Yoshiko Uchida

Most widely known as a writer of children's literature, Yoshiko Uchida has helped bring about a greater understanding of the Japanese-American culture. Her sensitive retelling of Japanese folktales and legends has opened up a new world to adults and children alike and has helped bridge the gap between two cultures.

She received her baccalaureate degree from the University of California in absentia, for in May 1942 her family was incarcerated in an internment camp. Her two most important works, *Journey to Topaz* and *Journey Home*, document the experiences of Japanese-American families during that time. Through her, the larger reading public, as well as the Japanese-American child, can finally come to terms with the day-to-day reality of this period.

The author of more than twenty books, she already has received many awards, including the Sequoyah Children's Book Award in 1973 and the William Allen White Award in 1974. It is only fitting that the University should honor her for outstanding work in contributing to the self-esteem and self-knowledge of Japanese-Americans.

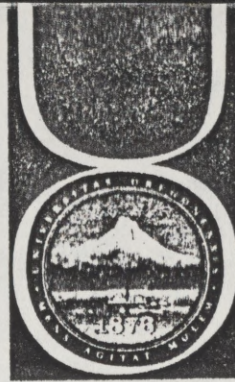

(Gate #6) and march around the south turn of the track in lanes 5 and 6. The returning Alumni, Class of 1931 and the Half Century Club will join the procession at this point. Ed Coleman will explain before you leave the Faculty Center. On the platform, President Olum will take the center aisle seat on the left of the podium (as you face the platform). Mr. Goldschmidt will take the center aisle seat on the right of the podium (as you face the platform), followed by the rest of the party in order of march. David Frank and Gwen Soderberg will begin the second row of seats (see attached chart). All will remain standing until after the singing of American the Beautiful, and then sit immediately. Each chair will have a program with the name clearly marked, to identify the proper places.

There will be five microphones on the platform: One on the podium at center stage to be used by President Olum, Mr. Goldschmidt, Mr. Harms and Dr. White. A second mike at the south end of the platform will be used by Provost Hill, Dean Hersh and Mr. Bilotta. A third mike will be on the north end of the platform for use by Vice-President Hawk. Two additional mikes will be placed between the rows of seats for use by the Academic Deans in presenting the candidates for degree conferral.

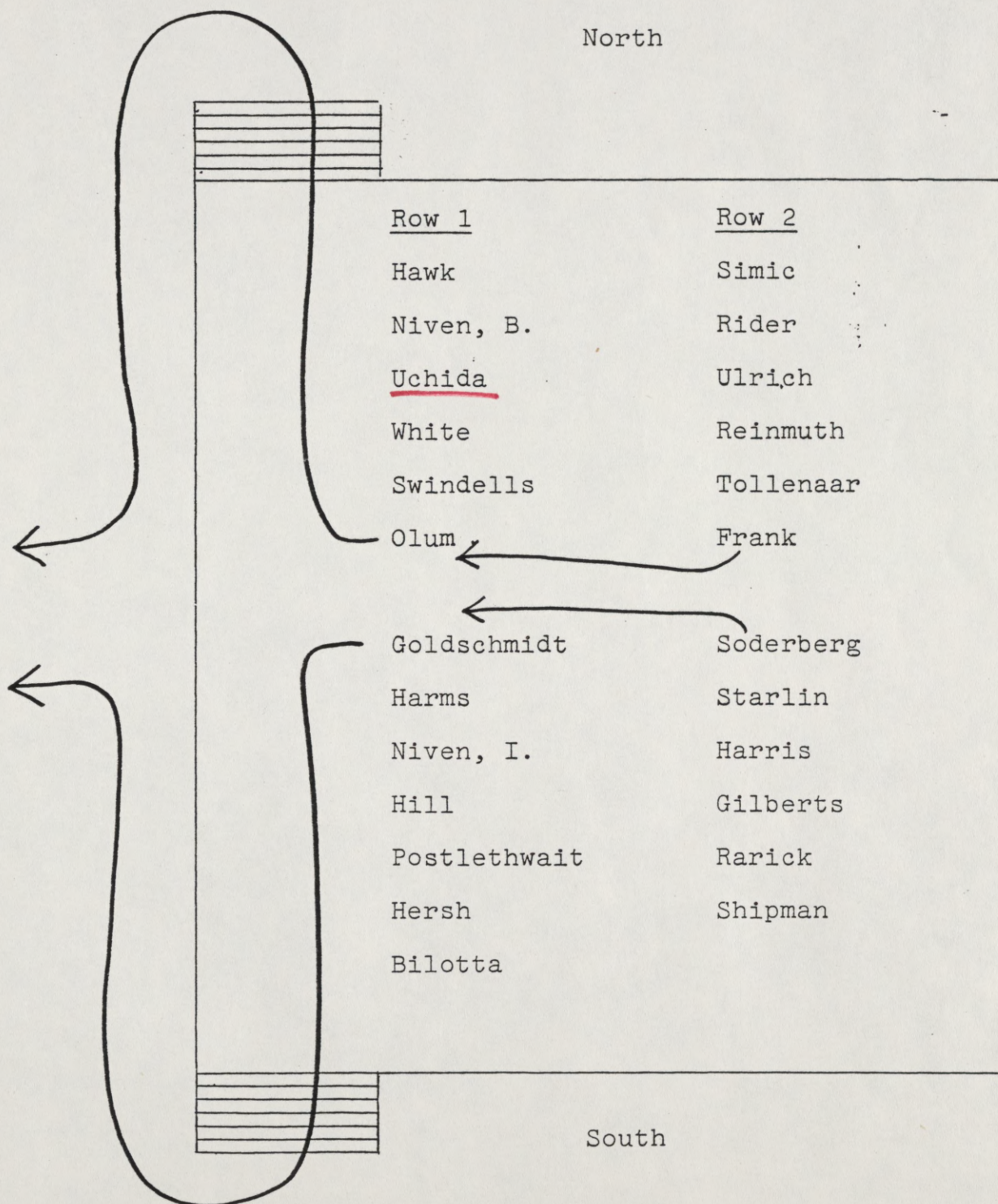

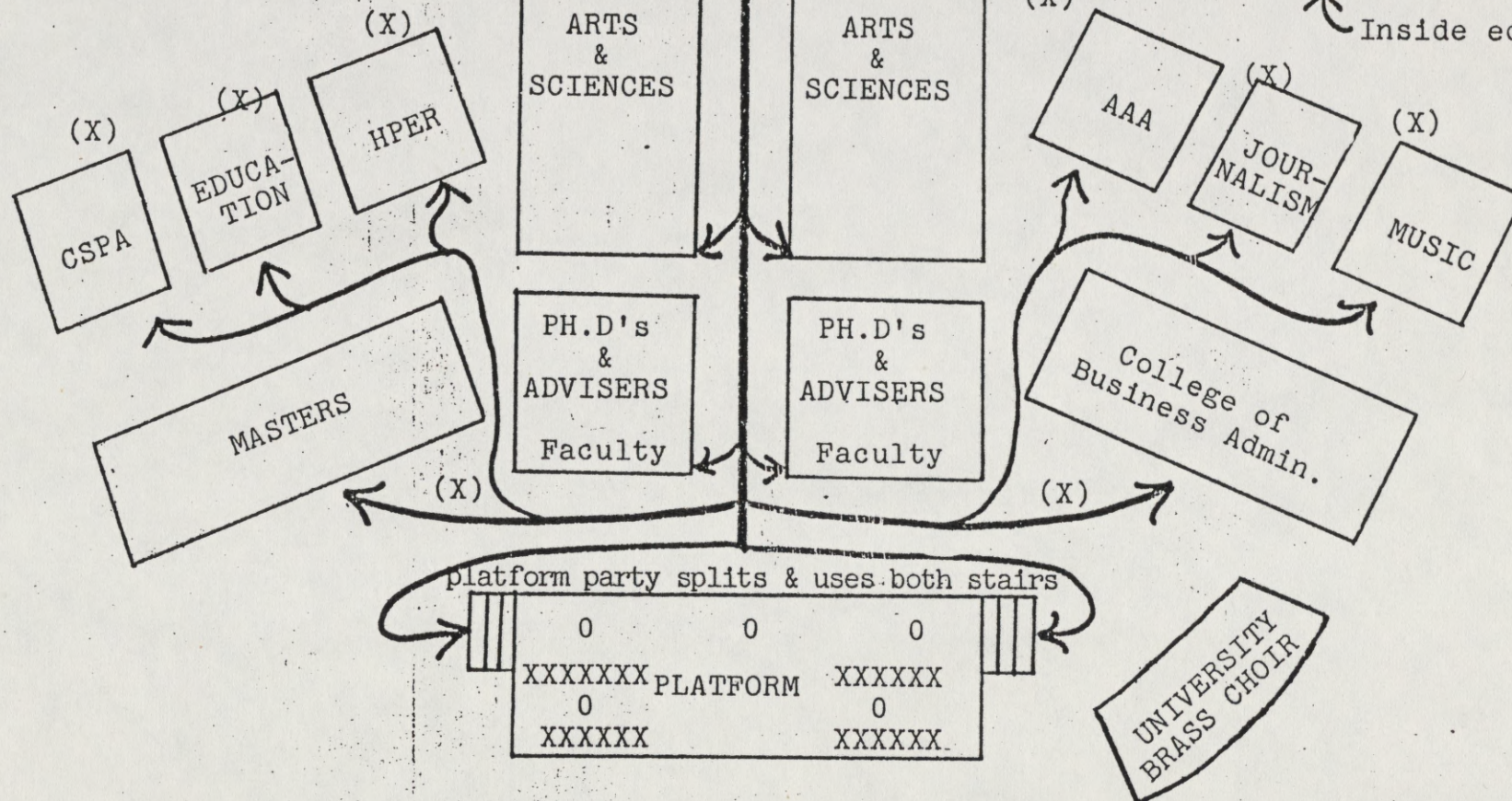

McARTHUR COURT

Public announcement will be made on all radio stations, and signs will be posted on campus if it is necessary to implement this foul weather plan.

Assemble at 1:45 p.m. in the places designated below, and follow the chart for line of march. Arts and Sciences Bachelors and Doctoral candidates will enter the main court from opposite sides at the same time, immediately after the Platform Party.

1. PLATFORM PARTY - Assemble in the Lettermen's Lounge, McArthur Court. Procession goes left to NORTHEAST inside door, up center aisle to the platform. Same platform seating as for Hayward Field.
2. FACULTY - Will assemble in corridor outside Lettermen's Lounge.
3. DOCTORAL CANDIDATES - Assemble in EAST MAIN hall of McArthur Court, facing SOUTH (accompanied by advisor with hood). Procession goes to SOUTHEAST inside door, to EAST side of EAST double section of seats on main floor, fill seats in both sections at the same time starting with Row 1, 19 seats per double row.
4. MASTERS CANDIDATES - Assemble in NORTH BALCONY hall of McArthur Court, facing EAST. Procession goes down NORTHEAST steps, falls in behind Doctors to SOUTHEAST inside door, to EAST side of EAST double section of seats. Fill seats starting with first empty row behind Doctors (18 seats per double row).
5. ARTS & SCIENCES BACHELOR CANDIDATES - Assemble in SOUTH Main Hall and SOUTH BALCONY halls of McArthur Court, facing WEST. Procession goes to SOUTHWEST inside door, to WEST side of double section of seats on main floor filling both sections at the same time starting with Row 1. (18 seats per double row).
6. PROFESSIONAL SCHOOL BACHELORS - Assemble in the EAST BALCONY hall of McArthur Court, facing SOUTH. Line up by schools. Procession goes behind Masters to EAST side of EAST double section of seats starting with first empty row behind Masters (18 seats per double row).

Recessional will include only the Platform Party.

NOTE: Arts & Sciences and General Reception will be in the Ballroom of the Erb Memorial Union if the foul weather plan is in effect.

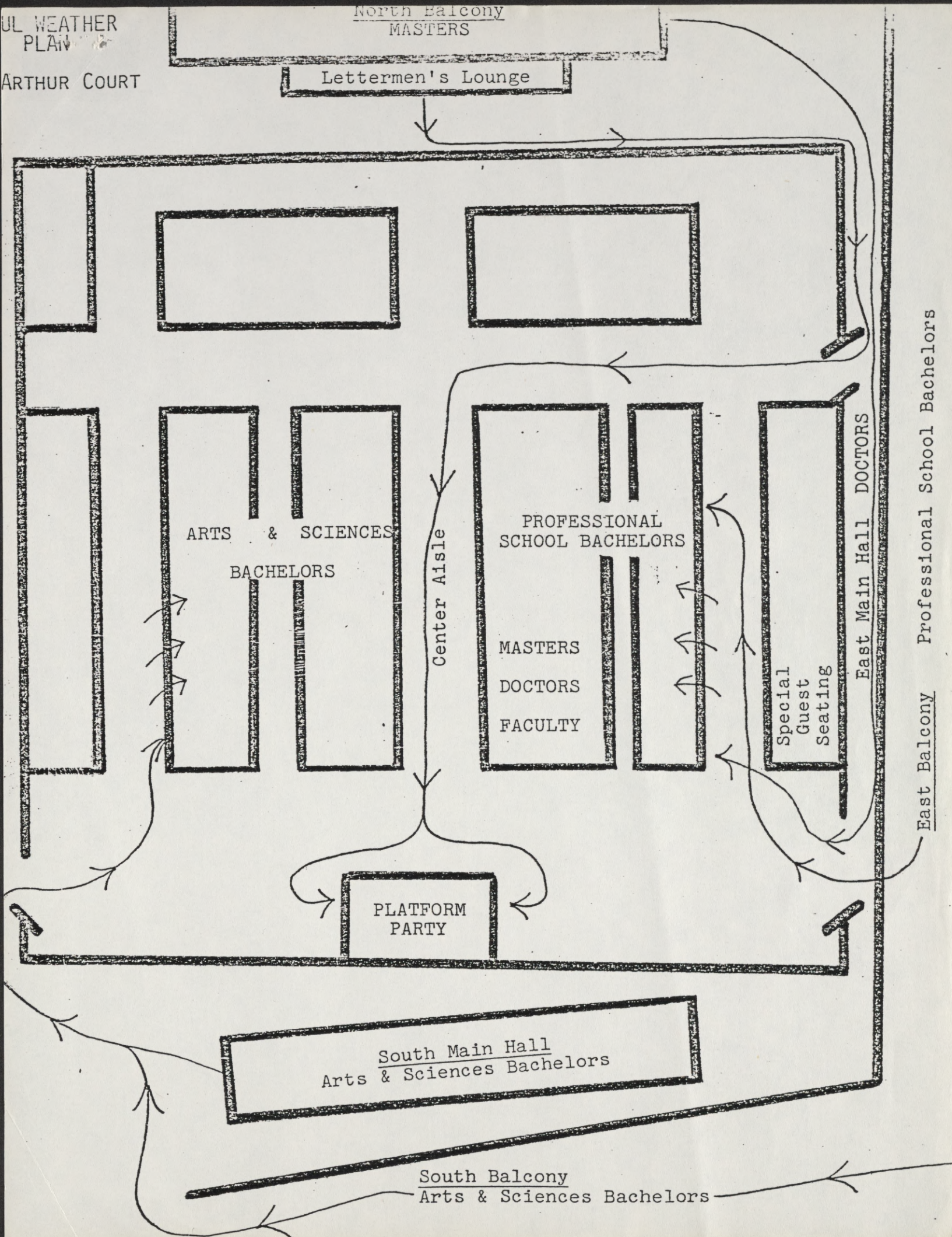

The University of Oregon opened its doors in 1876. Deady Hall, pictured on the back cover, housed the entire University in those days. Built of bricks made from clay dug out of the local hills, the building was guaranteed by its architect to last 1,000 years. The first commencement graduated five students. Today the University serves 17,000 students on its 250-acre campus. Almost 1,000 faculty members teach in its nine professional schools and 35 arts and science departments and programs.

The University seal, shown on the front cover, was created by Judge Matthew P. Deady, first president of the Board of Regents, and was approved by that body in 1878. In its center is a representation of Mt. Hood as a symbol of the state. Around its edge is the University's motto, *mens agitat molem*—mind moves the mass.





University of Oregon Class of 1931

and the Order of the Emerald

It is an honor and a pleasure to have
the Class of 1931 and the Order of
the Emerald join the Commence-
ment Procession and share in the
celebration of this happy occasion.
Alumni who had their degrees
conferred in a similar ceremony in
1931 are for the first time this year
joining new graduates in the Pro-
cession. Leading these returning
alumni are members of the Order
of the Emerald, alumni who gradu-
ated more than 50 years ago.

The history of academic dress goes back several centuries, to the chilly universities where cap, gown, and hood were needed for covering and warmth. Subsequently this has become a ceremonial costume, with certain standardized features. The hood is lined with the official colors of the degree-conferring institution; for the University of Oregon these are yellow and green. The outside trimming of the hood and the color of the tassel signify the subject in which the degree is conferred:

At the University of Oregon it is customary for master's candidates to wear their hoods in the procession. Doctoral candidates carry their hoods and are hooded during the ceremony. Baccalaureate candidates change tassels on their cap from front right to the front left as the degree is conferred. Caps are removed during the pledge song and during the commencement address if desired.

1981 Awards for Distinguished Service

Awards for Distinguished Service are made to those persons who, by their knowledge and skills, have made a significant contribution to the cultural development of Oregon or society as a whole. The awards were established in 1956. Since then, sixty-six persons of exceptional merit have been recognized with these awards.

Mary Elizabeth (Betty) Niven

A nationally recognized authority on the complex problems of providing liveable housing for all, Betty Niven has provided full-time, volunteer service to Eugene and the state of Oregon for more than twenty years. Her leadership in the area of planning has made a significant contribution to the quality of life in Oregon.

Her career as a housing expert and public servant began when she innocently led a petition drive to have a sidewalk installed in front of a retirement home. She so impressed city officials that she was asked to serve as a member of the Eugene Planning Commission. From that point on, she has significantly shaped the direction of development for both the city and the state.

Her influence has come through voluntary service with such groups as the planning commission, the Eugene Joint Housing Committee, the Eugene Community Goals Committee, the Oregon State Housing Council, and the National Mobile Home Advisory Council.

She chose to work as a volunteer because of her strong feeling that only then could she be a free agent. As such, she brought to this task formidable intellectual resources and an unequalled capacity for hard work.

William Swindells

William Swindells founded the Oregon Community Foundation in 1973. Since then, the foundation has grown from a tiny charitable organization into a major Oregon benefactor. The list of recipients of foundation grants reaches across Oregon's cultural, educational, and scientific landscape and includes the Oregon Symphony, Reed College and other institutions of higher education in the state, the American Cancer Society, the Eugene Hearing and Speech Center, Church of Christ of Scio, Campfire Girls of Salem, Congregation of Beth Israel, and the Umatilla County Library. Due largely to the personal commitment of Mr. Swindells, the Oregon Community Foundation now ranks nineteenth in size among leading community foundations in the United States, although it is at least 50 years younger than most.

William Swindells started in the lumber business as a choker setter with a logging crew. He became president of Willamette Industries in 1951 and led that company as it grew into a major manufacturer of forest products.

Educated at the University of Oregon and Lehigh University, William Swindells continues to serve as a trustee of Lewis and Clark College and the Oregon Graduate Center. With his wife Elizabeth, a University of Oregon alumna, he has given an enormous amount of his time and talent to the cultural, economic, and social betterment of Oregon.

Yoshiko Uchida

Most widely known as a writer of children's literature, Yoshiko Uchida has helped bring about a greater understanding of the Japanese-American culture. Her sensitive retelling of Japanese folk-tales and legends has opened up a new world to adults and children alike and has helped bridge the gap between two cultures.

She received her baccalaureate degree from the University of California in absentia, for in May 1942 her family was incarcerated in an internment camp. Her two most important works, *Journey to Topaz* and *Journey Home*, document the experiences of Japanese-American families during that time. Through her, the larger reading public, as well as the Japanese-American child, can finally come to terms with the day-to-day reality of this period.

The author of more than twenty books, she has already received many awards, including the Sequoyah Children's Book Award in 1973 and the William Allen White Award in 1974. It is only fitting that the University should honor her for outstanding work in contributing to the self-esteem and self-knowledge of Japanese-Americans.

1981 Ersted Awards for Distinguished Teaching

These awards were established through a generous gift to the University from Mr. A. J. Ersted. The intent of the award is to recognize excellence in teaching, and it is normally given to younger faculty members who have demonstrated exceptional abilities to induce students to reason and not merely to memorize. Today's ceremony marks the twenty-fourth anniversary of this special award.

John Postlethwait

A highly skilled researcher in developmental genetics, John Postlethwait is an associate professor of biology at the University. He has devoted himself to both the manner and the content of his teaching. He is director of a program that trains doctoral students in genetics research methods, and he teaches large lower-division classes to nonmajors as well as majors. He also has taken extraordinary measures to learn the names of all the students in his classes, including those in large lecture sections, and brings to his work an enthusiasm and sense of excitement that is contagious.

Richard Stevenson

Richard Stevenson, associate professor of English and a specialist in Victorian literature, is the founder and chair of the English department honors program. Quiet and self-effacing, he skillfully presents lectures that are well-supported and engrossing, and discussions that are lively and subtly directed. He guides but does not push his students, and he is sincerely interested in their ideas. He is generous with his time and advice. An inspiring teacher, he respects both the students he works with and the literature he presents.

David Frank

His student evaluations are consistently high, and his students' performance in the competitive arena of debate is a testimony to his success as an instructor.

Gwen Soderberg, a graduate teaching fellow in chemistry, shows genuine concern for her students. She is concerned that they not only understand all the calculations and processes, but also why the processes work the way they do. She never lets anyone leave her class confused. If students don't come to her, she will read the frustration on their faces and go to them. Her enthusiasm is inspiring, and her fondness, concern, and respect for her students enables them to develop the self-confidence they need to succeed.

1981 Charles E. Johnson Memorial Award

This award, inaugurated at the 1980 spring commencement, is presented in the memory of Charles E. Johnson, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences from 1963 to 1968 and acting president of the University of Oregon from July of 1968 to June of 1969. In honor of this great leader and educator, the University of Oregon Assembly authorized the establishment of the Charles E. Johnson Memorial Award. It is presented annually to a member of the academic staff of the University of Oregon for exceptional service to the University and its community. The achievements of the award recipient exemplify the principles affirmed by Charles E. Johnson during his academic career.

Ivan Niven

A professor of mathematics at the University since 1947, Ivan Niven has established a distinguished record of scholarship. His teaching has been of the highest quality, and he has a reputation for the effective use of a delightful sense of humor in the classroom.

He also has been one of the most unselfish of faculty members in his work in academic governance. He has served on the Faculty Advisory Council under four presidents and at present chairs that council. In addition to being a frequent member of the University senate, he has served on the dean's advisory committee, the library committee, and on search committees for the University president, the graduate school dean, the dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, and the dean of the College of Business Administration. He also served as University marshal during the Centennial celebration in 1976.

His sensitivity and good judgment often have helped resolve difficult academic and governance problems, to the benefit of the University.

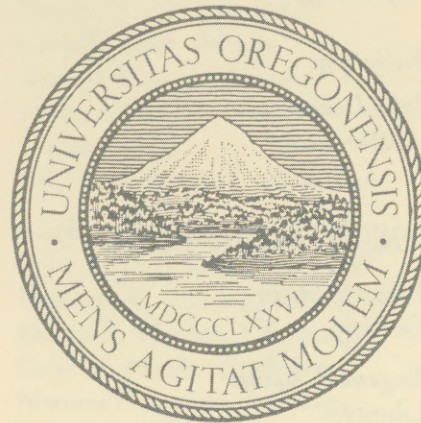

Then upstairs to put on academic robes. Some congestion & haste, to go downstairs and line up for professional, led by Ed Coleman.

Passed groups of graduates, lined up in cap and gown, waiting to join the procession, clapping, cheering... air of great exuberance. Music begins, and we march into the huge outdoor field, everyone cheering and clapping; I spot Yamasakis in the grandstand... We proceed to center platform, stand in place until all march in and America the beautiful is played. Especially moving, were the old grads, who stood on both sides of the track as we moved thru them.

Awards were presented early, and VP Hawks, a very friendly soul, let me be first, so I would choose not to speak. My name is read, I stand while he reads the citation, which is then handed to me by Pres. Olum, amid much applause. A great thrill, and a moving exhilarating experience. The 2nd award winner also doesn't speak, but Betty Niven does. Her husband, a lovely gracious man, Ivan is a mathematician, who knows S. well and says they're trying to get him to retire there. Pres. Olum is also a math., but doesn't say much. *3000 in graduating class! 15,000 enrolled in U of O.*

~~There~~ Degrees are all conferred; much cheering and shouting; and one of the doctorate candidates, an Iranian man, comes to congratulate me, and later asks to have picture taken with me. I can't remember what he told me his field was - I thot something like Iranian politics! Member he felt I was also one of the downtrodden!

The recession breaks up, as everyone leaves at once, so I meet the Sammetts, Kemps and Yamasakis at the grandstand, we take lots of pictures and then have some punch at one of the outdoor receptions & part. I took Sammetts to dinner at The North Bank, not too far from our motel; a beautiful restaurant on the bank of a river, lots of greenery, excellent food.

A perfect day! Wore gray wool suit, thinking it would be cold, but it didn't rain, and it turned out to be a sunny fine day.

6/15: We're so lucky; a cloudless blue sky and sun for our trip to the coast. We bkfst at 7:30, goto the Library at 9:00, Ed gives us a tour. The spec. collections are kept in cardboard cartons on shelves in a locked area; I was surprised, my papers and books are all kept in similar fashion, not accessible to anyone except re-

searchers; 2 large brown cartons, 3 small gray cartons - mat'l is put in as it comes in. Ed had a nice display of some of my books and materials "Journey to Topaz" and "Journey Home" in a case in the hallway. Case of Ken Kesey's mss. displayed in main reading room. We meet head librarian, visit Elaine's office, then leave for coast.

Beautiful green drive to Florence; have wonderful chowder, salad and bread at "Mo's" on the river; drive along coast to Yachats, past dunes, and back to Reedsport, all beautiful country, then back to Eugene. No time to stop at Mart's; stop for sandwich and tea at the Village Green Motel in Cottage Grove; Home about 8:30 p.m.

Wore black wool slacks, and shirt, but was too warm! No need for raincoat!

6/16: Gray and sprinkling! only time I wore raincoat to bkfst.

Checked out after bkfst with G/L at 8:00, Elaine and Ed picked me up at 9:30; Took UAL509; Lve 11:00 A.M. (Seat 10F was good window seat) - Landed at 12:30p.m. Half hr wait for airport limo, then get taken all the way to Oakland Airport, as other passenger has to catch a plane. Rather moody disgruntled driver. He said airport limo going broke; bought out by airport connection.

None at 2:30 P!

Next time take Airport Conn. at Durant!

Took up gray summer suit/blk blouse and never wore. Too cool! Traveled and wore mostly, gray blazer and skirt; red print blousd.

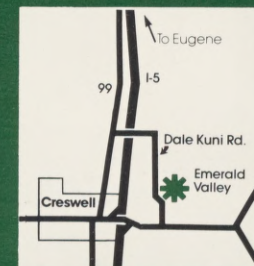

LAVA BUTTE GEOLOGICAL AREA is 10 mi. s. of Bend on US 97. Lava Butte, a cinder cone 500 feet high, is one of many volcanoes which hurled ashes and cinders over fields to the north and west. This flow, which dammed the ancient Deschutes River, occurred about 6,000 years ago. A surfaced road, open May 30-Oct. 31, spirals to the top, where an observation building contains displays.

Lava Lands Visitor Center, at the base of Lava Butte, offers interpretive dioramas, trails, displays and information. Open daily 8:30-6, May 1-Sept. 30; Wed.-Sun. 1:30-4, rest of year. Closed Dec. Phone (503) 382-5668.

LAVA CAST FOREST GEOLOGICAL AREA is 13 mi. s. of Bend on US 97, then 9 mi. e. on forest road 195. Here, along a self-guiding nature trail, are the molds of many pine trees which were engulfed by slow-moving lava.

METOLIUS RIVER RECREATION AREA, about 20 mi. n. of Sisters off US 20 and 126, is a region of lush mountain meadows and ponderosa pines. The Metolius River, which flows from a large spring at the base of Black Butte, is popular for fly fishing.

NEWBERRY CRATER is 24 mi. s. of Bend and about 13 paved mi. e. of US 97 on Paulina Lake Rd. The crater is divided into two parts, separated by cinder cones and a very large obsidian flow. Paulina Lake and East Lake, in the two portions, are popular areas for fishing.

ESTACADA (B-3) pop. 1,700

North Fork Fish Ladder Viewing Gallery, 5 miles east of Estacada, permits visitors to watch salmon and steelhead as they swim up the ladder to the spawning ground.

EUGENE (D-2) pop. 97,600, alt. 422'

Lumber and wood products are the main industries here; the region accounts for much of the Nation's softwood plywood production. The McKenzie River white water area and several other recreational areas are nearby. *Also see Industrial Tours, page 31.*

BUTLER MUSEUM OF AMERICAN INDIAN ART, 1155 W. 1st St., houses various art forms of the North American tribes. Guided tours. Tues.-Sat. 10-5; closed holidays. The admission charge for adults is \$1.50, children ages 12-18, 75c, children under 12, 25c.

LANE COUNTY MUSEUM, 740 W. 13th Ave., displays 18th-century pioneer furnishings, cookware and tools in period settings. Mon.-Thurs. 9-5, Sat.-Sun. 1-5. Free.

MAUDE I. KERNS ART CENTER, 1910 E. 15th Ave., adjacent to the University of Oregon campus, is an active workshop. Painting, printmaking, ceramics, jewelry and other crafts are featured. Daily 11-5. Free.

MUSEUM OF ART, on the University of Oregon campus, includes oriental art as well as contemporary Pacific Northwest, American and European art. Tues.-Sun. noon-5, late Sept. to mid-Aug. Free.

MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY is on the university campus. Among the museum's exhibits are fluorescent minerals, Northwest Coast Indian masks and basketry, prehistoric artifacts from eastern Oregon, a series on volcanism and Oregon fossil mammals. Mon.-Fri. 10-3. Free.

FLORENCE (D-1) pop. 3,100, alt. 11'

Between Florence and the ocean lies an extensive area of sand dunes which sometimes reach a height of 500 feet. Set amidst the sand dunes are several fresh-water lakes, which constitute Honeyman State Park, 3 miles south. Harbor Vista County Park has a view structure overlooking the Siuslaw River where the river empties into the ocean. Situated on the river is Old Town Florence, a collection of antique, junk and art shops and restaurants.

Darlingtonia Botanical Wayside, 6 miles north on US 101, is a sphagnum bog noted for cobra lilies; self-guiding walkways. Heceta Lighthouse, 12 miles north, contains Oregon's most powerful beacon.

SEA LION CAVES are 11 mi. n. on US 101. It is the only year-round home for wild sea lions on the mainland. Whether on the rocks outside or inside the cave, these marine mammals can be easily observed in their natural surroundings. An elevator takes visitors down to the 1,500-foot-long cavern. Open daily, daylight hours. Closed Dec. 25. Adults \$3, ages 6-12, \$1.75.

FREMONT NATIONAL FOREST

Fremont National Forest, 1,198,308 acres, is in south-central Oregon on the east side of the Cascade Mountains. Its attractions include a portion of the Abert geologic fault, a large herd of mule deer and the Gearhart Mountain Wilderness. Hunting for deer and waterfowl is permitted in season. Skiing is available at the Warner Canyon Ski area. *See Recreation Chart and the appropriate CampBook.*

GOLD BEACH (F-1) pop. 1,700, alt. 71'

CAPE SEBASTIAN STATE PARK, 7 mi. s., includes a group of park units, covering 1,104 acres of open and forested land. Cape Sebastian is a precipitous headland rising 700 feet above tide. Excellent view; wildflowers; hiking trails.

ROGUE RIVER BOAT TRIPS explore the scenic "white water" region of the Rogue River and

★ HELLS CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA (B-7)

This 662,000-acre national recreation area is in the Wallawa-Whitman National Forest in northern Oregon and western Idaho. The periphery of the recreation area is reached via I-80, US 95 and SR 82 and 86 in Oregon. Hells Canyon, the deepest and most rugged canyon in North America, curbs the waters of the Snake River, which consist of a series of swift white water rapids alternating with deep pools for about 70 miles.

Spring Commencement attracts 10,000 to campus

The time has come for Americans to go back to the "original premises and the original promises" of this country, former Secretary of Transportation Neil Goldschmidt '63 told some 10,000 people at the UO's 104th spring Commencement, June 14.

Of the 3,043 students who completed requirements for baccalaureate, master's, doctoral, and law degrees during the past three terms, some 1,600 were present to receive their degrees during Commencement.

Goldschmidt, who was student body president while at the UO and later served as mayor of Portland, described some of the accomplishments of his generation, including the securing of voting rights for Blacks, cures for many diseases, and successful space flights.

"It is your turn, now, to look at yourself, at your country, your state; your turn to make a choice—set a direction, describe a vision or set of values that you would have guide our country through the last decades of this century and into the next," he told the graduates.

Goldschmidt said today's problems are "not simply a matter of partisan politics, a choice between Democrats and Republicans. There are sins and stupidities enough for both sides to share." He said Democrats all too often "just slapped another program patch on an old bald tire of party programs

—and avoided having to ask the hard questions: Does this old tire need replacing? Are we even driving in the right direction?"

The choice, Goldschmidt maintained, is between asking the hard questions and "abandoning our political process to special interests and single-minded politics. In a big and complicated world, are we really ready to buy the pre-packaged answers, the simple nostalgic tunes we wish were true because they offer us an easy way out?"

Goldschmidt, now vice president for international marketing for Nike International, stressed that it is time for the country to return to fundamentals, the most basic of which is the opportunity for work. "We are in danger, serious danger, of allowing our commitment to work to lapse, or letting the flame of opportunity for all to flicker and die."

This danger comes from inflation and from the nation's loss of its competitive edge in the new global economy, a loss Goldschmidt sees being furthered by the present administration's policies, foremost of which he sees as "taking a misguided shortcut to strength, wasting our country's wealth on mindless military hardware."

Goldschmidt called on the graduates to recommit themselves to a strong and humane vision of America, to an ethic of hard work, and to the fundamental national purposes that have guided America for the past 200 years.

UO Distinguished Service Awards go to Niven, Swindells, Uchida

The University's Distinguished Service Awards were presented during June Commencement ceremonies to Betty Niven, Eugene, for her 20 years of volunteer service on behalf of adequate housing for Oregonians; William Swindells Sr., Portland, for his work on behalf of the Oregon Community Foundation; and Yoshiko Uchida, Berkeley, California, for her books for children, especially those which tell the story of the Japanese-American families that were moved from their homes during World War II.

The awards, established in 1956, are presented each year to "individuals who, by their knowledge and skill, have made a significant contribution to the cultural development of Oregon or society as a whole."

Niven was appointed in 1971 as the first chair of the Oregon State Housing Council by Governor Atiyeh. She also has served as a volunteer lobbyist at the Oregon Legislature on behalf of housing, and currently is at work drafting and supporting legislation concerning condominiums and planned communities. Previously she worked on legislation affecting lower-income households, conservation of existing housing, and

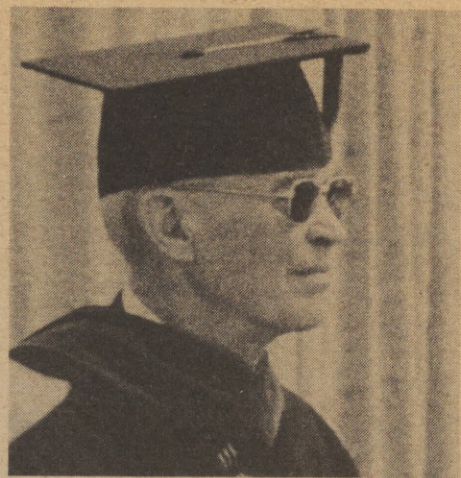
protection for mobile-home owners.

Named Eugene's First Citizen in 1973, Niven began her volunteer career when she set out to get a sidewalk completed in front of a retirement home. As a result of her efforts, she was asked to serve on the Eugene City Planning Commission. She continued in that role from 1960 to 1974, serving as both president and vice president. She currently is a member of the National Public Policy Committee of the Community Associations Institute, which works to improve home-owners associations in planned

English, biology professors receive teaching awards

During Commencement, John Postlethwait, a geneticist, and Richard Stevenson, an English professor, were given the UO's 1981 Ersted Awards for Distinguished Teaching.

The Ersted Awards are given annually to encourage and reward exceptional teaching. Winners receive a \$1,000 cash prize made available from a trust fund established by the late A. J. Ersted of Atherton, California.

A total of 38 Ersted Awards have been made between 1957 and 1980, and 32 of those individuals are still teaching at the University. Ersted wanted the awards made to relatively young faculty members who have demonstrated ability to encourage students to reason rather than to memorize.

Postlethwait, 36, is currently conducting a five-year program to train UO doctoral students in genetics, funded by the U.S. Public Health Service. The program puts students side by side in the laboratory with biology and chemistry professors who are doing important basic research on how

genes function in normal cells. Their work is expected to provide new understandings of genetic problems such as cancer and birth defects.

According to the selection committee, Postlethwait "teaches with enthusiasm and a sense of excitement, and helps personalize education in a large university."

Stevenson, 42, is a specialist in Victorian literature, English fiction from the 16th to the 20th centuries, and the role of the heroine in English fiction. Since 1972, he has chaired the English department's honors program.

He is respected for attracting the best students to his classes. His teaching style includes a balance of lecture and discussion, and he grades all of his students' papers and essay examinations himself.

Postlethwait is the second biology professor to be awarded an Ersted; Stevenson is the seventh English professor to be so recognized.

Almost 150 alumni returned to campus the weekend of June 13-14, some of them after an absence of a half a century. Swindells is retired after many years of service as the chief executive officer of Wilamette Industries, Inc., of Portland. He has been the driving force behind the growth of the Oregon Community Foundation, which has assets of \$13 million and distributes nearly \$1 million annually to cultural, educational, medical, and social service organizations in Oregon.

Established in 1973 on a shoestring, the foundation has grown quickly, surpassing the size and assets of many community foundations established 50 years earlier. Swindells's commitment of time and talent has been credited as a major factor in that growth. He served two terms on the foundation's board and as foundation president.

Swindells has been a trustee of Lewis and Clark College, the Oregon Graduate Center, and the Neurological Science Foundation. He is a former director of the Southern Pacific Co., First National Bank of Oregon, Standard Insurance Co., the Western Wood Products Association, and the National Forest Products Association.

The author of more than 20 books, Yoshiko Uchida has been credited with helping to bring about a greater understanding of the Japanese-American culture. Two of her most important books, *Journey to Topaz* and *Journey Home*, document the experiences of Japanese-American families who were sent to internment camps during World War II.

She received her diploma from the University of California at Berkeley in absentia because in May 1942 her family was sent

first to a race track in California and then to a relocation center in Topaz, Utah, for incarceration. A cum laude graduate in English, philosophy, and history, she was released from the center in June 1942 when she was awarded a graduate fellowship from Smith College, where she earned her master's degree in elementary education.

She taught for several years and then worked for the Institute of Pacific Relations and the United Student Christian Council, both in New York City, before beginning her writing career.

Many of her books for children have won awards, including the Sequoyah Children's Book Award and the William Allen White Award. Her next book, *A Jar of Dreams*, will be published in September. Her manuscripts have been placed in the UO Library's Special Collections.

Students help with UO fund drive

Niven receives Johnson Award

A UO mathematics professor long active in campus governance and well known for his teaching and research about the fundamental properties of numbers is the 1981 recipient of the University's Charles E. Johnson Memorial Award.

Ivan Niven, who currently chairs the Faculty Advisory Council, received the honor during spring Commencement.

The award, in memory of Johnson, who was UO acting president in the late 1960s, honors a faculty member who "by action and word as teacher, as scholar, and as citizen of the academic community has, over a period of years, exemplified commitment to the principles affirmed by the life and career of Charles E. Johnson."

Niven, a member of the UO faculty since 1947, holds his doctorate from the University of Chicago.

He is a long-time member of the American Association of University Professors and, from 1973-78, served on the Oregon State Employees Association statewide retirement committee. Since 1980, he has been a member of the Association of Oregon Faculties retirement committee.

Niven is the author of more than 60 articles and six books.

A cum laude graduate in English, philosophy and history, she was released from the center in June 1943 when she was awarded a graduate fellowship from Smith College, Northhampton, Mass., where she earned her master's degree in elementary education.

She taught for several years and then worked for the Institute of Pacific Relations and the United Student Christian Council, both in New York City. In 1952, she received a two-year Ford Foundation Foreign Area Research Fellowship to Japan. About the same time, she began her career as a free-lance writer.

Her first two books, "The Dancing Kettle" and "The Magic Listening Cap," are collections of Japanese folk tales. During her Ford Foundation fellowship in Japan and on many later trips, she has researched Japanese folk arts and crafts. The major characters in several of her books are Japanese potters.

Many of her books for children have won awards including the Sequoyah Children's Book Award and the William Allen White Award. Her next book, "A Jar of Dreams," will be published in September.

Her manuscripts will be placed in the University of Oregon Library's Special Collections.

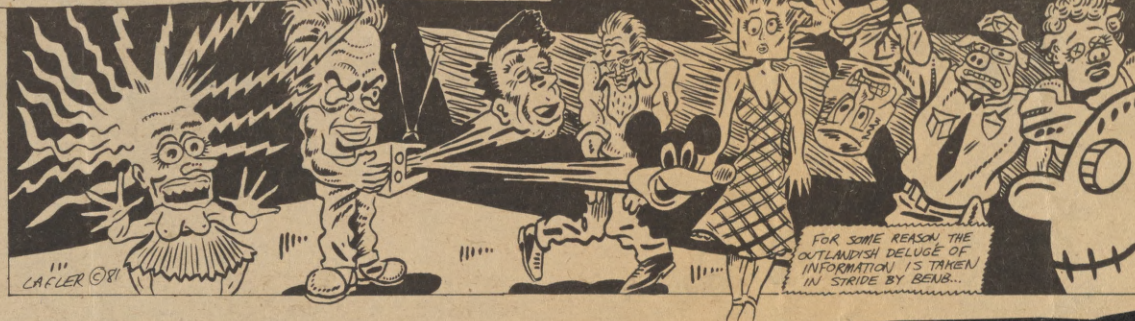

EPUD loses bid to p

SALEM — As round one of a legislative battle with the Emerald People's Utility District enters its second week, it appears that Pacific Power and Light already has the edge.

By a vote of 36 to 21, the House approved legislation Monday barring EPUD from condemning and buying portions of power generating dams owned by PP&L on the North Umpqua near Roseburg.

The vote on HB-3173 is likely to be reconsidered today, but there's little reason to expect a change in the result. The first vote on the bill occurred Friday, and PP&L's margin of victory increased by two in the Monday tally.

Lawmakers like Rep. Bill Bradbury, D-Coos County, charged that the bill is intended to cripple the fledgling EPUD. In November, district voters approved bond sales totaling \$72 million to allow the district to buy PP&L distribution lines and, unless blocked by a court challenge, to acquire some of the power supply.

According to Bradbury, the Constitution allows public utility condemn and buy non-thermal projects that are privately owned. "the electricity generated by the free falling water will serve the

rather than make a profit for some company.

"PP&L knew when it built the dams in 1947 what the rules were. Now, they want to change the rules contrary to the people and contrary to the Constitution.

"Let me put it another way. PP&L couldn't win at the time they've come to the Legislature.

However, supporters of the bill share Bradbury's analysis of the fact that Bradbury and others point out that most public power projects, roads, transmission lines and other infrastructure are constructed on land owned by the state. The condemnation process is a support of the measure proposed condemning the power stealing.

Rep. Larry Campbell, R-Coos County, said that the effort represented a basic American value. He referred to the fact that Oregon's public power is controlled by the Oregon State Government. "Interestingly enough,

BPA has said it will provide EPUD with power," said Rep. Larry Campbell, R-Eugene, whose district includes a portion of northern Douglas County and some of the EPUD areas.

Opponents of the measure charged that the bill was "special interest legislation" and an attempt to have the Legislature do what PP&L couldn't do in opposing the creation of the EPUD at the ballot.

"I've never seen a more radical piece of legislation in my lifetime," said House Majority Leader Grattan Kerans, D-Eugene.

"Voters have twice gone to the ballot and made a decision to form and then to fund EPUD," Kerans said. "What we have in HB 3173 is aimed directly at overturning the results of the ballot box. You could call it the after-the-fact ballot box stuffing bill."

In last Friday's emotional floor debate on the bill, a move was made by Rep. Peggy Jolin, D-Cottage Grove, to send the bill back to committee, but she lost on a 34-21 vote against re-referral.

Jolin had argued that all condemna-

Niven began her volunteer career when she set out to have five blocks of sidewalks installed on Hilyard Street to accommodate residents of a retirement home. 40 years meted for attempting to kill deputy

ROSEBURG (AP) — A Douglas County Circuit Court judge sentenced an Oregon State Penitentiary parolee Monday to 40 years in prison for the attempted murder of a sheriff's deputy.

Jack Flack, 32, was convicted in January of shooting Deputy Allen Burdic on Aug. 13, 1980, at an Interstate 5 interchange near Myrtle Point, about 15 miles south of Roseburg.

Judge Robert Stults imposed the prison term as well as a \$2,500 fine for the convictions on charges of attempted murder, assault and being an ex-convict in possession of a weapon. Flack will be eligible for parole in 10 years.

Burdic, 26, also shot Flack. Burdic had neck and stomach wounds and is partly paralyzed but has returned to work. Flack recovered completely from a chest wound. Burdic will receive \$1,000 of the fine money.

Flack was paroled from a robbery conviction about four months before he was involved in a shooting incident at a Myrtle Creek bar, which Burdic was investigating when he was shot.

Morgan probing p County c

Four thousand dollars worth of personal-service contracts that Lane County awarded in the past month to an unlicensed private investigator are being terminated, county General Administrator George Morgan said today.

Morgan said he had signed an order canceling the contracts awarded during the past month to Gretchen Coppedge, a former investigator for the Public Defender's office.

Morgan, meanwhile, indicated that he is still checking into apparent irregularities in the process by which informal bid quotations were purportedly sought from Coppedge and two other private investigators.

One of the investigators, Peter Moursund of Eugene, said he had not provided any quotations on two of the contracts that listed him as a bidder.

In checking county financial records last week, the Register-Guard found that Coppedge had been awarded five personal-service contracts within a month for various investigative jobs for the county counsel's office. Each of the contracts had a maximum amount of \$1,000. In each case, Coppedge was low bidder at \$15 an hour, while Moursund was high at \$22.50 and investigator Dale Heide was in the middle at \$18.

But the city business license office reported Friday that Coppedge was not licensed as a private investigator, as re-

County's 'good buddies' to give aid to 'Smokey'

It's a far cry from the Jackie Gleason-Burt Reynolds trucker movies of recent years — local good buddies have thrown their lot in with Smokey on the side of law and order.

Translated, a group of local citizen band radio operators have agreed formally to assist the police by relaying emergency reports. Gleason and Reynolds — who portray the southern sheriff and the taunting trucker in "Smokey and the Bandit" movies — would scoff at the cooperative arrangement.

The Radio Emergency Associated Citizen Team (REACT) of Lane County has formalized an agreement with the Eugene Police Department to provide 24-hour monitoring of emergency Channel 9 on CB radios and to relay calls for help to police. Channel 9 is set aside by the Federal Communications Commission for emergency transmissions. REACT has 30 to 40 members in Lane

County.

Communications supervisor Pam Heide of the Eugene Police Department says the arrangement with the CB group is nothing new, but is being formalized to encourage more radio users to take advantage of Channel 9 in reporting emergencies.

"They've been doing that for years," Heide says. "We're just formalizing it and trying to publicize it in order to get more cooperation from people driving around with CB radios in their cars."

According to REACT, one out of five vehicles is equipped with a citizen band radio.

And as for the movie-popularized myth that the CBers are out to get the police, Heide says it just isn't true. "As far as I'm concerned, we've always had excellent cooperation from the CB groups in Lane County," she says.

tion is inherently wrong and that the bill should be expanded to deal with all PUD condemnations, not just the EPUD's.

After Jolin's effort to get the bill back in committee failed, a reconsideration notice was given, which delayed a final decision until Monday's floor session.

In Monday's floor session, the parliamentary wrangling began again. First, the effort to reconsider the rereferral defeat of last Friday was rejected 33-24 by the House, thus putting the bill up for final passage.

However, Rep. Wally Priestley, D-Portland, moved that the bill be "postponed indefinitely," a rarely used parliamentary maneuver that has the effect of killing a bill without actually voting to kill it.

"The only way to punish PP&L is to do what they dislike most — and that's to expose their iron fist," Priestley said.

Priestley's motion lost 44-13. In that vote, the Lane County delegation split 4-3 against Priestley's method of killing

the measure.

Supporting Priestley were Reps. Kerans; Margie Hendriksen, D-Eugene, and Max Rijken, D-Newport. Opposing were Reps. Jolin; Campbell; Mary Burrows, R-Eugene, and Vern Meyer, R-Springfield.

After more debate, the bill passed on a 35-22 vote, with the same 4-3 Lane County split, this time in favor of the measure.

Then Priestley gave notice of reconsideration, which again put off final House action until sometime in today's floor session.

Rep. Bill Markham, R-Riddle, the bill's most vocal supporter, tried to get the House to vote immediately for reconsideration, but his motion was ruled out of order. That left the issue in yet another state of legislative limbo, at least for 24 hours.

The vote patterns in the previous floor actions leave little doubt that Priestley's reconsideration effort will fail and that the bill will head to the Senate where its fate is uncertain.

in 1976. Her husband, Ivan, is a U of O math professor.

Swindells, who is the former chief executive of Willamette Industries Inc. of Portland, also has compiled a long list of community service accomplishments.

Swindells has been the driving force behind the growth of the Oregon Community Foundation, which has assets of \$13 million and distributes nearly \$1 million annually to cultural, educational, medical and social service organizations in Oregon. The foundation assists agencies such as hospitals, museums, universities and colleges, symphonies

and organizations such as Boy Scouts and Camp Fire Girls.

Swindells is an engineering graduate of Lehigh University in Pennsylvania. His wife, Elizabeth, who is a civic leader and patron of the arts, is a graduate of the U of O and is a trustee of the U of O Foundation.

Uchida received her diploma from the University of California at Berkeley in absentia because in May 1942 her family was sent first to a race track in California and then to a location center in Topaz, Utah, for incarceration.

A cum laude graduate in English, philosophy and history, Uchida was released from the center in June 1943 when she was awarded a graduate fellowship from Smith College, Northampton, Mass., where she earned her master's degree in elementary education.

In 1952, Uchida began her career as a free-lance writer. Her first two books, "The Dancing Kettle" and "The Magic Listening Cap," are collections of Japanese folk tales.

Many of Uchida's books for children have won awards, including the Sequoyah Children's Book Award and the William Allen White Award. Her next book, "A Jar of Dreams," will be published in September.

Uchida's manuscripts will be placed in the U of O Library's Special Collections.

The city's Visitor and Convention Authority agreed to allot an undetermined sum in next year's budget for a county-wide "witness-retention" program.

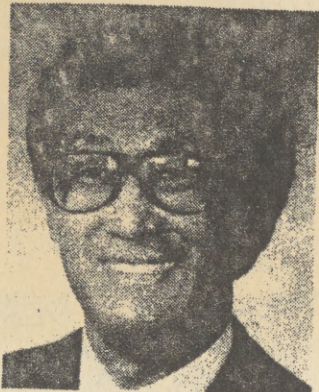
