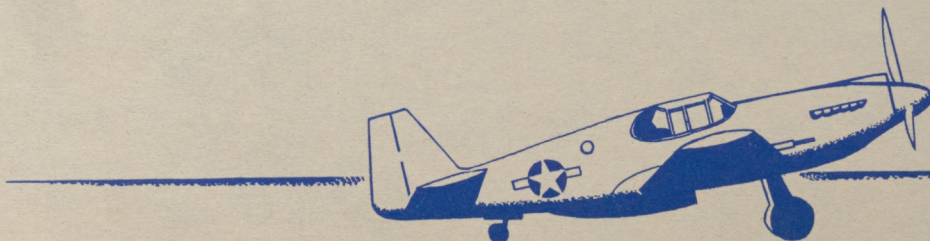
FOREWORD

Before an estimated crowd of 2,500 football fans, the Eagles juggernaut rolled over the invading Lovell Bulldogs 32-0.

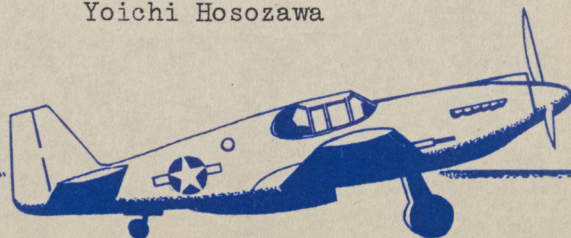

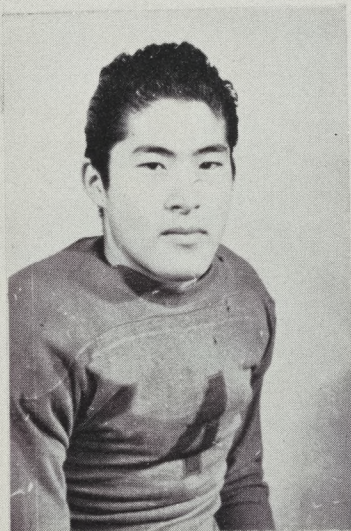


Capt. Hosozawa bats down a Worland pass. Shuzo and Poly Sumii backs up the play.



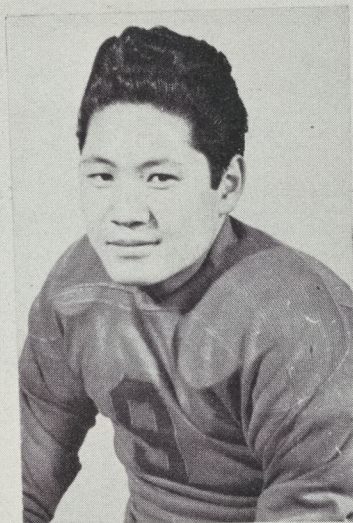

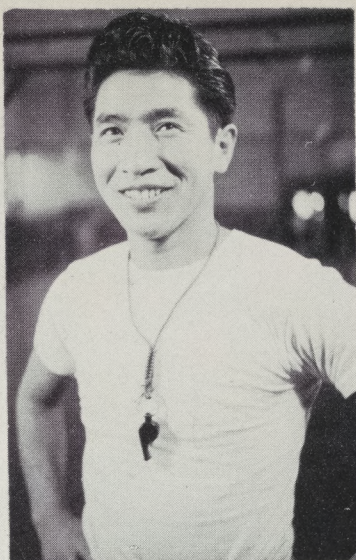


Spectacular shot of Mas Hamamoto out jumping Rawlin's Center.



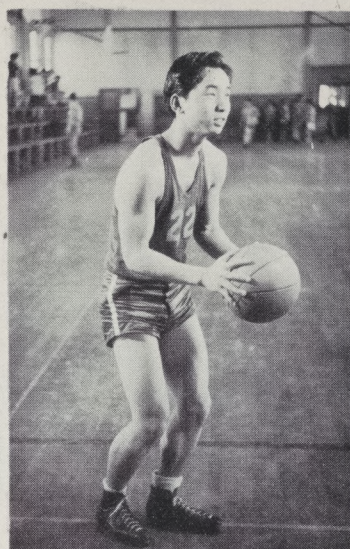

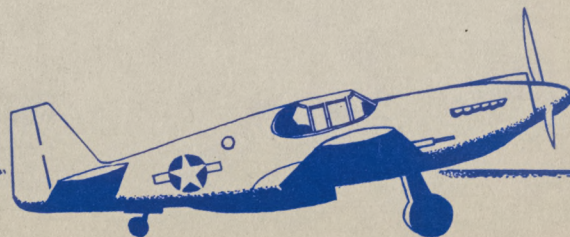
The Eagles met their first foe on Sept. 29. Playing the six-man game for the first time, the Eagles overcame the Byron team and came through with a 31-0 win.

The second encounter with the Burlington Greyhounds found the Eagles a little more accustomed to the game as they walked over the visitor 44-0. After failing to crack the strong Eagle line the Greyhounds kicked. The ball sailed to the 7-yard stripe where Yokoyama caught it and raced 93 yards for a touchdown jaunt. In the third quarter, the Eagles started where they left off with Yokoyama tossing a touchdown pass and then carrying the ball over for another touchdown. Yokoyama's run was good for 21 yards.

The Cowley Jaguars brought the Eagles down to earth in their tilt, when the visitors tied the locals, 6-6, in the first quarter. After that the Eagles tore the Jaguar line to pieces and scored in every period. Kiyo Tomikawa scored four touchdowns against the Jaguars, while proving a tower of strength on defense. The final score was 46-6.

In an Armistice day feature the Eagles rolled over the Byron Eagles 46-0. Karl Miyahara sparked the local offensive with his running. Miyahara directly contributed to five of the Eagles' seven touchdowns.

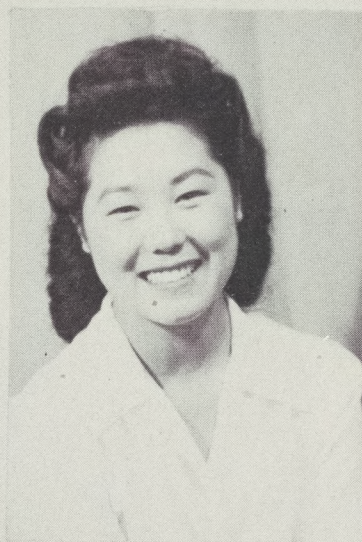
