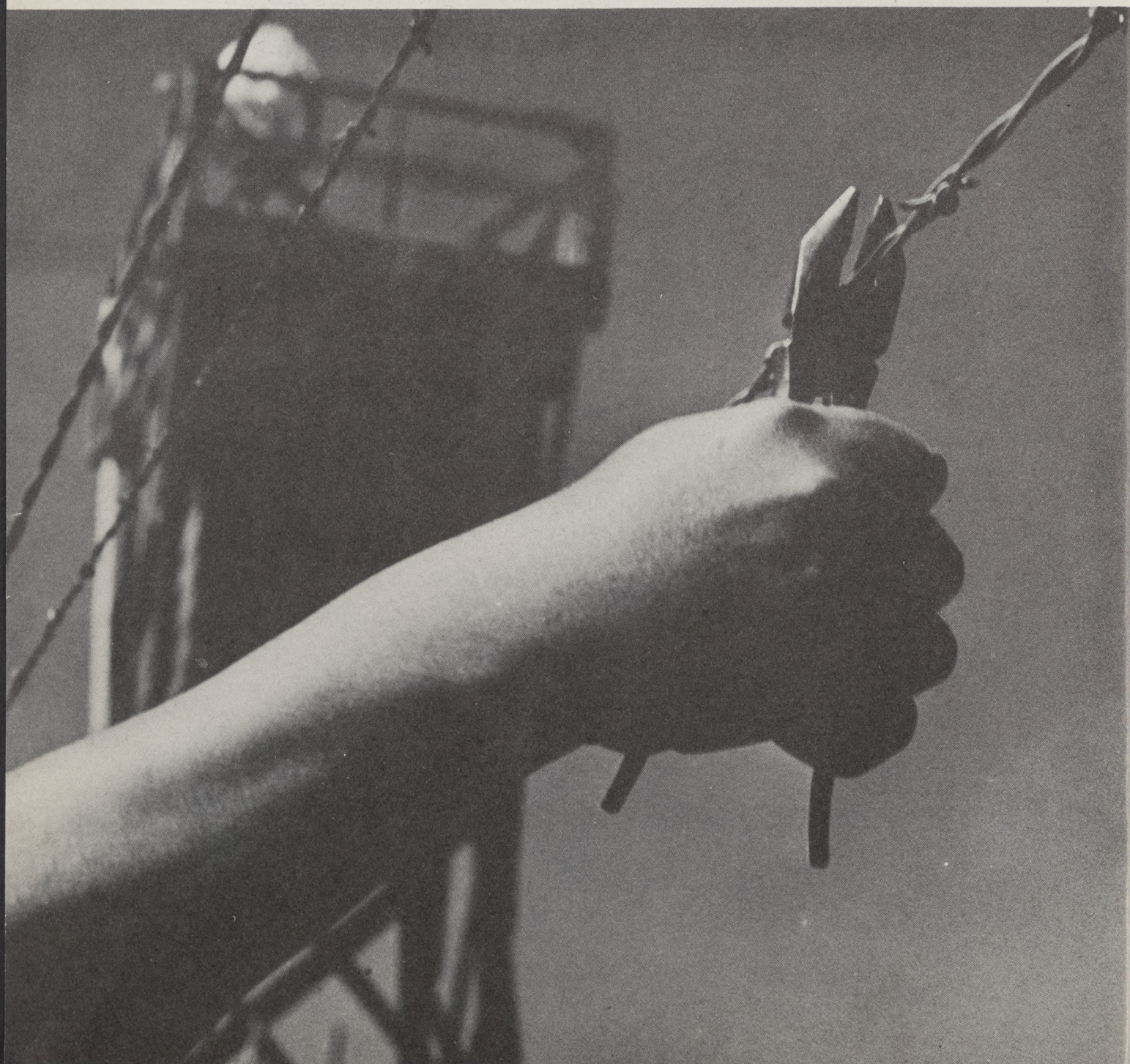
"Be strong in will to strive, to seek, to find and not to yield."

So . . . to the Future with its joys and its sorrows . . . not to goals that are found only in the mind of youths but to the achievement of these goals this book is dedicated.



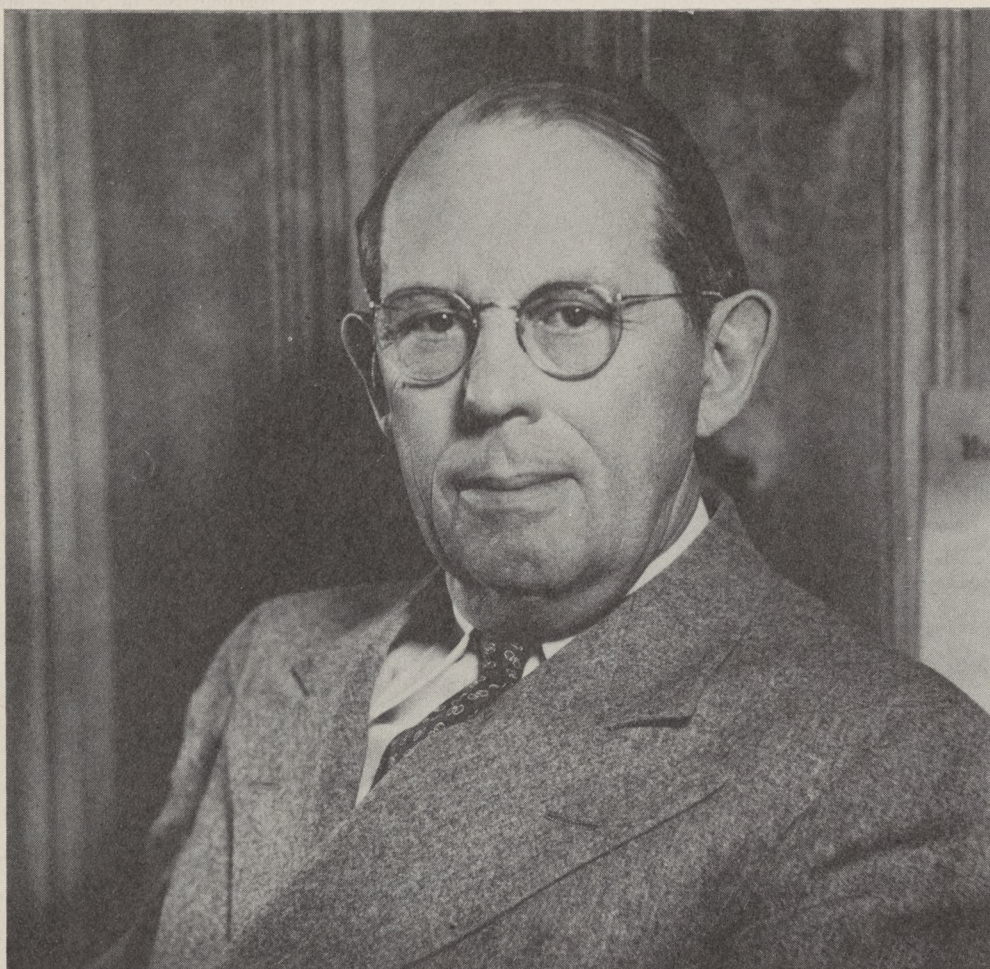

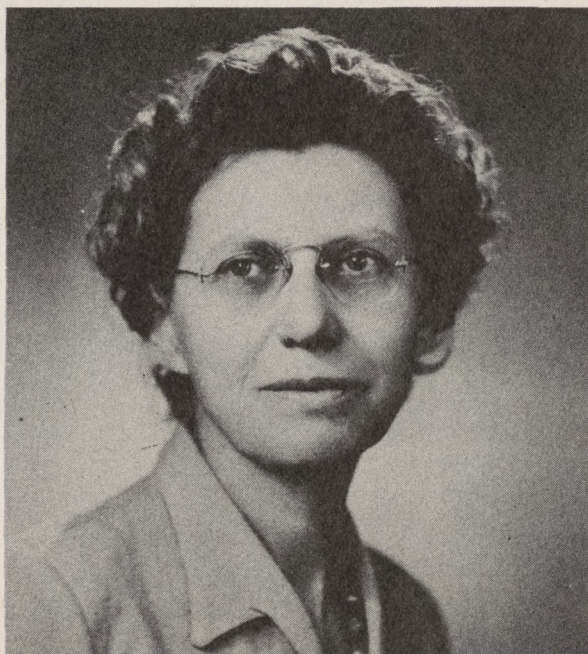
I am glad you are dedicating your Annual to the Future, for it means you are turning your eyes away from the past and looking toward the new and better future of your dreams.

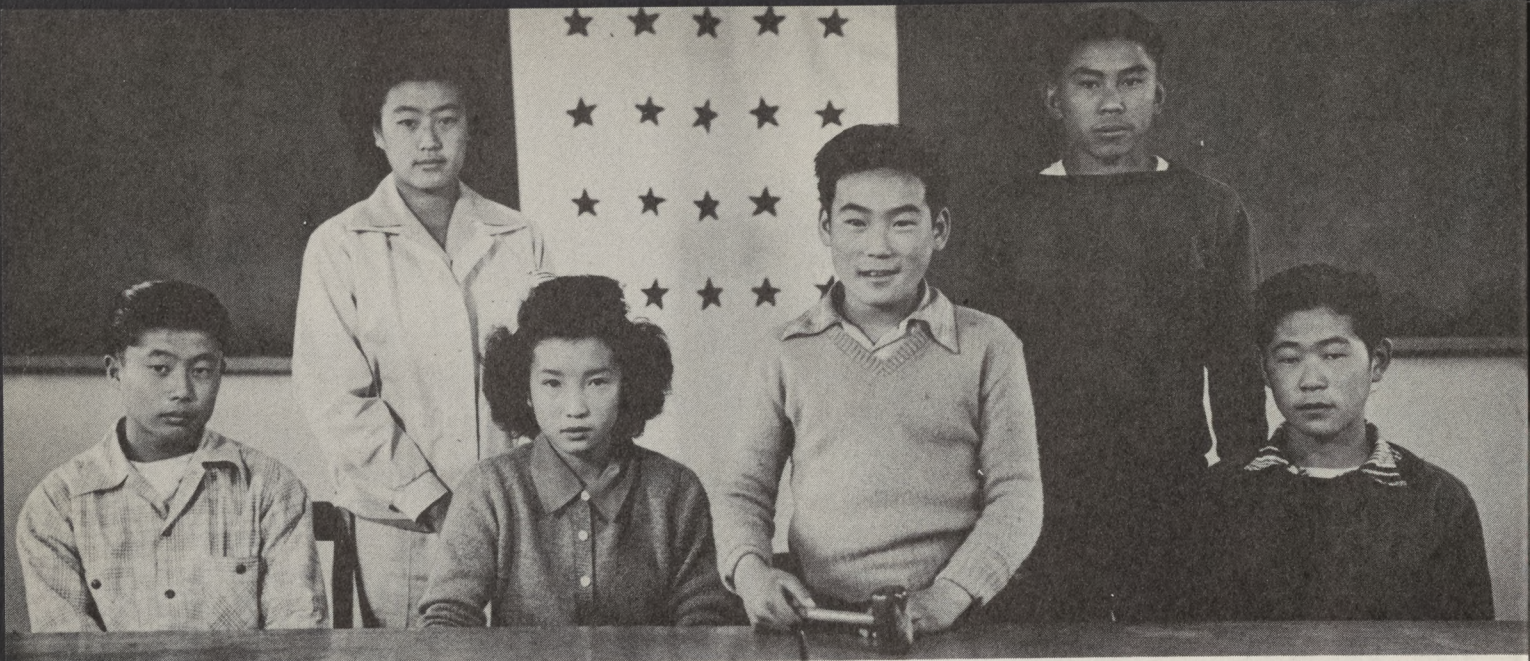
The first semester was brought to an end with a special assembly, at which time the Student Council presented to the Student Body a service flag honoring those boys from our school who have entered the armed forces.

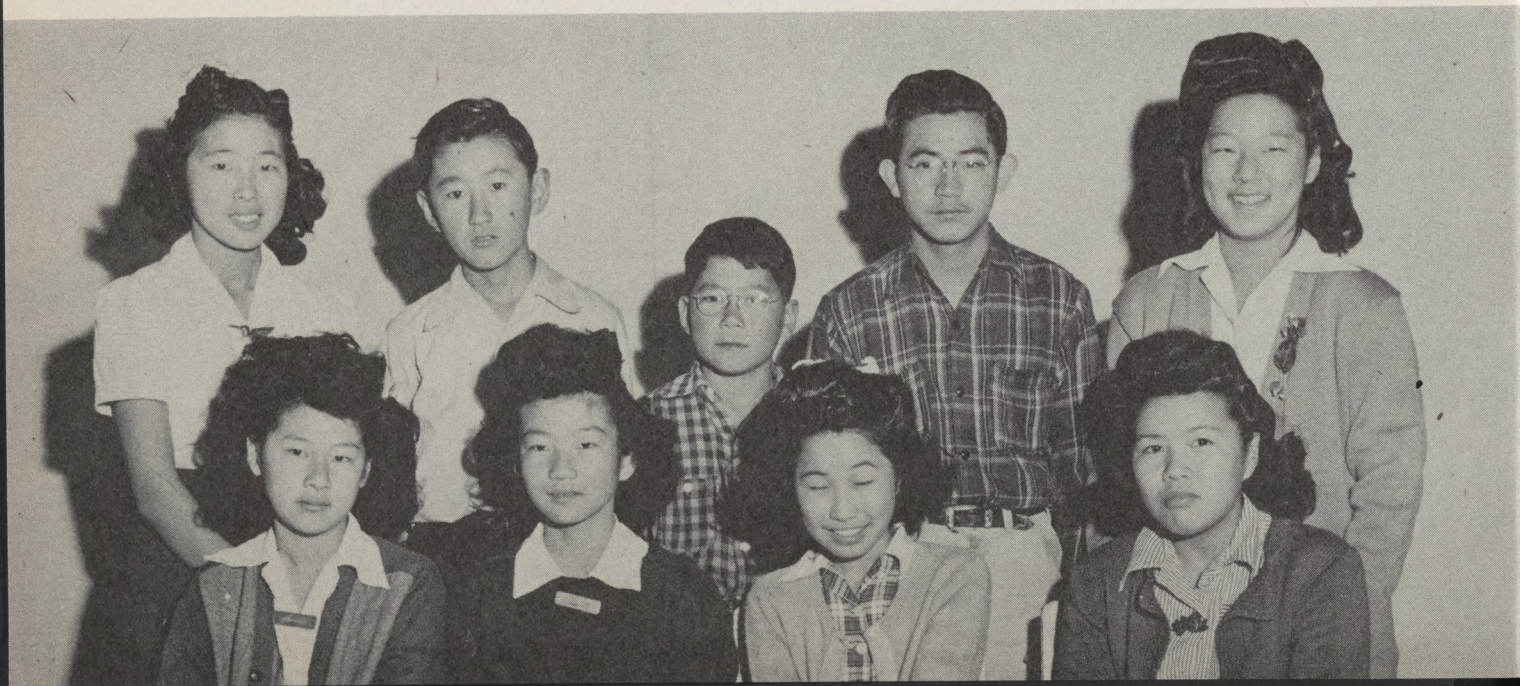

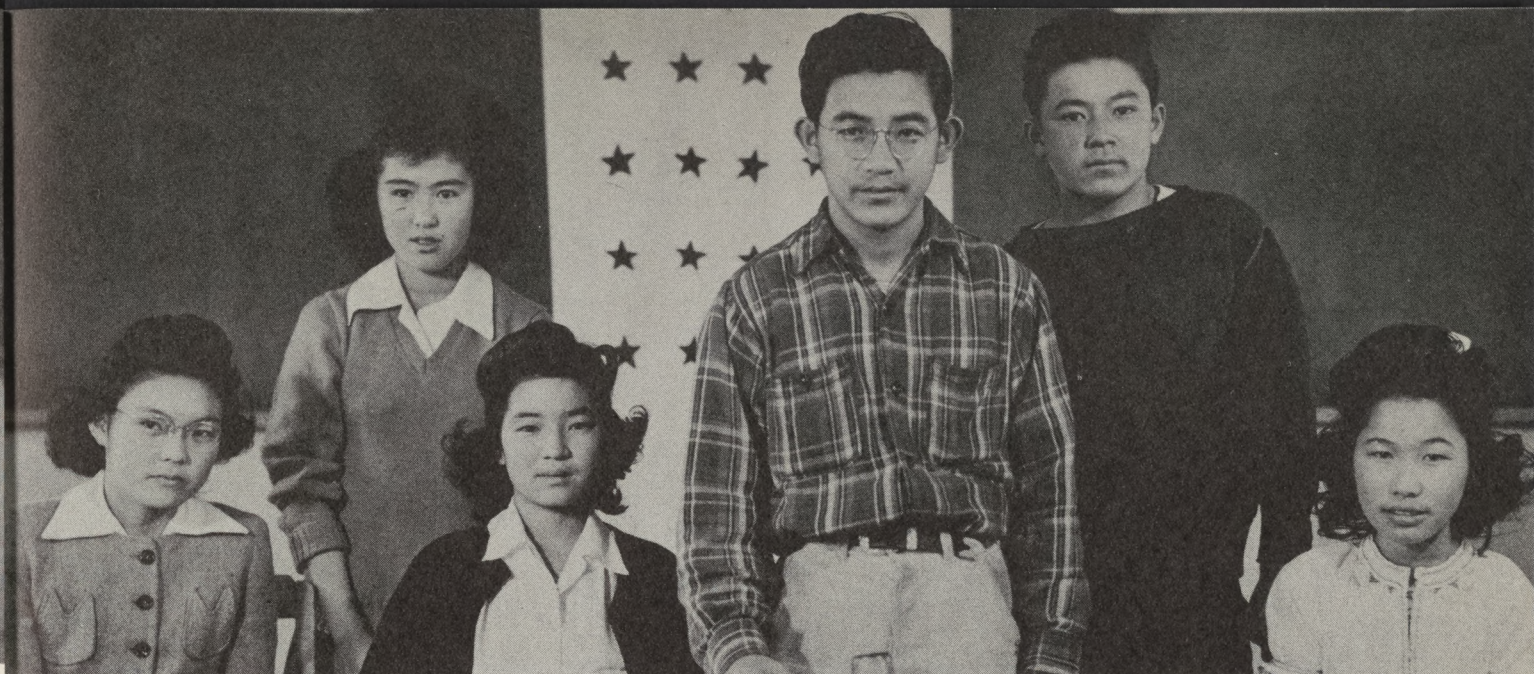
Associated Junior

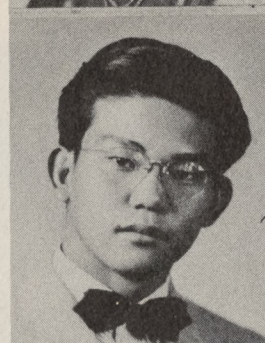
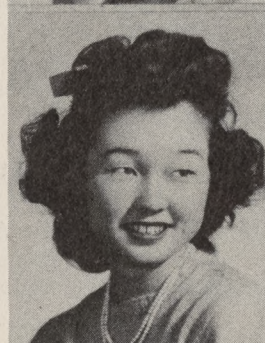
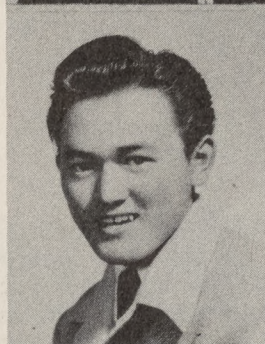
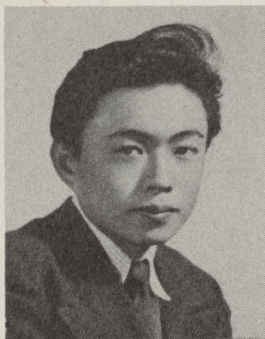
Girls' League

Ninth Grade Calendar

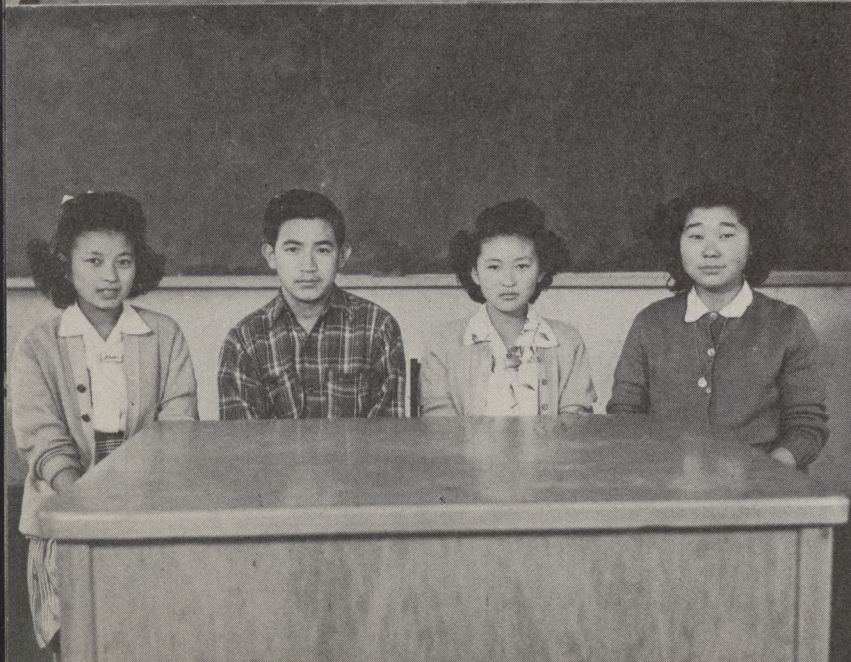

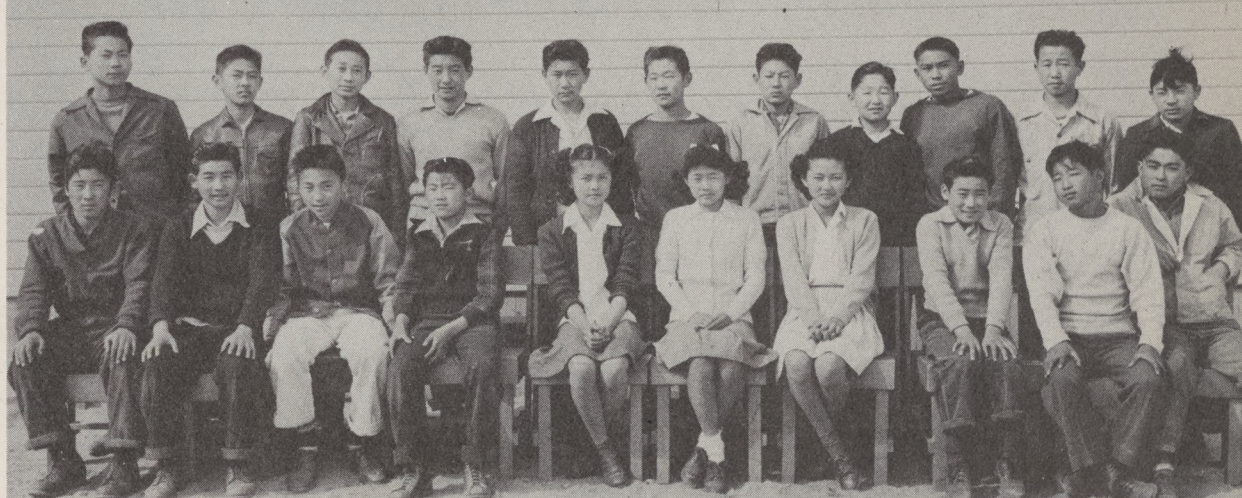
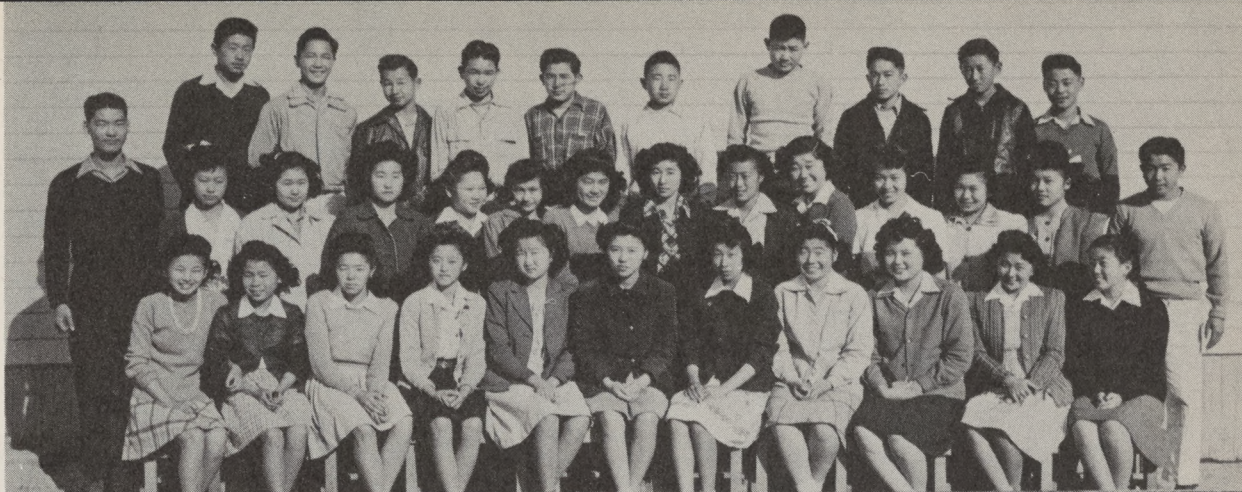

Eighth Grade Calendar

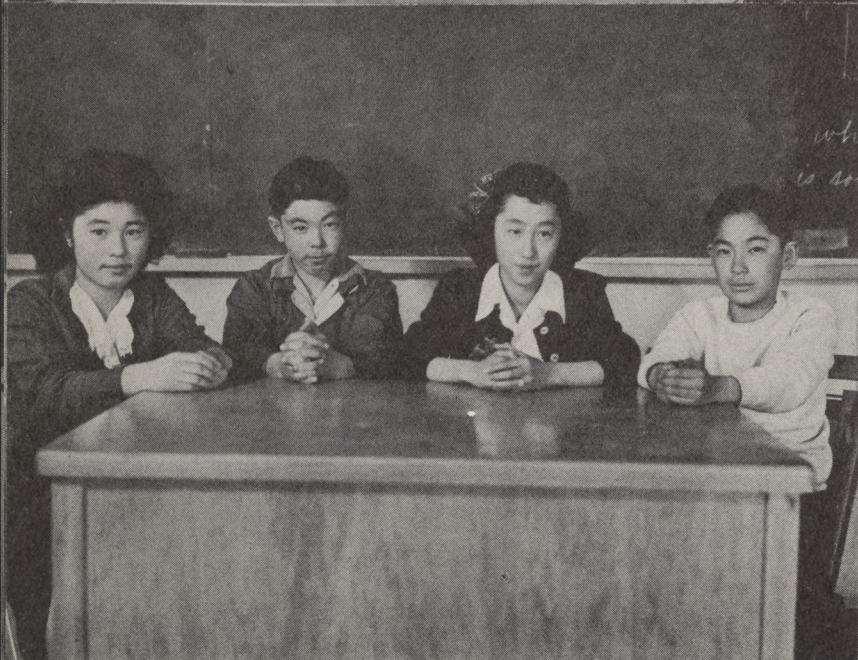

Out of the Frying Pan, a three act comedy by Francis Swann, attained notable success in New York where it was staged originally, and no less can be said of the Frizzell version of it. Work began in mid-February, with rehearsals being held every day during one school period and twice a week at night.

For financial reasons, they live in the same apartment, which happens to be one directly above that of an important Broadway producer. After many difficulties, involving twenty policemen, a man in a rowboat, Stanislavsky (a dramatist), a boy portraying an escaped maniac, and many other awkward and comical situations, the group are hired to go on the road in a mystery drama, *Mostly Murder*.

The fall semester of 1944 found Manzanar High School faced with an acute teacher shortage, and hopes of continuing the regular journalism classes had to be abandoned. This fact, however, did not discourage the future journalistic aspirants. Shortly after the beginning of the first semester, a Journalism club was organized with Mr. James Smith as advisor. By club vote the name *Campus Pepper* was changed to *The Spot*.

Working tirelessly under handicaps, *The Spot* Staff sent out a cheerful reporter to every main event.

A bi-weekly paper was planned and a special edition was published for graduation.

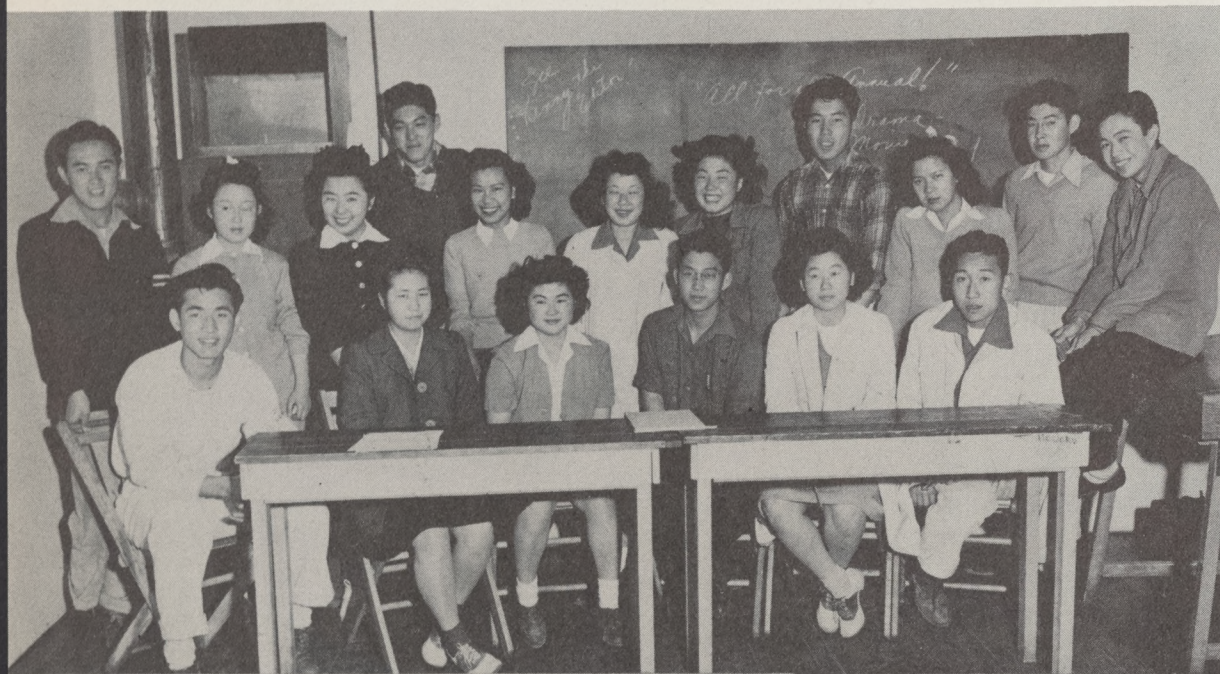


Annual Staff

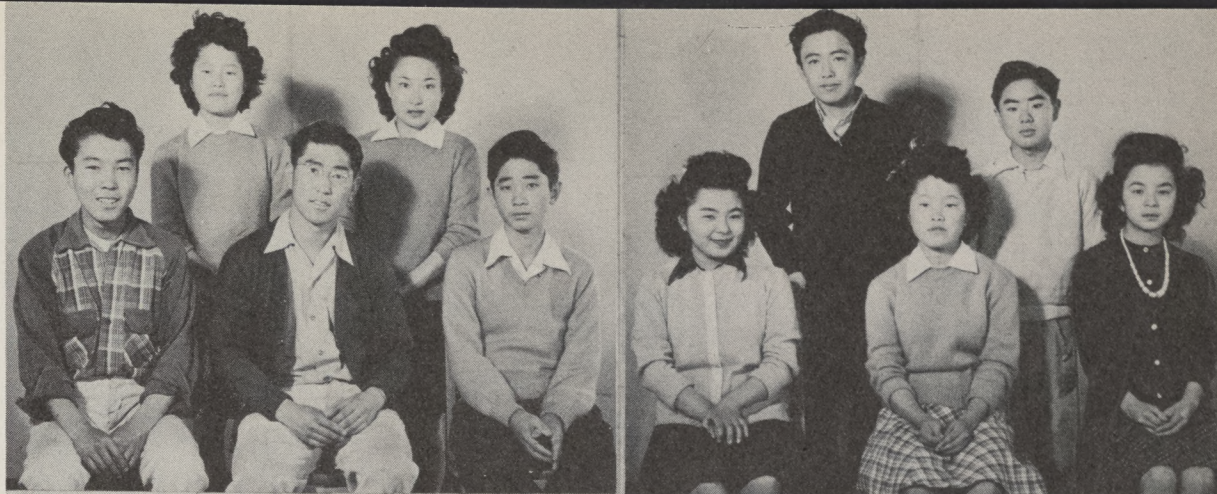

The Staff hopes you will find as much enjoyment in the perusal of this *Annual* as it has had in the make-up of the book.



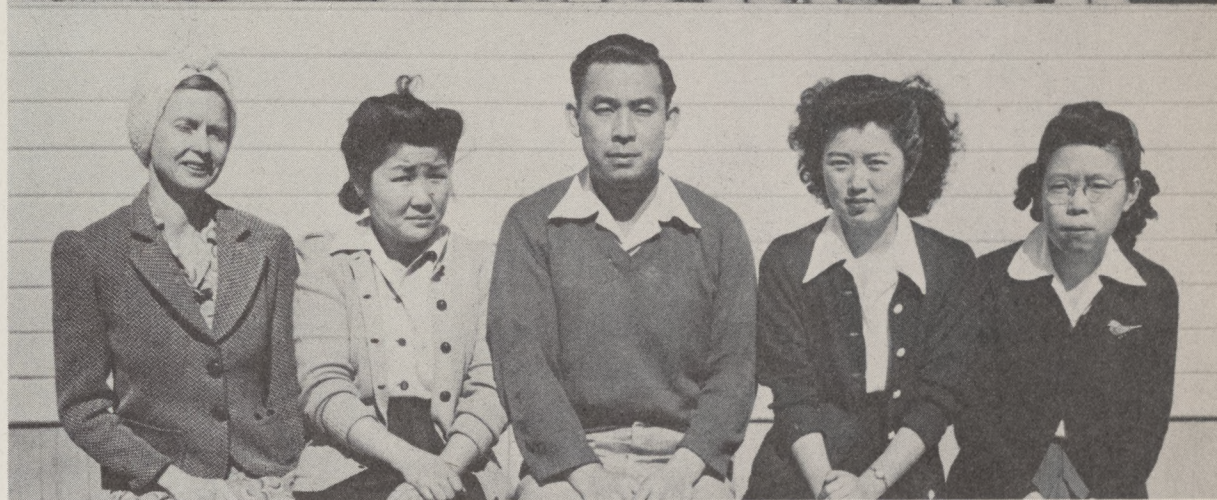

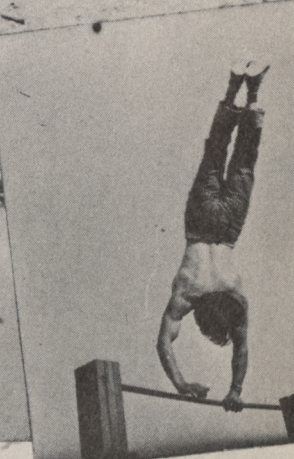
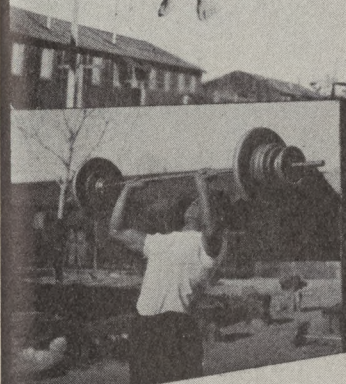
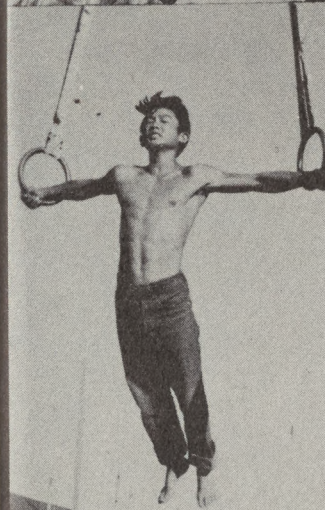
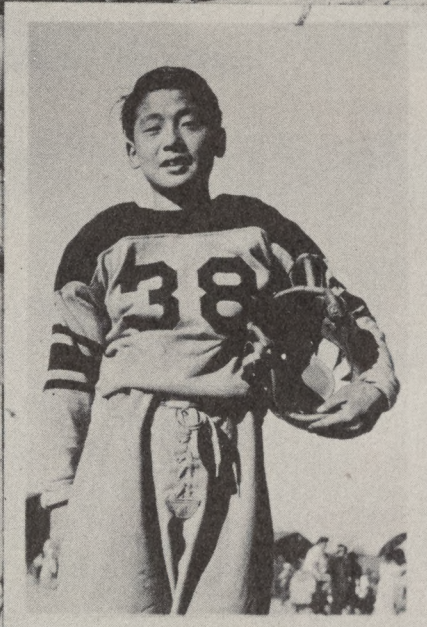
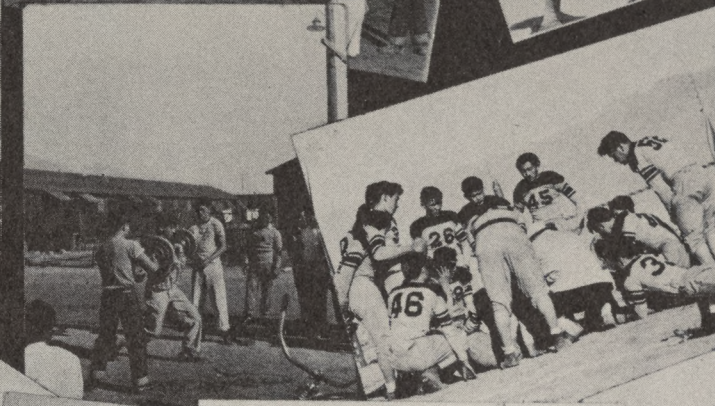
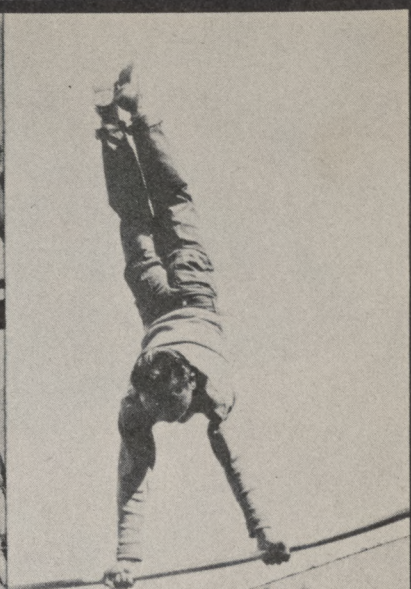
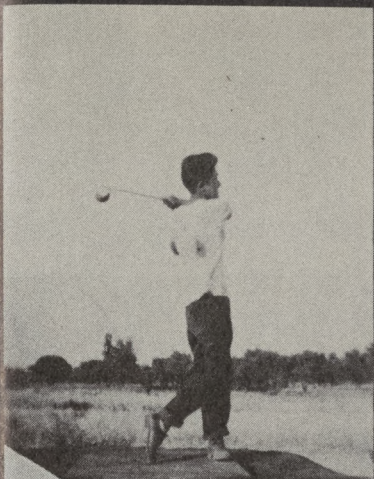
Girls' Sports



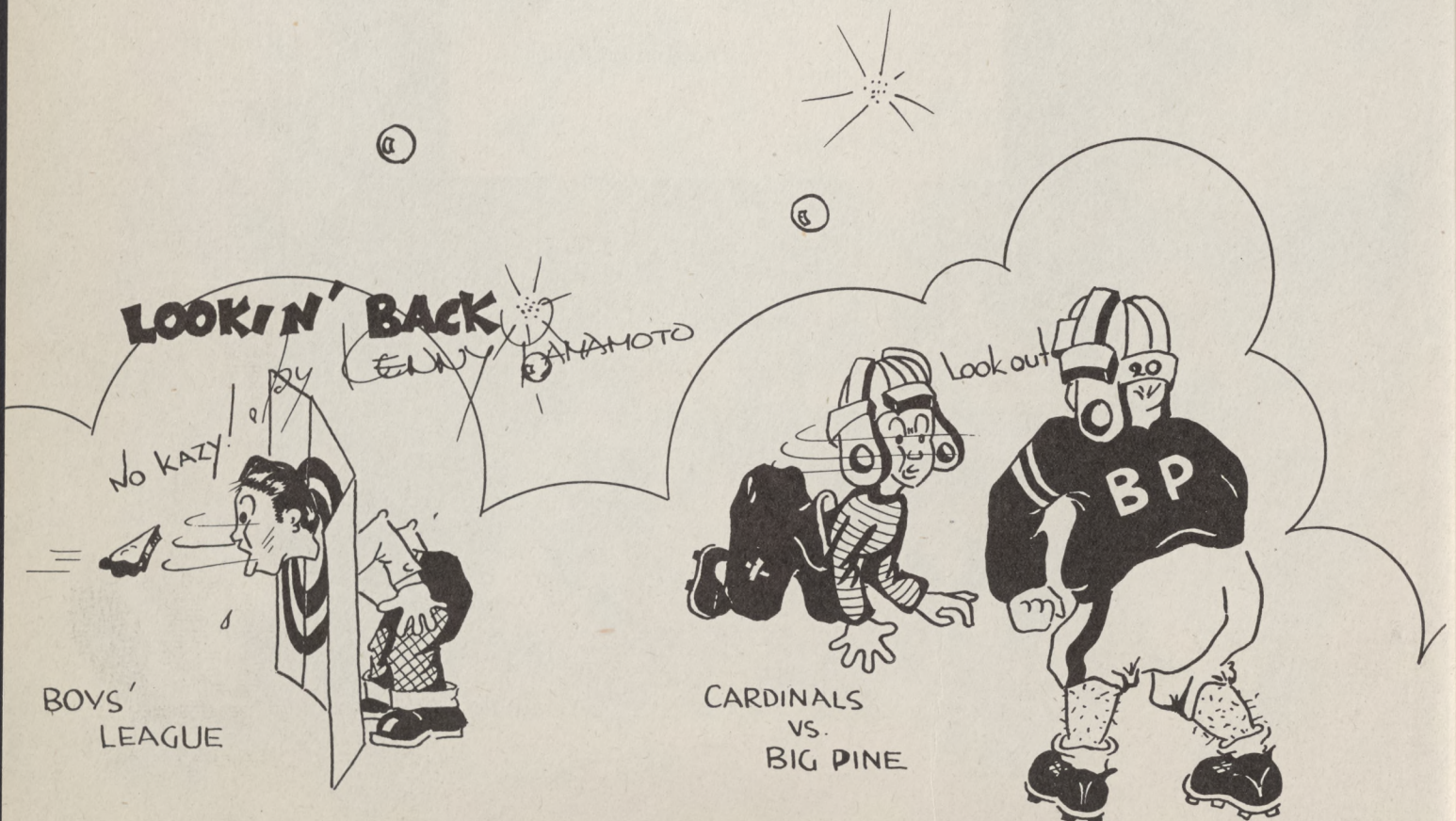
