November 14, 1943

I. A special meeting of the Scouters and the District Committee was called to order by Commissioner Mikio Fujimoto, for the purpose of discussing problems vital to the Scouting movement with Mr. Glinkman, Chief Scout Executive. Leaders present were Mikio Fujimoto, George Tashiro, George Fuchigami, Roy Uragami, Keikichi Fukuyama, George Muramoto, Dr. Terami, Tak Koga, Koe Yoshida, Ed Tokunaga, Tom Sasaki, Sam Iijima, T. Ogata, and Aki Yoshimura. Also participating in the meeting was Mr. Brigham, who accompanied Mr. Glinkman.

II. The minutes of two previous meetings were read and a minor correction was made in the terminology of the body heretofore known as the Scouters Council.

III. Executive Glinkman advised strongly the use of the newspapers or other publications for publicizing the activities of the Scouts. He further suggested that a member of the editorial staff be connected with the Scout Movement. It was reported that Joe McLellan, Report Office, was the official photographer for this Center.

IV. Orders were placed for a number of Scout and Cub books as follows:

50 Scout handbooks  
29 Wolf books  
30 Bear books  
21 Lion books

Mikio Fujimoto advanced 36 dollars to the District Treasury in payment of the above order.

V. It was announced that the Scouts were serving as runners for the Report Office and Police Department in their task of distributing confiscated books and goods. It was advised that a record be kept of the number of hours worked by the Scouts. Schedule for the troops to report hereafter for duty will be sent to scoutmasters.

VI. Newly selected and assigned troop numbers were reported by the Scoutmasters as follows:



Troop 164 and 179 for 379  
Troop 180 for 18  
Troop 162 for 62  
Troop 161 for 1  
Troop 177 for 25

Scoutmasters were advised to carry on the normal scouting activities in the Center. Further that it was not necessary to revolutionize the organization or activities because of our present circumstances. Scouting carried on as an extra curricular activity of the Educational Department was deemed impractical by Mr. Glinkman.

VII. Mikio Fujimoto is to contact Administration for a permanent pass for Mr. Glinkman and Mr. Brittain.

VIII. Meeting was declared adjourned 10:30 P. M.

I. The regular meeting of the District Scouters was called to order by Commissioner Mikio Fujimoto, 7:45 P. M. Members present were Koe Yoshida, Buddy Iwata, Ed Tokunaga, Mikio Fujimoto, Tak Koga, Torazo Ogata, K. Fukuyama, Roy Uragami, Sam Iijima, and Aki Yoshimura. The minutes of the previous meeting was read and an addition was made to read: "Mr. Glinkman is to approach the Council Committee on Finance for an appropriation of a revolving fund of fifty dollars for this District."

II. Mr. Glinkman's letter to Mikio Fujimoto was read and the payment of \$2.50 for the balance of the cost of the handbooks was approved by the District. The members of the Operating Staff were announced as follows:

The title of skipper for Sam Iijima was changed to Senior Scout leader.

III. Committee Chairmen were requested to select the members of their respective committees as soon as possible and report their names to Scout Headquarters. A lengthy discussion was held on the ways and means of raising funds for carrying on the Scouting work. Suggestions were to approach Administration for appropriations through WRA. The Finance Committee headed by Mr. Uragami and assisted by Scout leaders will study the problem and make an annual budget of our needs to be submitted to responsible parties. A letter will be sent to Mr. Glinkman to inquire of the progress of his efforts to raise funds.

IV. A suggestion to haul kindling wood from the XY Ranch to the Mess Halls and School as a good turn duty for the Scouts was unanimously approved by the body. A scrap metal drive will be held at a later date. Ed Tokunaga will be in full charge of this activity.



V. The problem of Troop 39 of Sebastapol under George Fujita was referred to Ed Tokunaga, Chairman of Organization and Extension. Troop 26 under Koe Yoshida changed its number to Troop 170. The meetings hereafter will be called the meeting of the District Scouters.

VI. A motion was made and carried that this District be divided into Sections. Further plans will be discussed at a later date.

VII. Scoutmasters were requested to report on their meeting places, dates, and hours. Also information on the number of boys, their addresses, hometown, etc. with their registration blanks. It was announced that individual files will be kept on all scouts.

VIII. It was decided that boys' problems will be studied at a later meeting with Jimmy Yamanaka, Chairman of Leadership Training.

IX. As there was no further business the meeting was declared adjourned, 9:30 P. M.

I. The regular District Scouters meeting was called to order by Executive Secretary Akihi Yoshimura, 7:30 P. M. The minutes of the previous meeting was read and approved.

Members present were Jack Noda, George Muramoto, Ed Tokunaga, Torazo Ogata, Roy Uragami, Keikichi Fukuyama, and Aki Yoshimura. Mr. H. E. Turk, Associate Community Service Officer and Alex Mitsunaga, new Cubmaster, were introduced to the group.

II. Carrying out the principles of the Scout Motto "Be Prepared", the group decided that the kindling wood ("good turn" discussed at a previous meeting) should be bundled or stacked at the Project farms for future use during the colder weather yet to come. Ed Tokunaga and Aki Yoshimura will make arrangements for the boys to leave the Center to perform this deed.

III. Mr. Turk reported to the group regarding the lunches and other provisions for the Scout hikes. Permits and lunches would be made available but extra provisions such as "steak" and potatoes would require more study and arrangement.

IV. Announcements were made regarding the registration of Troops, and further information for the benefit of the leaders was discussed. It was announced that Troop 39 under George Fujita would be disbanded and the membership of said troop absorbed by Troops 20 and 170. Ed Tokunaga reported that Kan Domoto had been added to his Committee on Organization and Extension.

V. Mr. Uragami gave an interesting and detailed report on the Coordinating Council meetings dealing with Boys Problems. Mr. Uragami was appointed by the body to represent the Scouting group in an official capacity at future meetings of the Coordinating Council.

VI. The group approved the plan of troop 162 to actively publish the Scout newspapers. All editions would be subject to censorship by the Headquarters. The District will sponsor the publication.



VII. The general outline of the disbursal of troops and its organization was given. Aki Yoshimura is to contact the school principals for voluntary work as Merit Badge Counsellors.

VIII. The long delayed problem of awards for the Merced winners of the Scout-O-Rama was given thought and consideration with the result that contributions were made by the Scouters namely Jack Noda, Alex Mitsunaga, Aki Yoshimura, Ed Tokunaga, and George Muramoto for the purchase of prizes. Prizes to troops will be decided at a later date.

IX. The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 P. M.

I. The regular District Committee and Scouters meeting was called to order by Executive Secretary Akiji Yoshimura, at 7:45 P. M. The minutes of the previous meeting was read and approved. Members present were Dr. Terami, George Harumoto, Roy Uragami, Keikichi Fukuyama, Tom Sasaki, Joe Shiro, Ed Tokunaga, George Tashiro, Toraso Ogata, and Akiji Yoshimura.

II. A contribution was received from Ed Tokunaga to the amount of \$1.00 for the purchase of prizes for the Merced Scout-O-Rama winners. Ed Tokunaga reported on the kindling wood "good deed" of Sunday, December 6, 1943. Troops 179 and 180 are scheduled to continue the activity Sunday, December 13, 1943. It was announced that Pack 177C and Pack 162C will leave the Center on Saturday, December 13, 1943 to haul kindling wood and lumber from the pile at Granada. Ernie Yoshida and Toraso Ogata to be in charge.

III. A report submitted by Tom Sasaki of the Scout Newspaper was read to the group. In substance: the paper will be called the "Reveille"; Katsumi Arimoto and Jack Ito will serve as co-editors, and Tom Sasaki named Director; members of the Staff will be composed of Scouts from 162; Scoutmasters were requested to appoint one scout, preferably someone with experience in journalism to serve as reporter on the Staff; paper to be published twice a month, with the first edition before Christmas. The proposed 2100 copies for the first issue, one to each apartment in the Center, was approved for publicity purposes, if paper could be made available. Mr. Turk cautioned the group on the use of paper. Later editions will be distributed only to registered Scouts and Scouters of the Center. Aki Yoshimura will check with the mimeograph office for supplies of paper.

IV. Registration of Troops 180, 161, 162, and 179 were reported near completion. Mr. Turk suggested that the Scouting group take advantage of the reservations of Terry Hall on Monday nights by the Recreation Department. Such activities as Courts of Honor and parties could be easily staged there.

V. It was decided that a Christmas party be held for the



Scouts of the Center. The date, 22nd (subject to change) was chosen and further plans will be made by the committees appointed by the Chair.

A report on the meeting place of each troop was made, and George Marumoto made an open invitation for all Scouters to visit his den.
- VI. A discussion was held on the article written in "Reveille" about the Recreation Department. Koe Yoshida suggested that a public apology be made to the Rec. Department. George Tashiro is to look further into the matter and make a report at the next meeting.
- VII. Troops or packs wishing to go to Lamar to see a show were discouraged because of the following reasons:



1. The administration has discouraged groups to go to Lamar.
2. Motion Pictures will be shown in camp next month.
3. There is difficulty in obtaining transportation.

I. The regular meeting of the District Scouters was called to order by Acting Chairman Ed Tokunaga at IOE Recreation Hall, 7:35 P. M., January 21, 1943. The following were present: Dr. T. Terami, Roy Eiji Uragami, Keikichi Fukuyama, Torazo F. Ogata, Ed Tokunaga, Jim Miyano, Kan Domoto, George Marumoto, Alex Mitsunaga, Tom Matsuura, Tom Sasaki, Fred Kishi, Joe Sakakura, Stanley Marumoto, Mas Watanabe, Taro Fuchigami, and Mr. Fuchigami.

II. The committee for the report on appropriation from the W. R. A., Mr. Uragami, Jack Noda, George Tashiro, and Kan Domoto, reported that the meeting with Mr. Johnson was held on Monday, January 18, 1943 at 10:00 A. M. They were asked to have the budget ready to present before committee the next day. Mr. Johnson promised to do everything in his power to help the Scouts. The appropriation budget was read and discussed.

III. Dr. Terami stated that Mr. Johnson commented on the unfavorable appearance of the Den, and suggested that it have a more scout-like appearance. He would like the scouters to meet and talk with him about scout activities more often.

IV. Troops must bring minutes and report weekly to headquarters. Thursday night is the deadline. George Tashiro reported through Ed Tokunaga that all boys above 18 years must register as scouters.

V. The Court of Honor will be held on February 22, 1943. The name of scout and rank must be on the report.

VI. Jim Miyano reported that basketball activities have not developed very much, but that the scouts are all interested. Classifications for teams are:

- A - Unlimited 12-18 years
- B - Between 12-16 years
- C - Between 12-14 years

Players are eligible for one team only. Kan Domoto is to see Roy Nakata ni about borrowing four basketballs which were brought from Merced. Jim Miyano agreed to have schedule for basketball activities ready in two weeks if the troops have



their rosters ready by next week. An ALL STAR team of five planers will be chosen after the season is over.

VII. Ed Tokunaga reported that more news is needed for the Scout newspaper, "Reveille."

VIII. Kan Domoto stated that there was no location within the Center for an Amphitheater, but that there was a place outside the fence on the east side of 8K near the guard tower. A further report will be made next week on this matter.

IX. Troop Activities - Troop 179 and Cub Pack 179C met at the home of Mr. Uragami, 8K - 12B, for their meeting. Six committeemen, four officers, and two patrol leaders were present. A discussion was held on discipline, finances, procurement of troop essentials, absence of members, etc.

George Marumoto reported on the regular meeting of Troop 161 on Tuesday night, with a 100% attendance by the members. Many of them passed tests on judging, safety rules, first aid, etc.

Jim Miyano reported on Troop 160 activities. All past tenderfoot scouts have gone on to Second Class. Tom Shimazu is the new cubmaster for cub pack 160.

Tom Sasaki discussed the scout newspaper, "Reveille," and reported that equipment will be procured from home in Calif.

X. There are six registered troops and three registered cub packs in this Center

XI. The Board of Review will be held on January 28, 29, and 30 at the LOE Rec. Hall at 7:00 P. M. The Board consists of: Ed Tokunaga, George Marumoto, Bob Inouye, Jim Miyano, George Tashiro, and one from Troop 179.

XII. Merit Badge Counselors were named.

XIII. The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 P. M.

II. The letter from Chief Executive L. E. Glinkman regarding his visit here this coming Thursday, March 25, with J. E. Brittain, Field Scout Executive, and Judge Hubert Glover, President of the Rocky Mountain Council, was read to the body. A program honoring Judge Glover was planned as follows:

Program:	Knot tying contest, uniforms, singing by Cubs, yells, etc.
