

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE JAPANESE POPULATION

Bulletin 12 is the last of a series of bulletins issued by the Statistical Division of the Wartime Civil Control Administration. Bulletins 1-11 were issued as data were made available concerning the distribution and external characteristics of persons of Japanese ancestry on the West Coast. During the evacuation program various interested agencies and individuals sought information from the Wartime Civil Control Administration concerning the numbers, locations, ages, occupations, etc. of the Japanese. All these and various other data were collected by Wartime Civil Control Administration for use in administrative planning.

Most of the data concerning the Japanese published in Bulletins 1 through 11 were supplied by the Bureau of the Census, from the 1940 Census of Population. Bulletin 12, however, contains data from assorted sources. This bulletin will serve as a supplement to other available data concerning the Japanese.

For additional statistics the reader is referred to the Final Report: Japanese Evacuation from the West Coast, 1942; "Problems of Evacuation of Enemy Aliens and Others from Prohibited Military Zones" from the Hearings before the Select Committee Investigating National Defense Migration, House of Representatives, Seventy-seventh Congress; and to the various publications issued by the Bureau of the Census. In an effort to avoid duplication, detailed data included in the above-mentioned publications are not included in Bulletin 12.

The information included here is divided into three sections:

I. Pre-evacuation Statistics. This section contains data concerning location, age, sex, nativity, school attendance, education, employment status and occupations of the Japanese prior to evacuation.

II. Evacuation Statistics. Data presented here include essentially movement from exclusion areas, population shifts in Assembly Centers, and transfer to Relocation Centers.

III. Analytical and Methodological Statistics. This section includes miscellaneous statistics showing some of the uses to which various data were employed.

It should be noted that data concerning voluntary migration are not presented. These data were collected entirely for administrative purposes and if figures alone

were presented, the picture of voluntary migration would be distorted.

Some of the salient characteristics of voluntary migration follow:

1. There was a marked tendency for the voluntary migrants to concentrate themselves in rich agricultural areas extremely close to the boundary of the proposed evacuated area. Examples are the relatively large numbers moving to the Military Area 2 side of the valley areas in Tulare, Fresno, and Placer Counties.

2. Places outside of Military Areas 1 and 2 seemed to attract the voluntary migrants in direct proportion to their Japanese population and in inverse proportion to their distance from the origin of the migrants. States receiving the largest number of Japanese were Colorado, Utah, Idaho, and Montana.

3. In comparison with the evacuated Japanese, the average voluntary migrants were older and contained higher proportions of aliens and males.

Complete tabulations on the voluntary migration are on file at Headquarters, Western Defense Command and Fourth Army, Civil Affairs Division.

For utilization of the data, the following definitions and extensions are necessary:

1. Native-born refers to all persons born in Continental United States or in any of the outlying territories or possessions. All others are foreign-born. Because of citizenship restrictions, virtually all foreign-born Japanese are aliens and all native-born are citizens. In all tabulations prepared by the Statistical Division, nativity and citizenship were defined interchangeably.

2. Age refers to age at last birthday or number of full years completed.

3. The population characteristics in 1940 are based on the 1940 Census of Population. All statistics given refer to the date of the census in 1940 which was April 1.

4. Family Size refers to the number of persons registering as a household unit for purposes of evacuation.



RESTRICTIONS

1. All persons of Japanese Ancestry

- a. Prohibited from entering or being in **///** and **XXXXXX** except on permit from Commanding General, Western Defense Command and Fourth Army issued in cases of:
 - (1) Grave emergency involving death or critical illness of immediate relative
 - (2) Visit to Tule Lake and Manzanar
 - (3) A limited number of certain essential Federal employees
 - (4) Certain persons of 50% or less Japanese ancestry
 - (5) Certain Japanese wives of Caucasian husbands who have mixed blood children whose environment has been non-Japanese
 - (6) Persons too ill to be evacuated without danger to life
 - (7) Totally deaf, dumb or blind and in an institution
 - (8) Persons incarcerated in penal institutions.

- b. Prohibited from possession of contraband, i.e., firearms, weapons or implements of war, ammunition, bombs, explosives, short-wave radio receiving sets, radio transmitting sets, signal devices, codes or ciphers, cameras, etc.

- c. Must report changes of residence in entire Western Defense Command.

2. German Aliens

- a. Must report changes of residence in entire Western Defense Command.

SECTION I

PRE-EVACUATION STATISTICS

The statistics presented in this section show the growth and development of the Japanese population in the United States. In comparison to the "normal" United States population, the Japanese population has increased at a very rapid rate. They showed a tendency to concentrate themselves on the West Coast, specifically in the larger cities and rich agricultural centers.

The ratio of men to women is very high, only recently being alleviated by the number of births in the United States. In 1930 the number of native-born Japanese became greater than the number of foreign-born. The bimodal age distribution clearly shows two distinct generations.

The native-born Japanese completed a higher school grade than native-born Caucasians. Part of this difference can be attributed to the proximity of better educational facilities and part to the difference in ages. The majority of the native-born Japanese over 25 are under 30 years of age; whereas the native-born Caucasians are well distributed through age 70.





PACIFIC COAST JAPANESE POPULATION: 1940***






DISTRIBUTION OF JAPANESE ACCORDING TO AGE AND NATIVITY









SECTION II

EVACUATION STATISTICS

For convenience, the evacuation program can be divided into three distinct stages, namely:

1. Evacuation
2. Assembly Center Operation
3. Evacuee Transfer

All tabulations included in this section refer solely to the three stages of the evacuation program.

Evacuation. The first group of Japanese evacuees to enter a Center were those voluntarily entering Manzanar Reception Center, beginning on March 21, 1942. Following this group to Manzanar were the first evacuees from an excluded area. This movement included 258 Japanese from Bainbridge Island in the State of Washington, the area described in Civilian Exclusion Order Number 1. Civilian Exclusion Order Number 99 described the final area to be evacuated from Military Area Number 1, the latest movement completed on June 6, 1942.

On July 4, 1942, evacuation of the California portion of Military Area No. 2 was begun. Civilian Exclusion Order Number 108 described the final area to be evacuated, the movement being completed on August 8, 1942.

Assembly Center Operation. During the second stage of the evacuation program, while the Assembly Centers were in operation, 510 births and 134 deaths occurred; over 1,700 evacuees were released on work furloughs, and 206 persons of mixed-blood were permanently released.

Evacuee Transfer. The third stage of the program was that of transferring nearly 90,000 evacuees in regular group movements from Assembly to Relocation Centers. The first such transfer occurred May 26, 1942, when Tule Lake received 250 evacuees from Portland and 196 from Puyallup Assembly Centers. On October 30, 1942, Fresno, the only Assembly Center still in operation, closed with the transfer of 415 evacuees to Jerome Relocation Center.

(Note: In many tables, the abbreviation "CEO" is used to denote Civilian Exclusion Order. The Civilian Exclusion Order is the evacuation unit employed by the Wartime Civil Control Administration. The area to be evacuated was divided into 108 such geographical units, generally estimated to contain about 1,000 evacuees. A Civilian Exclusion Order was issued for each unit.)

EVACUATION STATISTICS

Evacuee Population Movements

A brief explanation of the meaning of the columnar headings follows:

- A. Total Population represents the number of evacuees physically present in the Center, as well as those who were hospitalized outside.
- B. Entering from CEO Groups refers to those persons who were evacuated en masse during the regular evacuation. All others unable to move at the time of evacuation because of illness or other deferment, and those entering from areas outside of the evacuated area were recorded in the column: Other Sources.
- C. Entering from WRA refers to evacuees returning from work furloughs, educational furloughs and those transferred from Relocation Centers.
- D. Jails, INS, etc. refers to evacuees who were inducted directly from the custody of Immigration and Naturalization Service, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and penal institutions.
- E. Births include those infants born in Center and outside hospitals after their mothers had been inducted.
- F. From WCCA includes all persons transferred from Assembly Centers.
- G. Transfers from Assembly Centers to War Relocation Authority are divided into three groups: (1) Regular Movement to Relocation Centers under transfer orders; (2) Furlough for work or educational purposes; (3) Other Transfers to WRA including persons remaining in outside hospitals at the time the Assembly Centers closed, and persons given special permission to transfer to Relocation Centers to join their families.
- H. Detainees are those alien Japanese individuals who were apprehended by and placed in the custody of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Immigration and Naturalization Service.
- I. Deaths of evacuees who had been inducted into Assembly Centers are those occurring both in Centers and outside hospitals.


ORIGIN OF JAPANESE EVACUATED TO ALL ASSEMBLY CENTERS

SECTION III

MISCELLANEOUS STATISTICS

This section contains miscellaneous statistics relating to the Japanese population. The number of births and deaths and the causes of death are presented for the calendar year 1942. The frequency distribution, as well as the average number of persons in family, are shown for Assembly and Relocation Centers.

A major problem in the evacuation program was that of estimating the number of potential evacuees in designated areas, or, conversely, that of describing areas for a predesignated number of evacuees. The desired unit for evacuation was considered to be approximately 1,000 persons.

The available data for estimates included

- (a) The 1940 Census of Population, presenting the number of Japanese on April 1, 1940, by Minor Civil Divisions, and
- (b) The Japanese migration to and from the evacuated areas after March 12, 1942.

To the above data, estimates of other population changes were applied in order to arrive at the predicted amounts. A table comparing the actual evacuation with the predicted is included in this section.


