Since block No. I has 218 bachelors this helps to account for the great number of single family heads.

Much time has been devoted to segregation and the Tuleans have been inducted and housed. The blocks are nearer to an equalization of population than they have been for some time. No people were put in block 20 after segregants left several vacancies there. There is a plan to use vacancies in this Block for recreation as well as officers for the U.S.O., Y.W.C.A., Y.M.C.A., and church groups.

Reports of a small amount of moving about served as a reminder that better centralization of applications to move and the approval of such moves was indicated. It was thought best not to try to change the procedure but to work closely with Block Managers in controlling and approving moves. It was possible to work out space for those moving to larger units in choosing blocks with low population or locating units near selected friends or relatives.

A number of requests for lumber to be used in crating were received, but the Welfare Section could only refer such requests to the Operations Division as their general plan for providing such materials has been worked out and will be handled outside the Welfare Section.

Some requests for baby cribs were refused because it was thought best not to undertake to provide cribs for all the new babies to be born during the next month or two since such articles of furniture had not been provided before.

There were no unusual Housing problems that came up during this month. The Project Director had all the Block Managers notified that moves were to be frozen on April 21, 1944. Any exceptional cases that might come up are to be referred to the Housing Counselor who would determine whether or not it was a necessary move.

Mr. Thomas from Tule Lake was here this month to assign housing for segregants.

Data in Sections E and F is based on a weekly report of units occupied as submitted by Block Managers and Secretaries.

The figures on Section E represent all short-term leave. The shorter seasonal leaves are included as housing residents while those who go out for longer periods of seasonal leave are referred to Welfare Section by Relocation Division for releasing property and checking out of housing. They are not included in this report.

The last weekly report in April showed the population of the center to be 6,440, whereas, the last weekly report in May showed the population to be 5,645. Most of this drop in population can be accounted for due to the fact that during the month of May 623 persons were sent to Tule Lake; 13 persons went as far as Granada on the second Tule bound train; and several families consisting of 130 individuals were sent to Rohwer in advance of the regular closing movements.

The greatest change in population was noted in the blocks 38, 39, 40, whose population dropped from 332 to 96; 255 to 150; and 173 to 107, respectively. These blocks were made up of Hawaiian families who comprised the bulk of the segregation movement.

As of the last day of May, the average number of persons residing in a block was 171. The highest number of persons residing in one block was 216 in block 28. The least number of people are residing in block 38 which has 96.

Movement within the center was held to a minimum during this month and only four moves were approved.

The big problem confronting the Housing Section from now until the center closes is that of picking up and accounting for the blankets, cots, and mattresses, which are charged out to the Housing Section.

The last train load of Evacuees departed from Jerome bound for Gila on June 24, 1944 leaving only 296 post contingent evacuee workers in the area. These were workers who had stayed behind to finish their jobs after their families had already gone on to Rohwer. They were housed in Blocks 14 & 15 and ate in Block 14 mess hall. They were taken to Rohwer on the morning of June 30 so the end of this month finds Jerome with no evacuee residents.

Originally housing was charged with the responsibility of picking up and accounting for beddings, namely, steel cots, mattresses and blankets. During this month this responsibility was assumed by the Property Control office which is as it should be. Housing has been receiving memorandum receipts for all shipments from this center although the question of accountability has never been settled as far as the Welfare is concerned.

The main housing problem for the month was that of assigning post contingent housing. The original idea was to use only Block 14 but several barracks in that block had bed bugs. The inhabitants had kept this fact from us and had been very quiet about it but it took no time at all to discover it as soon as we started making assignments in that block. A list was made of the rooms which had bed bugs. No assignments were made in them and the south section of Block 15 was opened for post contingent use. Evacuees were advised to bring their own mattresses to use in

Block 14. One old man, who was living in Block 15, made it a point to go inform every person he saw moving into an empty apartment in Block 14 that that place had bed bugs (it made no difference to him whether or not the apartment actually was infested) because he had seen them and told the person to move into Block 15. This caused a number of persons to move from their original assignments and although some came back to the office and cleared with us others did not bother to do so.

A few post contingent workers never did come to the office to receive assignments but just moved into an apartment that happened to be empty. In some instances these apartments had already been assigned but the party had not moved in as yet. When they were ready to move in they found it occupied and had to move into another apartment. Some persons decided they liked another apartment better and so just moved.

During all this moving about there was considerably less complaints than might be expected. The few that came to the attention of the housing counselor were settled with very little difficulty and everyone seemed to be happy. This situation did, however, make it practically impossible to keep an accurate check on where everyone was living during the period from June 24 through June 30.
