#### I. Accomplishments During the Week:

1. Two separate orders of \$1000 each were placed with a large Denver concern for the purchase of Christmas gifts for the children of Heart Mountain in the preparation of the community Christmas Program. The funds came through Rev. Donald Toriumi, who has received them from numerous church organizations throughout the United States. The Board of Home Missions in New York City is working with all Relocation Centers with Presbyterian Church being specifically assigned to Heart Mountain.



In addition to cash received, over 2600 gifts have been sent to the children of Heart Mountain by their substantial friends in the outside world.

2. Considerable progress has been made in making a survey of need to Recreation Department giving a basis upon which plans and budgeting can be carried out.
3. Additional progress has been made in securing equipment to construct ice-skating rink and slides for sledding.
4. The showing of second week of the film "Sun Valley Serenade" was completed.
5. Boxing instruction was resumed after a slight delay.
6. Considerable progress was made on the solution of securing space for meetings for boys and girls in their activity program.

## II. Problems Remaining to be Solved:

1. Securing office partitions, etc. for the Boys and Girls activities as well as for the central recreation office.
2. Completion of ice-skating rinks and sledding, basketball courts, boxing room, etc.

## III. Outstanding Accomplishments of the Week:


1. The Fine Art exhibition by the Art Students League which included many fine outstanding pieces of work was held. The exhibition was visited by 4008 people.
2. In the Boys and Girls work, one of the toughest bunch of fellows was organized into a club and started in the direction of approved fields of activities.
3. Plans were completed for the Recreation Conference to study the recreation problems. People to be at the Conference are representatives of the Block Chairmen, Block Administrative Officers, and two special representatives from each block.

The purpose of the Conference is to disseminate the information on the accomplishments to date and to obtain suggestions from the colonists and different organizations relative to the future development on the program.



Miss Esther Breisemeister and Miss Kimi Mukaye, leadership trainers from the National Y.W.C.A. organization, arrived to spend the week to train recreation leaders of Heart Mountain. This is a similar instance to the assistance we have been given from other national organizations. Certainly, it is of considerable nature, and is appreciated to the greatest extent.



Practically all normal recreational activities were suspended during the week and all supervisor's staff worked to make the Community Christmas a success. On Christmas night, a party was held in each block at which time a Santa Claus distributed gifts and stocking of apples, nuts, etc. to each person under 19 years of age and under and one present to each family. As might be expected in a huge program, there were few instances of distribution difficulty, but this occurred within the block where Christmas gifts were distributed on another basis than that planned.

Many favorable comments have been made relative to the whole community Christmas program, as a result of the work done by the committee in charge of the program as well as by Reverend and Mrs. Toriumi and the great majority of the recreation staff. Of course, this was all made possible by the Board of Home Missions in New York City with Presbyterian Church assigned to Heart Mountain.

Inasmuch as gifts and funds are still arriving, it is impossible to give exact numbers. To date, however, over \$3000 in cash have been received and over 5000 gifts. The cash was used to purchase gifts to distribute as planned by the Christmas committee. Some difficulty was encountered in gift distribution as sufficient warehousing space for distribution was not possible. Consequently, all gifts could not be assorted and ~~be~~ delivered ~~in time~~.

ADULT DEPARTMENT

The decrease in the number of people registered and participating in this department is due to the temporary curtailment of adult activities in recreation halls while spaces for children's kindergarten schools are pushed to completion. The increase in the number of spectators can be attributed to the Kabuki (classic drama) performance given in Block 23-27 Mess Hall to a capacity crowd.

ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT

The basketball leagues have been started and progress continues to be made in this department. Two volley ball courts have been elected in Block 15.

BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB

The increase in the numbers of registered members may be attributed to Y.M.C.A. and Y.W.C.A. work being pushed. The drop in participations is due to various meetings being held relative to the registration. Boy Scouts activities brought about an increase of spectators. Salvage project has been organized and is now handled by one coordinator and several volunteer assistants. The items collected are: 419 boxes, 175 sacks, 38 boxes of mason jars, 400 pounds of grease, and 3 crates of bones. 190 boxes were repaired and 288 sold for \$43.90.

ENTERTAINMENT & SOCIAL

Registration has dropped about 50% and participations have dropped about 30%, due to the shifting around of recreation halls for kindergarten classes and pre-school programs.

Mr. T. Yoshimura played three selections on the piano at the Music Hour program before 150 music lovers. The large increase of spectators for the dance orchestra was due to the seven performances during the week, four for the grade school students and three for dances in the evening.

MAINTENANCE & SUPPLY

The shifting about of the recreation halls, moving tables and benches in and out for the W.R.A. registration, and the ten motion picture performances increased the work for this department.

TECHNICAL DEPARTMENT

26 affairs were serviced for a total of 9727 spectators and participants. Beside the 10 motion pictures shown by this department in the evening, four grade school programs were serviced.



Due to the lack of necessary equipment, the indoor recreation halls are still inactive.



Adult Department:

Program has been made in the number of people who are registered, participating, and spectators.

13 Kabuki (Classic Drama), 4 talent shows, 6 modern dramas were presented.

Three mess hall programs were put on with volunteers from the Mandolin Band assisting. The Amateur Mandolin Orchestra held 2 performances.

There is a need for more Recreation Hall space and seating facilities for this department.

Athletic Dept:

New class in First Aid was started this month for those in service training. The physical education instructors are required to pass the test. There is favorable increase in number of people registered, participating, and spectators.

Suggestions were received that vacant recreation areas in school blocks be converted into athletic fields for grade school children.

Equipment issuance has set up 2 Merry-go rounds. The installation of playground equipment has started and will be put up on vacant lots where grade schools were originally planned.

Basketball and volleyball league for men and women was formed and more volleyball and basketball courts are needed. There is a lack of seating facilities at basketball games.

There is a demand for Kendo (Fencing).

Two weightlifting instructors are taking the place of two weightlifters instructors who are leaving the center.

Two volunteers are carrying on the work of the boxing instructor who has left the center.

Entertainment and Social Dept.

The Mandolin Band, dance orchestra and Hawaiian band made three public appearances.

The Sunday Music Hour continues to draw a crowd.

The Hawaiian "Surf Riders" broadcasted over radio station KPOW at Powell, Wyoming, requesting contributions for American Red Cross.



Due to splendid performance of Hawaiian Band, they have been contracted to play over the air once a week.

The Dance Orchestra, Hawaiian Band and four entertainers performed for the church groups of Lovell.

Due to the lack of necessary equipment, the indoor recreation halls are still inactive.

#### Club Activities:

Presidents (of the Boys and Girls Clubs) council was organized. USO room was furnished and recent volunteers and soldiers mothers were honored at an afternoon tea. Next problem to be solved is to have a YMCA Lounge in this Center.

The Girls Clubs organized the older girls clubs. The Girl Leaders of the department acted as hostesses at Captain Robert Kinoshita's farewell banquet.

The policy of the Club Activities will be to encourage activities that will prepare people for resettlement stressing vocational training for members.

In-service training: Mr. Ebert spoke to the Boys and Girls club members on Civil Service Training. Miss Virgil Payne spoke on "Social Problems".

#### Technical Department:

One projector broke down and it was repaired to increase the volume, but there is a need for another machine.

Special movie was shown at the hospital for doctors, nurses, and attendants who were unable to see movies in the area due to their hours of work.

Still lack adequate and reliable transportation for the motion picture project; this has been partially solved by securing a truck from the Education Department when they are not using it in the evenings.

#### MAINTENANCE & SUPPLY DEPARTMENT:

Carpenters in the department repaired benches, chairs and put in some work at the high school.

The Maintenance crew are to act as fire wardens at movies and shows.

#### Schedule Department :

This department has been busy meeting with the Space and Coordination Committees in an effort to release more Recreation Hall space for youth activities and helping the removal of the Community Activities Headquarters to Block 16 North.

Both the number of registered pupils and participants increased over 5% of the previous week, but the number of spectators dropped completely on account of the windy week-end; sumo and intramural sports had to be cancelled completely. Softball and baseball are ready to start as soon as the fields are ready.

The Men's Quartet rendered several semi-classical numbers on the Sunday Music Hour program before an enthusiastic audience of music lovers.
