a full size apartment, it is evident to us that smaller apartments
are needed. (necessary)

Doubling up of smaller families is not desirable because
friction starts sooner or later. Experience has proven that even
the best of friends living in the same apartment soon develop differ-
ences. Of course, there are exceptions.

We do not propose to take any set of barracks to partition
because all are partitioned into four. But partition them where
needed. For example, cut an apartment into two to make an "eight"
size room, or make three rooms out of two. In some cases, a full
beam can be cut from a full size room without handicapping the
occupants. Families are willing to sacrifice for sake of privacy.

If the barracks are partitioned, the population of the blocks
may be increased without developing friction within its residents.
An example may be taken from camp 2 and 3. Partitioning of rooms
will be more helpful than building more barracks.
