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AMACHE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

January 2, 1945
Tuesday

The first regular meeting of the new Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado, was called to order by the outgoing Chairman, Edward Kitazumi on January 2, 1945, at the Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found Roy Uragami 8K, absent. There are no Council representatives from Blocks 6H, 9H, 10H, and 11H.

MINUTES: of December 19, 1944 was read and approved.

PROJECT DIRECTOR, Mr. Lindley, at this time spoke briefly to the body explaining the duties and responsibilities of the Community Council. The new Council representatives were then sworn into office.

RESIGNATION: by Edward Kitazumi as the Council representative of 11E was tendered verbally due to relocation and was accepted by the body.

NOMINATION AND ELECTION: of the new Council officers were held. The results were as follows:

Nominated for Chairman - Jimmy Takata, Shinichi Furuya, and Sakae Kawashiri.

Elected - Sakae Kawashiri

At this time the outgoing Chairman turned over the gavel to his newly elected successor.

Nominated for Vice Chairman - Jimmy Takata, Shinichi Furuya, and Kazuma Hayashi

Elected - Jimmy Takata

Nominated for Secretary - Betty Kitamura and Grace Koike

Elected - Grace Koike

Nominated for Treasurer - Shinichi Furuya, and Betty Kitamura

Elected - Shinichi Furuya

District Representatives selected were as follows:

District I	Thomas Kofu
II	Mitsuko Suzukida
III	Masaki Murakami
IV	Fumio Tani
V	George Nakamura

Nominated for Executive Secretary were Betty Kitamura, Kanoo Yamamoto, and Kazuma Hayashi.

Discussion followed. It was moved, seconded, and carried that the election of the Executive Secretary be withheld till the third regular meeting in order to allow the old and new Councilmen to become acquainted with each other so that the most capable person will be elected. The name of the nominees will be carried over until then.

PAID WORKERS: the matter of the number of paid workers to be had on the Council staff was brought up for discussion. It was moved, seconded, and carried that the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and the Treasurer immediately approach the Administration on the above mentioned matter and on the securing of an office space at the same time.

It was decided by the body that on all future voting of any motion, a count will be taken of ~~the absentee members and the non-represented blocks.~~ P. K.

DINNER PARTY REPORT: Mr. Furuya, Co-chairman of the party informed that an amount of \$28.31 exceeded the appropriated amount. After some discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried that the exceeded amount be taken out from the Council fund.

As there were no further pressing business, a motion was made, and seconded that the meeting be adjourned.

AMACHE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

January 9, 1945
Tuesday

The regular meeting of the Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado, was called to order by the Chairman, Sakae Kawashiri, on January 9, 1945, at the Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found Einoshin Habu 7G, Roy Uragami 8K absent. There are no Council representatives from Blocks 10H, 11H, and 11E.

MINUTES: of January 2, 1945 was read and approved with the correction of the exceeded amount for the dinner party from \$23 to \$28.31.

TREASURY REPORT: was given by the Treasurer, Mr. Furuya, for the month of December 1945. The report was approved by the Body.

PAID STAFF AND OFFICE SPACE: It was reported by the Executive Board after contacting the Administrative Staff that 4 cabinet members and the Executive Secretary will be placed on the paid staff. A room has been set aside in the old garage building for Council office use and the necessary office equipments and supplies have been moved into the office. The mimeographing machine cannot be obtained and so all mimeographing work will be done at the Office Services. It was also reported that the Project car will be available for Council use whenever needed. When asked for a paid Executive Committee, the Administration refused but agreed to reconsider the matter when the Council becomes overburdened with center-wide problems.

MINUTES: of each Council meeting is to be mimeographed both in Japanese and English and each representative will be given 2 copies, 1 for personal reference as well as for block reporting purpose and the other for the block bulletin board. The minutes will be mimeographed without Body approval and additions and corrections will be made at the following meeting. Highlights of the meeting will be published in the Pioneer.

RESIGNATION: Letter of resignation from Mr. Roy Uragami of 8K was read. Reason given for resignation was some misunderstanding with block residents. A motion was made, seconded and carried that the Chair appoint a committee of two to contact Mr. Uragami and the block residents to request reconsideration on the matter. Mr. T. Kofu and Mr. George Nakamura were appointed.

HOT WATER BOILER PROBLEM: It was reported that approximately one half of the blocks are functioning with only 1 boiler for shower and laundry use where there ought to be 2 heaters and only 2 stokers to keep the fires going. After some discussion, a motion was made and seconded that a committee of 2 be appointed to look into the matter of obtaining an additional stoker for blocks with one heater with the exception of those blocks with larger heaters. Mr. Jimmy Takata and Mr. Bob Tashima were appointed.

VISITORS: Project Director, Mr. Lindley, was presented to the Body. He informed that mistreatment rumors of evacuees who returned to the West Coast were not true. As a proof, an encouraging letter and a card from two of the evacuees who recently returned to California were read.

Mr. Stevens from the Washington office was then introduced. He spoke briefly encouraging resettlement.

It was suggested by Mr. Johnson that after mimeographed minutes are distributed to each Councilman, it may be read and explained to the block residents on the Wednesday following the regular Tuesday meeting.

Mr. McClelland welcomed any suggestions from the Body at any time on the publishing of Council information through the Pioneer.

MR. LINDLEY'S RELOCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE: It was moved, seconded and carried that Mr. George Nakamura continue to serve on the afore mentioned committee as the official representative from the Council. The voting result showed 18 - yes 1 - no.

NON-REPRESENTED BLOCKS: It was reported that there are still 4 blocks without a representative. After some discussion, it was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that Mr. Jimmy Takata and Mr. Robbin Kaneko be appointed to contact those blocks and have them select their representatives at the earliest possible date.

INVITATION: The Council was invited to attend a meeting sponsored by the Relocation Information Bureau at Terry Hall on Wednesday evening, January 10, 1945 from 7:30 p.m. to hear the report on the outcome of the recent trip undertaken by the Amache Resettlement Ass'n to Louisiana.

CURTAINS FOR TOWN HALL WINDOWS: It was reported by Mr. Furuya that a committee from the Block Managers' Assembly requested him to present to the Body the matter of purchasing some curtains for the Town Hall windows. It was unanimously agreed by the Body that the necessary amount to purchase the curtains be paid out from the Council fund.

STANDING COMMITTEE: Councilmen to serve on the various committee were appointed by the Chairman with the understanding that adjustments will be made from time to time. (The list is attached hereon)

BLOCK MEETING: The matter of Councilmen not having the right to call block meetings was brought up for discussion. It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that Mr. Jimmy Takata and Mr. Bob Tashima contact the Administration for clarification regarding the above matter.

MEDICALLY DISCHARGED VETERANS: It was reported that medically discharged veterans have not been re-inducted into the center and after a period of 30 days stay in the center without meal charges, they have been asked to leave the center. The Law and Order Committee was instructed to contact the proper office for clarification of the status of such veterans in the center.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY: It was suggested that due to the importance of the Executive Secretary's work that the Cabinet and the Executive Committee do their utmost in securing a capable person to fill the position.

As there were no further pressing business, it was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned.

AMACHE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

January 16, 1945
Tuesday

The regular meeting of the Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado was called to order by the Chairman, Sakae Kawashiri, on January 16, 1945, 9:15 a.m., at the Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found Mr. Yoshio Nakazawa 6E, Mr. George Sakogawa 7E, Mr. Masaki Murakami 12E absent. There are no Council representatives from Blocks 11E, 9F and 10F.

MINUTES: of January 9, 1945 was read and approved.

VISITOR: Mr. Roy Iakutani, Evacuee Farm Office Mgr., appeared before the Body and reported that no farm crop seed will be planted on the center farm this year and some farming land have already been leased effective February 1, 1945. He further reported that the Hayden Farm will be closed as of July 1, 1945 and the XY Ranch will be closed sometime in March. The Koen Ranch, Slaughter House and Hog Pen will be kept open till several weeks before the center closes.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

HOT WATER BOILER PROBLEM: It was reported by the Committee composed of Mr. Takata and Mr. Tashima after contacting Mr. Johnson that there are three stokers in each block instead of two as previously reported with the third person called the "Utility Man". Thus the request for obtaining an additional stoker was not granted. It was further reported that at the next meeting of the Block Managers' Assembly, Mr. R. Johnson will explain in full the work of the stokers so that they may function more effectively.

BLOCK MEETING: The same Committee reported after contacting the Administration that every Councilman has the right to call and hold Block Meetings whenever deemed necessary.

NON-REPRESENTED BLOCKS: The Committee composed of Mr. Takata and Mr. Kaneko reported that the Block Managers of the non-represented blocks were contacted to have representatives selected.

MEDICALLY DISCHARGED VETERANS: The Law and Order Committee reported after contacting the Administration that Medically Discharged Veterans will be re-inducted depending on the reason given, but due to the fact that the center will be closed eventually, it is the desire of the Administration to refrain from re-inducting such Veterans as much as possible. These Veterans are granted \$200 upon being discharged and in the event that they become ill after relocating, they are entitled to receive medical care from the Army.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY: It was reported by the Chairman that after contacting various person to fill the position of the Executive Secretary, there was no result. Discussion followed and several capable persons were suggested from the Body. It was moved and seconded that the Chair appoint a Special Committee of three to contact these persons to accept the position as Council Executive Secretary. Mr. Roy Uragami, Mr. Thomas Kofu and Miss Betty Kitamura were appointed to serve on this committee.

MR. LINDLEY'S RELOCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE: It was reported that at present one hostel in Pasadena, California is in existence to help accomodate temporary housing for evacuees returning to the West Coast and more is expected to be established in the evacuated area by various church groups and other organizations. It was further reported that W.R.A. Relocation Offices have been established in San Francisco, Los Angeles and Seattle and additional offices will be opened in the evacuated area in the near future. Also reported was the statement made by Mr. Stevens from the Washington Office that there should be no hesitation on the evacuees' part in securing Public Assistance.

NEW BUSINESS:

THIRD CENTER-WIDE MEMORIAL SERVICE: It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried that the Chairman and Vice Chairman represent the Council at the Memorial Service to be held on Saturday, January 20, 1945 at the High School Auditorium to honor the boys killed in action.

SPECIAL MEETING: Due to the fact that time is very limited to discuss the vital question of resettlement at the regular Tuesday meeting, a motion was made and seconded that a special meeting be called tomorrow, January 17, 1945 from 1:00 p.m. at the Town Hall. Councilmen residing in near-by blocks were instructed to notify absentee Council members and Block Managers of non-represented blocks of the special meeting.

F.F.A. QUESTION: It was reported by Mr. Takata that a F.F.A. Stock Convention is to be held in Denver from January 18, 1945 and the Amache F.F.A. wishes to send some of its members to attend the convention. It was further reported that due to the fact that the Amache F.F.A. is financially unable, a benefit movie is being sponsored the latter part of the month by the Community Activities to raise the necessary fund. As the fund will not be raised in time for the convention, the Council was asked to lend a sum of \$100 until such time when the fund to repay the Council will be raised from the benefit movie. Much discussion followed. It was moved and seconded that the Agriculture Committee contact the proper person or office for clarification on whether the Amache F.F.A. is still in existence and if so, to obtain the number of members and the approximate amount needed for the conference. It was understood that in the event the Community Activities should decide to finance the F.F.A. for the convention, the motion will be cancelled.

FUNCTION OF MR. LINDLEY'S RELOCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE: After much discussion, it was decided to table the matter till the special meeting being called tomorrow.

At 11:30 a.m. there being no further pressing business, it was moved, seconded and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

AMACHE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

January 17, 1945
Wednesday

A special meeting of the Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado, was called to order by the Chairman, Sakae Kawashiri, on January 17, 1945, at 1:30 p.m. at Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found Mr. George Sakogawa 7E absent.
There are no Council representatives from Blocks 9H, 10H and 11E.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

F.F.A. QUESTION: It was reported by the Agriculture Committee after contacting Mr. Griffith, F.F.A. Supervisor, and Mr. Walthers, High School Principal, that the Amache F.F.A. is still in existence with a membership of approximately 20 boys. It was further reported that request was made by the committee to have the F.F.A. boys give a brief report of the convention to the Council Body in the event the loan is approved by the Body. Much discussion followed. A motion was made and seconded that a sum of \$100 from the Council fund be loaned to the F.F.A. for the purpose of sending the members to attend the F.F.A. Stock Convention in Denver. The loan is to be repaid from the fund raised by the benefit movie being sponsored by the Community Activities at the latter part of the month. The motion was carried with the voting result as 15 yes, 2 - no. It was decided that the Treasurer make out the check to Mr. Griffith, F.F.A. Supervisor.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY: It was reported by the Special Committee composed of Mr. Kofu, Mr. Uragami, and Miss Kitamura that after contacting the various nominees, none accepted to fill the position as Council Executive Secretary. Discussion followed and several more capable persons were suggested from the Body. The same Special Committee with the addition of Mr. George Nakamura were instructed to contact these persons to accept the position as Council Executive Secretary.

FUNCTION OF MR. LINDLEY'S RELOCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE: It was reported by Mr. George Nakamura that the function of the committee is similar to that of a "messenger boy's". A report of the meeting held by the afore mentioned committee was given as follows:

1. Traveling limit for enemy aliens is 5 miles but differs depending on the area in which the alien resides. To travel more than the limited distance, an alien is first required to obtain a travel permit from the United States District Attorney.
2. Relative to licenses to sell liquor, an incoming teletype from the California State Board of Equalization advised that only citizens are eligible for such licenses and also advised that licenses to serve liquor on premises are available only by transfer from present holders. They are unable to give more specific information without knowing details as to individual applicant and location of proposed business.

RESETTLEMENT: After much discussion, it was decided that a block meeting be held in each block for the purpose of gathering opinions and reasons as well as answering questions relative to the resettlement problem. Questions which cannot be answered are to be brought back to the next Council meeting in written form. Councilmen from other blocks will conduct and hold meetings for non-represented blocks.

FLORAL WREATH: Mr. Furuya, Mrs. Shimizu and Miss Kitamura were appointed to contact the proper person to have a floral wreath for the Memorial Service.

At 4:15 p.m., there being no further pressing business, it was moved, seconded and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

AMACHE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

January 23, 1945
Tuesday

The regular meeting of the Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado was called to order by the Chairman, Sakae Kawashiri, on January 23, 1945 at 9:15 a.m. at Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found all members present. There are still no Council representatives from Blocks 9H, 10H, and 11E.

MINUTES: of January 16 and 17 were read and approved with corrections.

CORRECTIONS: In the minutes of January 16 in the last sentence of the F.F.A. Question, the word Community Activities was corrected to Recreation Ass'n. Correction was also made in the report on Medically Discharged Veterans relative to re-induction into the center as follows:

That servicemen after being discharged from the Army will be permitted to return and remain in the center temporarily. The length of stay in the center will depend on the reason given but there will be no re-induction according to the new W.R.A. Program due to lifting of the West Coast Exclusion Order.

VISITORS: Mr. S. Kimura, Mr. Y. Okida, Mr. T. Tokushima, Mr. K. Nakamura, and Mr. E. Masuda, parents of the boys killed in action and in whose honor the Memorial Service was held, expressed words of appreciation for the part taken by the Council Body.

Mr. S. Okuno and Mr. T. Kawasaki, representatives from the School Advisory Board, appeared before the Body and asked for Council approval and support on the organizing of the Amache Student Scholarship Fund Society. Much discussion followed. It was moved and seconded that the Council Body endorse and sanction the raising of the fund by the Amache Student Scholarship Fund Society. The motion was carried with the voting result of yes - 21, no - none.

BLOCK MEETING RESULT: Questions and results in written form of each block meeting held relative to the resettlement question were turned in. Short discussion followed. It was moved, seconded and carried by majority that the Cabinet members, Executive Committee and the Relocation Committee compile the written returns from the 29 blocks.

SPECIAL MEETING: will be called on Friday, January 26, 1945 from 1:00 p.m. at Amache Town Hall to further discuss the resettlement question.

INCOMING COMMUNICATION: Letters dated January 17, 1945 and December 31, 1944 from the Topaz Community Council relative to the Inter-Center Conference were read. Discussion followed. It was unanimously decided by the Body to send delegates to the Inter-Center Conference. This decision is subject to approval by the center residents.

RESIGNATION RECONSIDERED: It was reported by the committee composed of Mr. Kofu and Mr. George Nakamura that Mr. Uragami consented to reconsider and continue to serve as the SK Council representative.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: It was moved and seconded that all future committee reports be presented in written form as well as in verbal form to avoid any misinterpretation.

FAMILY COUNSELING UNIT: Mr. Tashima gave a brief report relative to the forms filled by Family Counseling for family interviews.

The Relocation Committee with the Law and Order Committee were instructed by the Body to obtain further clarification on the Relocation Assistance Application.

TELETYPE: of facts concerning the Doi Incident was read.

At 12:10 p.m., there being no further pressing business, it was moved, seconded and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

COMPILED RESULTS AND QUESTIONS OF BLOCK MEETING: were presented to the Body. Much discussion followed and numbers of questions were clarified by Mr. Wolters. It was moved, seconded and carried that the matter of holding a block meeting be tabled till the next regular meeting for further discussion. Mimeographed copies of questions and clarified answers in both English and Japanese will be distributed to each Councilman at the next meeting.

At 5:10 p.m. there being no further pressing business, it was moved, seconded and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

January 30, 1945
Tuesday

The regular meeting of the Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado, was called to order by the Chairman, Sakae Kawashiri, on January 30, 1945, 9:15 a.m. at Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found Mr. Bob Tashima 7K, Mr. Masaki Murakami 12E absent. There are no representatives from Blocks 10H and 9H.

NEWLY ELECTED COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVE: Mr. Arata Sasashima of Block 11E was introduced to the Body.

MINUTES: of the regular and special meeting of January 23 and 26 respectively were read and approved.

OUTGOING LETTER: dated January 27, 1945 to the Amache Student Scholarship Fund Society, giving Council support and approval on the organizing and raising of the fund was read.

Wire dated January 26, 1945 to Topaz Community Council in reply to the Inter-Center Conference was also read.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

RELOCATION ASSISTANCE APPLICATION REPORT: was given by the Relocation and Law and Order Committee.

FAMILY COUNSELING UNIT: It was reported by Mr. Takata that before evacuees can secure any public assistance and aid from the Resettlement Assistance Program, they will first have to approach local welfare agencies and obtain approval. It was definitely recommended that evacuees approach either the center Family Counseling Unit or Social Welfare Section and present their individual problems to obtain earliest possible pre-arrangement for assistance.

INTER-CENTER CONFERENCE: After some discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried that 3 delegates from the Council Body be sent to the conference. It was also moved and seconded that the expense of sending the delegates be paid from the Council fund and that a minimum amount of \$10 be collected from each block which is to be turned into the Council fund. The motion was carried.

BLOCK MEETING: It was decided by majority (19) that a block meeting be held in each block between today and Thursday for the following purposes:

1. To report back to the residents the compiled results and questions presented by the 29 blocks with clarifications given by Mr. Wolters and also to obtain any additional questions relative to resettlement.
2. To explain and gain approval on the Inter-Center Conference.
3. To report on Council's decision relative to delegates

and financing of delegates to the conference.

SPECIAL MEETING: will be called on Friday, February 21, 1945 at 1:00 p.m. at Amache Town Hall.

BLOCK RESETTLEMENT COMMITTEE: It was decided to table the matter till the following meeting for further discussion.

POLICE STATION LIGHT: It was reported by Mr. Furuya that he was requested by parents whose sons leave for the Army that the front entrance light at the Police Station be changed to a larger one. Mr. Kitagawa will look into the matter.

At 12:00 p.m. there being no further pressing business, it was moved, seconded and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

AMACHE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MINUTES

February 2, 1945
Friday

A special meeting of the Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado, was called to order by the Chairman, Sakae Kawashiri, on February 2, 1945, 1:15 p.m. at Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found Mr. Masao Itano 7F, Mr. Robert Tashima 7K, Mr. Masaki Murakami 12E, Mr. Robbin Kaneko 11K absent. There are no Council representatives from Blocks 9H and 10H.

MINUTES: of January 30, 1945 was read and approved.

OUTGOING LETTER: dated February 2, 1945 to Mr. Koda of the Co-op Board of Directors expressing appreciation for the lending of the Co-op mimeographing machine for Council use was read.

INCOMING TELEGRAM: dated February 1, 1945 from Topaz Community Council informing us that the Inter-Center Conference will be held at Salt Lake City starting February 16 was read.

POLICE STATION LIGHT: It was reported that the Blue Star Service Club has agreed to take care of the request made by parents of servicemen of changing the front entrance light at the station.

F.F.A.: It was informed by Mr. Hayashi that the Amache F.F.A. boys will come down and make the Denver Stock Convention report at Council's convenient date and when Mr. Griffith is so notified. Relative to the repayment of the \$100 loan by the Community Activities to the Council, Mr. Takata reported that due to the fact that the films could not be availed in time, the benefit show originally scheduled for the latter part of January has been postponed till sometime this month. Thus it was reported that the loan will be repaid the latter part of March.

RELOCATION ASSISTANCE GRANT APPLICATION: It was reported by Mr. Takata that when applications are made two weeks in advance, evacuees may get their \$25 grant before leaving the center and explanation was given relative to the special clause in the application. It was further reported that Mr. Myers is expected to visit this center sometime during the month and at that time Mr. Hanson will consult with the Director in having the clause removed.

EVACUEE PROPERTY TRANSPORTATION: It was explained by Mr. Takata that W.R.A. assistance in transportation of property to point of relocation is available but evacuees are expected to pick up all property transported for them at the common carrier depot nearest the point of relocation at their own expense or if unable, by applying for assistance through the Resettlement Assistance Program.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY: It was reported by Mr. Uragami that the result after contacting the various nominees were poor. It was further added by Mr. Kofu of the same committee that due to some reason, a definite answer was not available from one of the nominee but a definite answer will be given at the next meeting.

ROLL CALL: found all members present. Blocks 9H and 10H are still without representatives. Mr. Miura, 9H Block Manager, was present as an observer.

MINUTES: of the special meeting held on February 2, 1945 was read and approved with corrections.

CORRECTIONS: were made in the F.F.A. paragraph as follows: the benefit show originally scheduled for the latter part of February has been postponed till the 15th of March.

TREASURY REPORT: was given by the Treasurer, Mr. Furuya, for the month of February. The report was approved by the Body.

MR. FUSAJI NAKATA: of 7K was introduced to the Body. Mr. Nakata will replace Mr. Tashima, who is leaving the center, as the 7K Council representative.

INTER-CENTER CONFERENCE DELEGATES: After a lengthy discussion two methods of selecting the delegates were suggested. The two methods were as follows:

Method 1. A nominating committee be appointed and after careful study submit to the Body the names of suitable candidates for selection.

Method 2. The selection of the delegates will be entirely up to the Body without formation of a nominating committee.

A vote was taken and Method 2 was favored with a 16 - 4 vote. ROLL CALL: found Mr. Masao Itano 7F, Mrs. Mitsuko Suzukida 8G, Mr. Arata Sasashima 11E, Mr. Masaki Murakami 12E, and Mr. Robbin Kaneko 11K absent. Blocks 9H and 10H are without representatives.

MINUTES: of February 6, 1945 was read and approved.

INCOMING LETTER: dated February 7, 1945 requesting attendance of a Council representative to the P.T.A. meeting being held on February 10, 1945, 2:00 p.m. at Terry Hall was read. It was decided to have Mr. Takata attend.

COMPILED PROBLEMS AND QUESTIONS SUBMITTED BY CENTER RESIDENTS TO BE DISCUSSED WITH MR. MYER

1. Housing
 - (a) Inquiry of government's plan relative to housing of all relocatees
 - (b) The housing shortage should be eased by building houses (for evacuees) through the F.H.A.
2. Financial Aid
 - (a) Secure further detailed clarification on Resettlement Assistance Program (amount of appropriation by Congress)
 - (b) Inquire whether a written guarantee of assistance may be made available to evacuees before they leave the center for resettlement.
3. Protection to Returning Evacuees and Their Properties
 - (a) Inquire whether a proclamation by the President to extend full protection to all relocatees and properties be made possible.
4. Financial Aid in Re-establishing Former Business
 - (a) To have a special consideration or provisions be made for all relocatees.
 - (b) Collateral provision should be altogether ignored by the government for all relocatees.
5. Insurance
 - (a) Inquire possibility of government to exert its influence to make available insurance to all relocatees through private companies which have refused insurance services.

6. License
 - (a) Inquire possibility of having Mr. Myer recommend the issuance of some licenses which have not been made available to evacuees.
 - (b) That non-discrimination be made on issuance of licenses to all relocatees.
7. Naturalization of Issei (Enemy Aliens)
 - (a) Inquire as to whether work is being or will be done by the U.S. Government in extending naturalization to those Isseis whose loyalty have been recognized and who so desire to become naturalized citizens.
8. Travel Restrictions
 - (a) Inquire the possibility of having travel restrictions alleviated for those Isseis whose loyalty to the U.S. Government have been recognized and for those parents and families whose sons, husbands and brothers are serving in the armed forces.
9. Priority for Necessity Goods
 - (a) Special priority should be issued on such goods as farm machinery and household furnishings to all relocatees.
10. Cancelling of Leases
 - (a) To have made possible the cancelling of long-term leases on farm lands, houses, and other properties.
11. Extension of Time for Evacuee Property Removal from Government or W.R.A. Warehouses After Date of Center Closure is Announced.

Reason - that due to the unsettled conditions and lack of space in the new homes, many of the large household goods cannot possibly be utilized or stored in individual homes.
12. Power of Attorney
 - (a) To secure further clarification
13. Legal Advising Offices
 - (a) The need of establishing such offices in various towns for the availability of non-charge legal aids to the relocatees.
14. Continued Schooling for Children Until Center Closure
15. What are the W.R.A. plan in handling those people who expressed their opinions as thus:

Due to existence of the war between Japan and America, unpredictable fear of physical violence may happen.

Therefore they are asking for continued operation of the center for the duration and put them under protective custody.

SPECIAL MEETING: will be called on Sunday, February 11, 1945 after the open meeting of Mr. Myer at the 8F Recreation Hall. The purpose of the meeting is to make any necessary changes in the problems to be presented to Mr. Myer on Monday.

BLOCK RESETTLEMENT COMMITTEE: After much discussion the matter was tabled for the present.

SPANISH CONSUL: After some discussion relative to the visit of the Spanish Consul, it was unanimously decided that a request be made for a joint meeting with the Block Managers' Assembly. It was moved, seconded and carried that a special committee of two be appointed to contact and make the request to the Block Managers' Assembly and to Mr. Johnson. Mr. Takata and Mr. Kofu were appointed.

GENERAL SURVEY FORMS: were distributed to each Councilman. Instruction was given that one form be filled by each family head. The completed forms are to be turned in at the earliest possible date not later than Monday afternoon.

ISHI KOEN KAI: It was reported by Mr. Takahashi that after much effort on the part of the Koen Kai, the services of Dr. Tanaka and Dr. Kimura, both at Santa Fe, New Mexico, could not be secured for this center. It was further reported that additional orei of \$20 has been given to the two remaining evacuee doctors. Registered nurses in the Isolation Ward and nurses' aides are to receive monthly oreis. Also collection from center residents for Koen Kai Fund will be continued until the three month notice for center closure is announced. The Koen Kai is working at present to secure through the Co-op the temporary service of Dr. Ishimaru of Boulder for this center's Optometry Clinic. It was further added by Mr. Takahashi that due to his relocation in the very near future and of the fact that other Council members to the Koen Kai have already left the center, he requested selection of new Council representatives to the organization.

Subsequently, Mr. Yoshino, Mr. Nagata and Mr. Sagara were selected.

EVACUEE PROPERTY: It was reported that W.R.A. assistance has been given for evacuee property transportation up to the point of relocation in the various cities excepting Chicago. After some discussion it was decided to have the Transportation, Supply, and Maintenance Committee to obtain further clarification on the matter.

GENERAL SURVEY: Councilmen who have not yet turned in the survey forms were asked to do so at the earliest possible date.

RESIGNATION: from Mr. Benji Takahashi was tendered verbally at this time. The reason given was relocation. The resignation was accepted by the Body. Mr. Takata will contact Block 12G for the selection of a new representative.

INCOMING LETTER: dated February 20, 1945 was read and approved.

OUTGOING APPRECIATION LETTERS: to Mr. Myer and Mr. Benji Takahashi, former 12G Council representative, were read and approved by the Body.

VISITORS: Mr. Earl Barton from the Property Section was presented to the Body. The Body was informed of his transfer to the Evacuee Property Section and he requested the aid of the Council in securing 10 workers immediately for his department as he is without any helpers at the present. The work consists mainly of hauling and moving evacuee property.

The procedure which should be followed by relocating evacuees in getting the crates ready for shipment was explained as follows:

1. To get approval on lumbers and nails from Mr. Herbert Vatcher, Evacuee Property Officer.
2. Then to have Mr. Spain, Carpenter Foreman, size up the approximate amount of crating lumber that will be needed.
3. To go to the Relocation Office and to have certified whatever household goods the evacuee has which need to be shipped.
4. To file Form #156 at the Evacuee Property Office listing all the items to be shipped. Care should be taken to list the crates in a sequence order.
5. Each crate and freight should be numbered with the full name and address of the relocatee's destination. Caution was made here that a new series of number should be used for the crated goods and the freights.

It was further added that 48 hours of advance notice is required for pick-up service and if an evacuee wishes to check on the goods stored in the Lamar Warehouse, he may do so by informing the Evacuee Property. Re-crating may be done right in Lamar.

Mr. Johnson, Head of Community Management, informed the Body of government property destruction by some evacuees and requested the Council to publicize the happening and to caution as well as advise the residents to help prevent such occurrences in the future.

TRANSPORTATION, SUPPLY & MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE: reported that W.R.A. assistance for evacuee property transportation is extended up to the common carrier depot nearest the point of relocation and that all evacuees from this point on will be expected to furnish their own transportation. However, in many of the larger cities, the railway company extends service in transporting goods direct to the owner's destination including Chicago. However, in Chicago this service is worked within a specified zone and anyone whose point of relocation lies beyond this zone will be expected to furnish his own transportation from the depot.

GENERAL SURVEY: A summarized report of the survey forms turned in to date was given.

J.A.C.L. QUESTION: It was decided to table the matter till the next meeting.

MR. ERNEST FUKUDA: It was informed that Mr. Fukuda, 11K Proxy for Mr. Kaneko is relocating in the near future.

PRESS & PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE: was instructed to contact Blocks 11K, 9H and 7F for the selection of new representatives.

CHAIRMAN'S CONFERENCE REPORT: At this time, Chairman Mr. Kawashiri appeared before the Body and reported that due to the extension of the conference for 3 additional days, the conference report is not fully organized as yet.

SPECIAL MEETING: will be called on March 1, 1945, 1:30 p.m. at the Amache Town Hall to hear the delegates' report of the conference

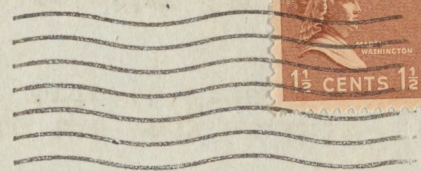
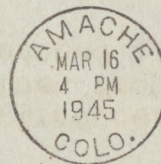

The Chair reported to the Body that a telegram from the Topaz Community Council has been received informing us that the final copies of facts and recommendations of the All-Center Conference have been mailed on March 16, 1945. It was further reported that copies of the letter dated March 6, 1945 from Mr. Malcolm Pitts, Acting Director acknowledging receipt of the findings and recommendations of the conference were distributed to each Councilman.

SPECIAL DONATION: It was reported that negotiations are being made by Mr. Furuya with the 8G Block relative to the special donation collected from every block for the Council fund in connection with the All-Center Conference. It was further reported that no donation has been received from Block 11K. Mr. Kano was requested by the Body to contact the 11K Block Manager relative to this matter.

VISITOR: Mr. George Miyao, a relocatee to Florin, California and who is in the center for a brief stay, was introduced to the Body. He briefly reported on the conditions of Florin and around the vicinities of Sacramento. He stressed on the importance of deferred workers in having proper connections between draft boards when the person is transferring to another essential job.

MR. HORN'S FAREWELL PARTY: It was reported that a farewell party is being sponsored by the Co-op, Block Managers' Assembly and the Council for Mr. Donald T. Horn, Project Attorney, who is leaving the center in the near future. After a brief discussion, Mr. Furuya and Mr. Takata were appointed to represent the Council and attend

the pre-arrangement meeting of the party at the Co-op Board of Directors' Office on March 20, 1945 from 7:00 p.m.

GENERAL SURVEY: It was reported that there is a need to take another survey of the center residents as the one taken previously was rather incomplete. After much discussion it was decided to take a second survey with each Council representative of his block interviewing each individual family. Then the question of whether or not the name of each family head should be filled in the survey was discussed. The matter was tabled till the next regular meeting.

RESETTLEMENT PROGRAM: Much discussion followed for the solving of the present problem which we are faced with.

SPECIAL MEETING: will be called on Thursday, March 22, 1945 from 1:30 p.m. at the Town Hall. The purpose of the meeting will be to discuss further the above-mentioned question.

TELEGRAM OF CONDOLENCE: will be sent to Mr. Ralph Kitagawa whose mother passed away in California.

At 12:00 noon there being no further pressing business, it was moved, seconded and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

May 8, 1945
Tuesday

The regular meeting of the Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado, was called to order by Chairman Sakae Kawashiri on May 8, 1945, 9:15 a.m. at the Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found Mr. George Sakogawa 8E and Mr. Ralph Kitagawa 8F absent. Blocks 7F, 6G, 12E and 12G are without representatives. Mrs. Katayama was present as proxy from 6E.

MINUTES: of May 1, 1945 was read and approved.

The regular meeting of the Amache Community Council, Amache, Colorado, was called to order by Chairman Sakae Kawashiri on May 15, 1945, 9:15 a.m. at the Amache Town Hall.

ROLL CALL: found Miss Hana Uno 6E, Mr. Ralph Kitagawa 8F, Mr. Harry Otani 11F and Mrs. Yoneko Shimizu 12F absent. Blocks 7E, 6G, 12E and 12G are without representatives.

BLOCK MEETING RESULTS FOR THE NEW PLAN: were given as follows: Blocks 6E, 6F, 7F, 8E, 7G, 7K, 8G, 9E, 11F, 9K, 9L and 11G approved of the plan with Block 11H giving a conditional approval. No meeting has been held as yet in the remaining 16 blocks. Councilmen from these blocks were asked to hold their meetings before the next regular Council meeting.

ISHI KOEN KAI COMMITTEE REPORT: was given by Mr. Yoshino. He reported that the matter of giving \$20 additional appreciation to the two evacuee doctors was presented but the matter is to be discussed further at the next general meeting of the Ishi Koen Kai. It was also mentioned that Dr. Terami is the new Ishi Koen Kai chairman succeeding Dr. Miyamoto who relocated recently.

ROLL CALL: found Miss Hana Uno 6E absent. Blocks 7E, 6G, 9E, and 12E are without representatives. Mr. Jitsuo Miyano of 8E and Mr. S. Habara of 12G were present as proxies.

MINUTES: of May 8 and 15 were read and approved.

INCOMING LETTER: dated May 10, 1945 from Rohwer Community Council to Mr. Masaru Narahara in regards to Mr. Myer's comments to the 21 recommendations was read. A letter dated May 9, 1945 from Mr. Masaru Narahara, Chairman of the All-Center Conference on the expenses of the All-Center Conference. A letter from Minidoka Council dated May 4, 1945 which gave the relocation statistics for the month of April. A letter from JACL asking for a financial contribution for a movement to improve the future welfare of Japanese ancestry. Letters of resignations from Mr. George Sagara 8E and Miss Grace Koike 9E were also read. The Chair reported that the Council has received Butte Council's minutes of May 2 and 7, 1945. Also minutes from Canal Council of May 14 which will be placed on file in the Council office for those who wish to read it.

OUTGOING LETTER: dated May 18, 1945 to Mr. Masaru Narahara, Topaz Community Council in regards to West Coast W.R.A. Field Offices was read.

NEWLY ELECTED COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES: Mr. Jitsuo Miyano from 8E and Mr. S. Habara from 12G were introduced to the Body.

BLOCK MEETING RESULTS ON THE NEW PLAN: were given as follows: 7E, 6H, 7H, 10E, 11E, 12F, 8K, 9H, 10H, 12H, 12K approved the plan with only 11K disapproving the plan. No meeting has been held as yet in the remaining 4 blocks. Councilmen from these blocks were asked to hold their meetings before the next regular Council meeting.

JOINT MEETING WITH THE BLOCK MANAGERS' ASSEMBLY REPORT: was given by the Chairman. He reported that a joint meeting with the Block Managers' Assembly was held at 10:00 a.m. at the Amache Town Hall on May 17, 1945. At first the meeting was announced as May 16, 1945 at 1:30 p.m. but due to informal invitation, the joint meeting was delayed until the following morning. At the joint meeting seven members of the Council were appointed to contact Mr. Lindley on the 7K and 9L closure. The seven Negotiation Committee members were as follows: Sakae Kawashiri, Roy Uragami, George Nakamura, Seitaro Fukuhara, Thomas Kofu, George Yamamoto, and Fumio Tani. The above committee contacted Mr. Lindley the same afternoon and he stated that if 7K and 9L reasons were sent to him

thru the same committee before May 25th or 26th, 1945, he will consider it upon reasons.

7K and 9L Resolutions: which the committees will present to Mr. Lindley were read to the Body by Mr. Osajima, 7K Block Manager, and Mr. Fumio Tani, 9L Councilman. It was stated by Mr. Osajima that 7K resolution was changed similar to 9L resolution at their latest 7K block meeting. A motion was made by Mr. Tani that another joint meeting with the Block Managers' Assembly be held before the Committee presents the reasons to Mr. Lindley.

ROHWER COMMUNITY COUNCIL'S LETTER: on Mr. Myer's comments on the recommendations. It was decided by the Body that we send a letter to Topaz Council agreeing on the Rohwer Council's suggestion.

TOPAZ LETTER: on the All-Center Conference expenses is to be discussed among the delegates who attended the conference before sending an answer.

J.A.C.L. LETTER: in regards to contribution for the improvement of welfare of Japanese ancestry, each Council representatives were informed to announce in their mess hall on the individual contributions.

RESIGNATION OF MR. SAGARA (9E) and MISS KOIKE (9E): It was decided by the body to accept both resignations since the reasons were relocation.

NEW PLAN: After some discussion it was decided to discuss the NEW PLAN COMMITTEE at the next regular meeting. It was also decided by the Body that Cabinet and Executive Committee set up a rough plan for the formation of the NEW PLAN.

MR. LINDLEY'S REPLY ON THE BLOCK CLOSURES: It was reported by the Chairman that the committee received the following reply from Mr. Lindley this afternoon at his office as an tentative plan:

9E Block to be closed 30 days after closure of the mess hall.

CABINET AND EXECUTIVE MEMBERS RESIGNATION: It was reported that immediately after Mr. Lindley's reply on the block closures, the Cabinet and Executive Members meeting was held at the Council office to discuss on Mr. Lindley's reply. After much discussion the entire Cabinet and Executive Members signed a joint resignation paper for the reason that the committee and cabinet members could not get a satisfactory result on the negotiations. It was decided that we hold a special meeting to get the approval of the Body on the resignation as soon as possible.

DISCUSSION ON CABINET AND EXECUTIVE MEMBERS RESIGNATION: After a long discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and carried that the entire Council Body's name be included on the resignation instead of only the Cabinet and Executive members. It was by the Body that the reasons be as follows:

"Despite the effort of the Community Council to function in behalf of the residents welfare and interests, we, the Community Councilmen representing the residents feel that we are unable to remain in the Community Council any longer to continue our services in sharing the responsibilities due to difficulties and present circumstances of making negotiations in regards to Mess and Block Closure with Mr. Lindley and his staffs.

We, therefore, make this joint resignation on reasons above stated effective this date, May 30, 1945.

NEGOTIATION COMMITTEE FOR PUBLICITY: A motion was made, seconded, and carried that the Ex-Cabinet and Executive members be appointed as an negotiation committee to make a public statement through the Pioneer on the reasons of the resignation of the entire Council Body.

At 10:30 p.m. there being no further pressing business, it was moved seconded and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

MINUTE: of May 22 was read and approved.

INCOMING LETTER: Letter of resignation from Mr. Akira Komai, 7K proxy councilman was read.

OUTGOING LETTER: dated May 28, 1945 to Rohwer Community Council on Mr. Myer's comment was read.

VISITOR: Mr. Louis Oki, recruiter from the War Hemp Industries in Shabbona, Illinois, was introduced to the Body and briefly informed that he has job offers for approximately 150 mill workers. The purpose of the meeting was to obtain both the Block Managers and Council approval on the 7K and 9L resolution which was to be presented to Mr. J. G. Lindley, Project Director on May 25th. At that time it was decided by the Body to have the same committee that contacted Mr. Lindley previously on the extension of the block closure present the resolutions. On May 25th, the above committee presented the resolutions to the Project Director and he informed the committee he wished to study the matter until early this week, at that he will give a definite reply.

7K REFRIGERATOR: It was reported by the Chairman that Mr. Osajima, 7K Block Manager, was present at the joint meeting and presented the matter of 7K baby food refrigerator being removed upon mess closure and it was the desire of the 7K mothers to have this restored as before. It was decided by the Body to have the 7K Mothers and the Council committee contact Mr. Lindley on this matter.

FIREMEN'S WALKOUT: It was also reported that Mr. Halliday, Chief Administrative Management and Mr. Fuller, Chief Operations Div., appeared before the Body and reported on the firemen's walk out. It was decided by the Body to have the Law and Order Committee from both the Council and the Block Managers' Assembly look into the matter. The Law and Order Committee met with Mr. Lindley on Sunday, May 27, 1945, and on Monday 8:30 a.m. the Assistant Fire Chief, six Captains and Mr. Sakae Kawashiri met with Mr. Lindley and a successful settlement was made. ROLL CALL: found Miss Hana Uno 6E and Mr. George Yamamoto 11E absent. 7E, 7F, 6G, and 12E are without representatives. Mr. Kenjiro Ito from 7K, Mr. Yoshiwara from 9E and Mr. Okubo from 10H were present as observers.

PURPOSE: of the special meeting was to report Mr. Lindley's action on the resignation of the entire Council Body.

RESIGNATION REPORT: A report was made by the Ex-Chairman that the joint resignation papers was forwarded to Mr. Lindley, Project Director, at 11:00 a.m. May 30, 1945. At that time, Mr. Lindley was busy at conference with his staff therefore the negotiation committee left the resignation papers with his secretary.

COUNTER-PROPOSAL: At 2:30 p.m. Mr. Sakae Kawashiri received a phone call in the Council from Mr. Lindley informing him that he wished to see him. The Ex-Chairman went to see Mr. Lindley alone and the following message were received from Mr. Lindley:

"I will cancell all previous orders that I made in regard to mess and block closures, and now I make this new plan as a counter-proposal for you councilmen to reconsider your resignation.

Under the new arrangement the two blocks scheduled for complete closing will not be closed. It was suggested that plans would not call for any blocks to be closed unless necessity arises and at that time ~~the~~ negotiations would be made before any action is taken."

WRITTEN STATEMENT: It was decided by the Body that the Negotiation Committee present the following written statement to Mr. Lindley to make the final negotiation:

"Administrative staffs recognize the Amache Community Council as the only body representing the center residents and shall have the closer relationship and cooperative spirit with the Community Council.

Hereafter, whenever necessity arises and in order to avoid any further serious incidents, there shall be a consultation between the Administration and Community Council. Administrative staffs shall have a better understanding and sympathetic attitude taken in the future. Seeing that, the Community Council shall do our utmost to solve our mutual problems."

PROPOSAL: It was decided by the Body that if the Negotiation Committee make a satisfactory adjustment with Mr. Lindley in settling the matter stated above, all councilmen were to serve for the remaining term.

At 10:30 p.m. there being no further pressing business, it was moved, seconded and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

ROLL CALL: found all members present, with no council representative from blocks 7E, 6E, 6G, and 12E. Mr. Kenjiro Ito of 7K was present as proxy. Mr. Yoshiwara of 9E and Mr. Okubo of 10H were present as observers.

MINUTES: of the last regular meeting May 29, 1945, and minutes of the special meeting on the evening of May 29, 1945, and another special meeting minutes of May 30th, 1945 was read and approved with the following correction.

CORRECTION: on the minutes of the regular meeting of May 29, 1945, under the paragraph of firemen's walkout, the following correction was made: "The Law and Order committee and Mr. Forrest Foster met with Mr. Lindley on Sunday, May 27, 1945.

TREASURY REPORT: for the month of May was given by the treasurer, Mr. Furuya. The balance stated was \$156.42 as of May 31, 1945. The report was approved by the Body.

INCOMING COMMUNICATION: A letter dated May 28, 1945, from Topaz Community Council requesting for a careful study on Mr. Myer's comments on our recommendation was read. At this time, it was the Body's decision that the Cabinet and Executive Committee study the matter to compile questions before the next regular meeting.

Also a letter from Dr. Yamato Ichihashi, who relocated to Stanford University, California, wrote on his trip to Palo Alto, Calif., and also information to the parolees on what steps he must take upon reaching his destination. The copy of the letter will be published in the Pioneer.

Also a memorandum from Mr. Roy Nakatani, Assistant Farm Supervisor, on the receipt of \$72.50 for the slaughter house workers.

COMMITTEE REPORT

NEGOTIATION COMMITTEE: It was reported by the Chair that the Negotiation Committee met with the Project Director on May 31st with a written statement and a settlement was made to withdraw the Council's resignation at this time. Mr. Lindley promised that whatever he publishes in the Pioneer pertaining to the center, he will first get an approval from the Council before publishing in the Pioneer. As promised, the following afternoon, Mr. Lindley brought for Council's approval an article pertaining to the new plan of the mess closure for publication in the center paper. At that time the Cabinet members disapproved the first copy and a rewritten copy was approved with few paragraphs removed.

The secretary read the disapproved and the approved article to the Body at this time.

BLUE STAR SERVICE CLUB PARTY: A report was made by Mr. Kofu that he represented the Council in place of the Chairman to attend the Blue Star Service Club's Farewell Party for the departing soldiers.

CENTER-WIDE MEMORIAL SERVICE: Mr. Uragami was appointed by the Chair to speak as a Council representative at the coming memorial service which will be held ~~May 29, 1945~~ June 9, 1945 at the high school auditorium. Mr. Fumio Tani was also appointed to represent the Council during the "O-sho-ko". It was also decided by the Body that we send a floral wreath for the service. Mr. Furuya was appointed to order the wreath.

FUNERAL ATTENDANCE: A report was also made by Mr. Kofu that he represented the Council at the funeral of Mr. Tokujiro Takata of 6E on June 3, 1945.

SHOE RATION STAMP: It was reported by Mr. Kofu that he contacted Mr. Walter J. Knodel, Relocation Officer, in regards to the discontinuance of shoe ration applications. After some discussion with Mr. Knodel, he agreed to hire a part-time worker after high school graduation and starting this week every Wednesday and Friday at 1:30 p.m. applications will be accepted at the Relocation Office. This plan will be followed until a full time worker is found. Further information will be published in the Pioneer.

MR. E. YOSHIMOTO'S FUNERAL: Mr. Kenjiro Ito of 7K asked the Body that a Council representative be sent to Mr. E. Yoshimoto's funeral which will be held on June 8, 1945, 2:00 p.m. at 7G Buddhist Church. The Chair appointed Mr. Ito to attend the funeral as a representative from the Council.

PREPARATION FOR ELECTION: It was decided by the Body that the Chairman appoint 5 members as Election Committee for the preparation of the election for new councilmen for the term July 1st to Dec. 31, 1945.
