Question No.

1. A poultry unit is being planned to house 12,000 laying hens to supply 12,000 dozen eggs per month for the subsistence of the residents of this center.

In addition the plan includes facilities to accommodate 2,000 baby chicks every three months to produce 8,000 pounds of poultry meat for the center each month and 2,000 turkeys to produce 30,000 pounds of turkey meat per year.

Approximately \$30,000 per year will be saved by the War Relocation Authority by producing their own poultry products rather than buying them on the open market.

2. (a) The proposed construction is an alteration of existing facilities acquired and new construction.

Part 1. It is proposed to alter and make weather tight six existing portable shed type buildings 12' x 16' and equipping said buildings for the purpose of brooding chicks. See Exhibit (B-1) for the proposed work. It is also proposed to build 2,300 feet of fencing by using reclaimed fencing and other suitable fencing material that can be salvaged from used materials out of the project's general scrap pile and whatever materials that can be bought on the local market.

It is also proposed to take an existing 30' x 15' structure and use as a feed storing house.

Part 2. It is proposed to ask for authority to begin construction with priority assistance the following structures:

10 Laying Houses 24' x 100' (Exhibit B-2)

2 Broiler Houses 24' x 100' (Exhibit B-2)

These structures are all designed to meet minimum requirements for cold winter months.

Part 3. It is proposed to ask for authority to begin construction with priority assistance for the follow-

ing structure for the turkey farm:

2--roost houses 24' x 100' See Exhibit (B-2)

1000' - 0" fencing: Using reclaimed fence and similar materials which are lath and bailing wire

2--Outdoor Roosts--Post and lintel construction material are on hand and to be salvaged from scrap.

(e) The type of structure for the portable brooder houses is wood frame construction with wood floors and wood runners with composition roofing-paper covered walls and composition roofing. The type of structure for the laying house and broiler house Exhibit (B-2) is wood frame construction with concrete foundation, cinder floors, cinder insulated walls covered with composition board and composition roofing-paper, and composition roof.

3. The War Relocation Authority was established by Executive Order No. 9102, March 18, 1942, which directed this agency to cooperate with the War Department in evacuating, relocating, and providing work opportunities for persons evacuated from military areas (Exhibit CC). The basic minimum requirements for the housing of Japanese were built by the War Department. This proposed project represents the construction by War Relocation Authority of a part of the over-all construction and development program of this War Relocation Authority Project Area as authorized under Executive Order No. 9102 and the Appropriation Act (Public Law 678 - 77th Congress, Chapter 524 - 2nd Session, H. R. 7519) (Exhibit CC).

It is the policy of the W.R.A. to produce as large a percentage as possible of the livestock products needed for the feeding of the evacuees.

In the light of food rationing the efforts toward a self-sustaining community here will be a direct contribution to the war efforts. As food is produced locally for the center, other food sources now being tapped to supply the center will be released for army use and to provide the domestic markets with additional food.

The Minidoka War Relocation Project Area was selected because from a military standpoint, climatic conditions, suitability for agricultural and industrial development, transportation facilities, land ownership, and other factors, it seemed well suited for the purpose intended. The location of this particular unit in the area was selected so as to be in convenient proximity to utility lines and area living quarters.

The poultry project, hog project, and the slaughter house project sites were pre-determined by the original total layout. Therefore, it is necessary to provide a common water supply system and electrical distribution system in order to give a minimum amount of service required for each function.

- (1) For the common water distribution system is to be made up of a thousand feet of used 6" steel water pipe which is on hand, 1000' of 3" pipe and 1000' of 2" pipe.
- (2) The common electrical distribution system requires three transformers, one 3 KVA for hog unit, one 7½ KVA for slaughter house, one 10 KVA for poultry unit. With these transformers, which shall be strung out 3,000 feet from the existing utility line, will be and required, two wires, #6 bare hard-drawn copper, wood poles and accessories to supply the necessary power to the unit mentioned. Application for authority to begin construction with priority assistance shall be submitted as a separate W.P.B. - 617 in that it will be required for any one project excluding the transformers.

The structure water supply lines and the interior electrical wiring for the poultry project, hog project, and the slaughter house project are being treated individually in their respective WPB-617--formerly PD-200 application.

4. (a) Full consideration has been given to possible use of existing facilities and all available facilities have been acquired and used but are not sufficient for the operation of the total project.
- (b) The purpose of this project is to eliminate all subcontracting of the product to be produced. The operation of this unit will not be successful if handled in any manner other than through the War Relocation Authority.
- (c) Conservation of scarce materials and critical materials has been considered and all possible elimination of these materials have been made.

5. (a) None of the business of the Project is represented by prime contracts with Army, Navy, or Maritime Commission. During the last calendar year there was no operation of this unit.

A. (1) The poultry unit was designed to provide a maximum amount of food, at a minimum of expense for the residents of the center. Feed for the chickens will be produced on the farm, which is in operation adjacent to the center. No deviation from the original program is requested or planned.

(2) a. The War Relocation Authority was established by the Executive Office of the President of the United States under Executive Order No 9066, dated February 19, 1942, for the removal from designated areas of persons whose removal was necessary in the interest of National Security.

b. This project should not be deferred for the duration of the war, because the food produced, as a result of the successful completion of this project, will greatly assist in feeding the residents of the center.

B. (1) War Production Board, Washington, D.C.

(2) Approved October 20, 1943. Serial No 113403.

C. (1) There is no deviation in the proposed construction as originally approved, "except" for the addition of five 8' x 16' feed storage houses, and the location of the original buildings

as requested on the original application, the buildings were to be built in close proximity, but upon the advice of the Fire Protection Office, they have been ^{situated} sufficiently far apart, to prevent a fire from spreading from one building to another. This change in the general layout will require 419 l.b.s. of copper wire, and .269 tons of black iron water pipe.

The five feed storage houses will require 2175 board feet of framing lumber, 750 board feet of flooring, 2340 square feet of asphalt treated fibre board sheathing, 10 squares of roofing paper, hinges, nails and roofing asphalt.

An error was made on the original application on building material, item No 97 construction lumber 2" thick and under, listed 95.000 board feet but it should have been 119.069 board feet.

This is an increase of 24.069 board feet of which 11.304 board feet will be used to build nests, drop boards, roosts and feed hoppers.

A waiver is not requested on this amount, as it is considered to be classed as equipment, and not restricted on the Construction Limitations.

If this material is restricted, this should then be considered as a request for waiver.

No addition to the total cost will be made, as purchases have been made, at prices sufficiently lower than the original estimate, so the additional material may be purchased, and/or transferred from the cancelled portion of H.P.B. approval serial N^o: 35973, without exceeding the original cost.

(2) This project application requests permission to use framing and sheeting lumber which is on hand, to complete the project as originally planned, together with the addition of five feed storage houses.

b. The structures are of one story frame construction with asphalt treated fibre board sheeting.

c. Wood frame.

D. (1) A waiver is requested for permission to use framing and sheeting lumber.

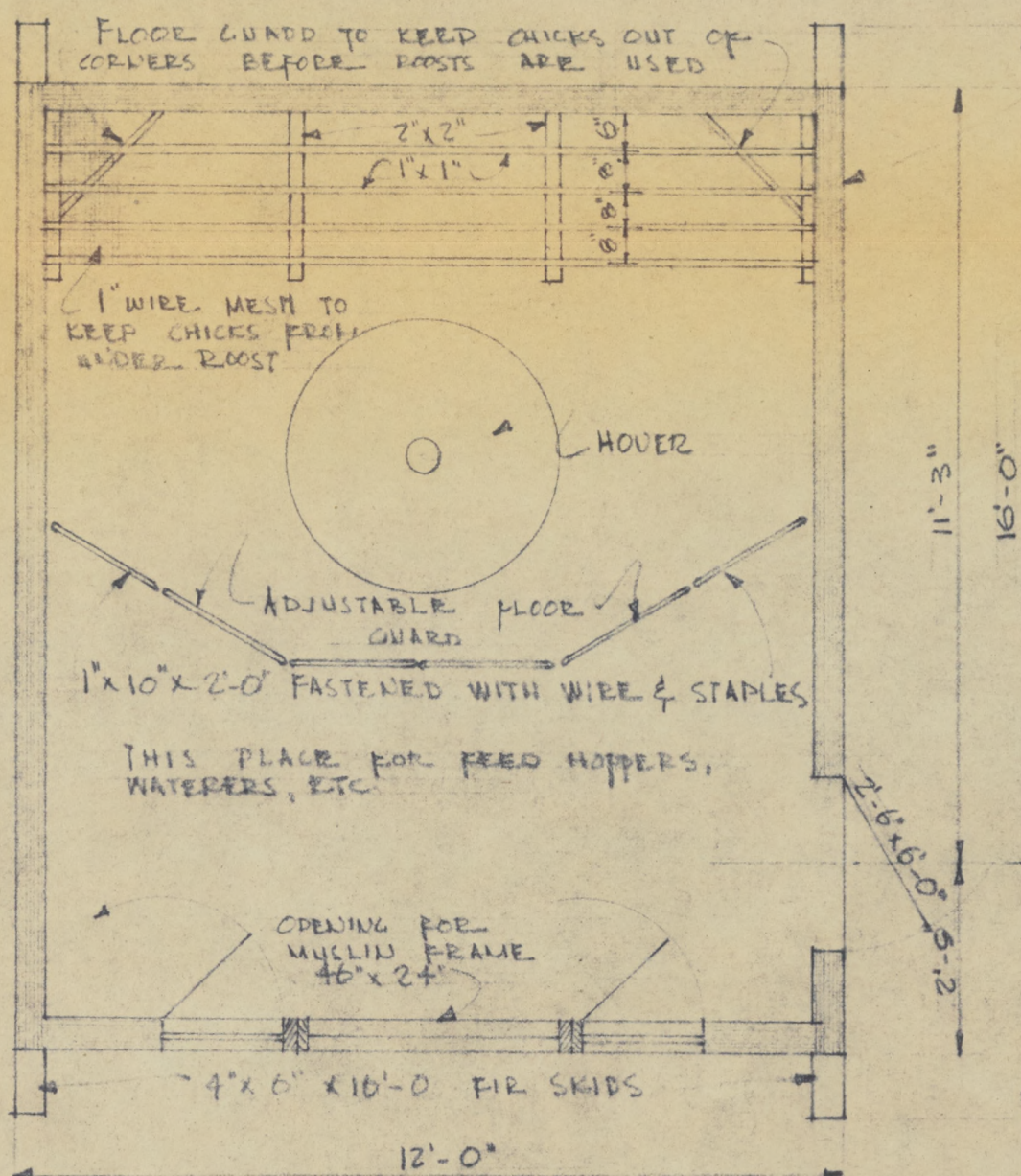

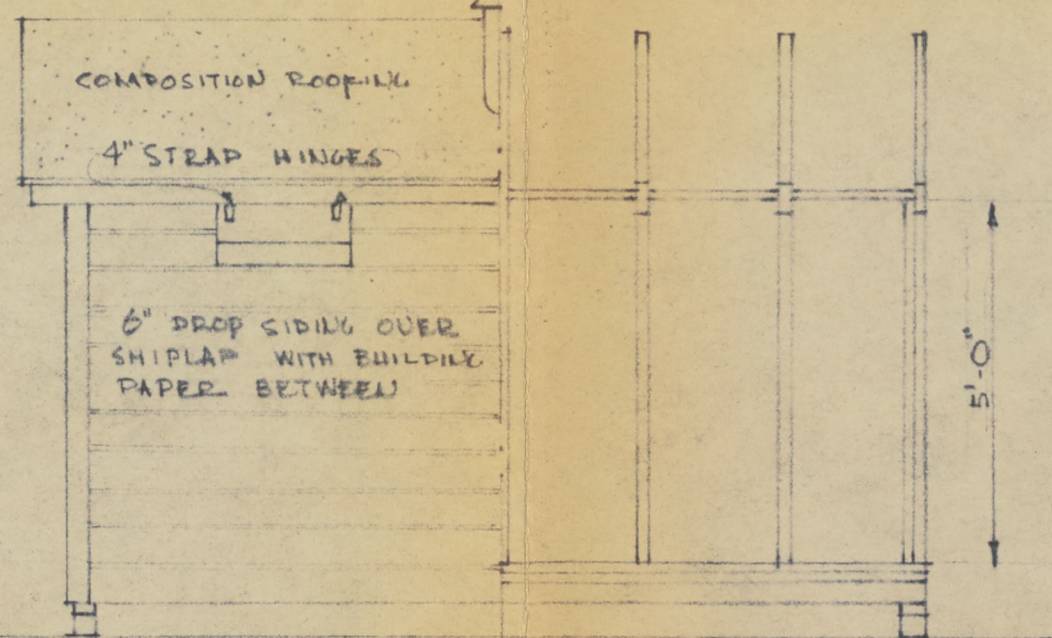

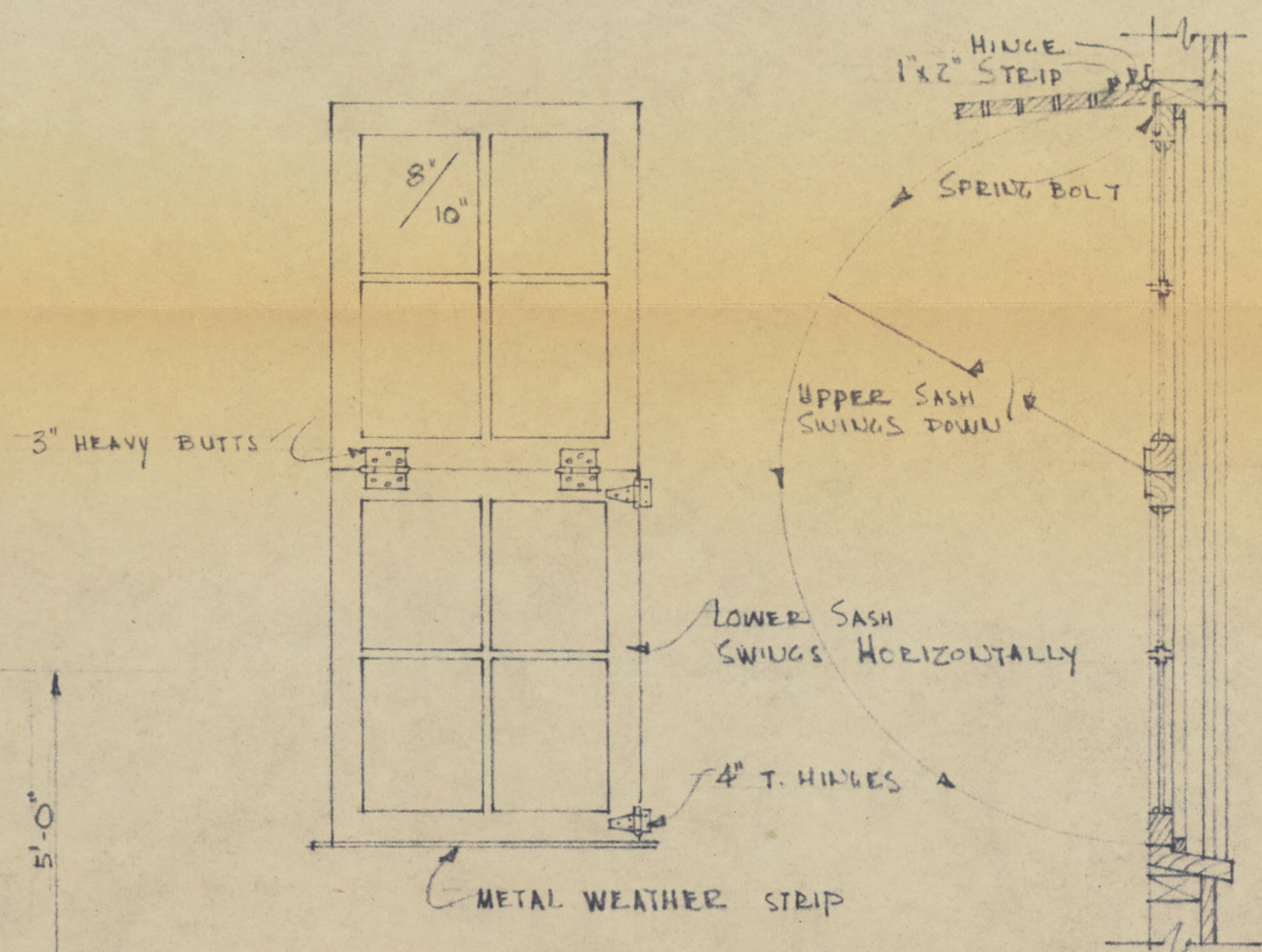


FLOOR PLAN

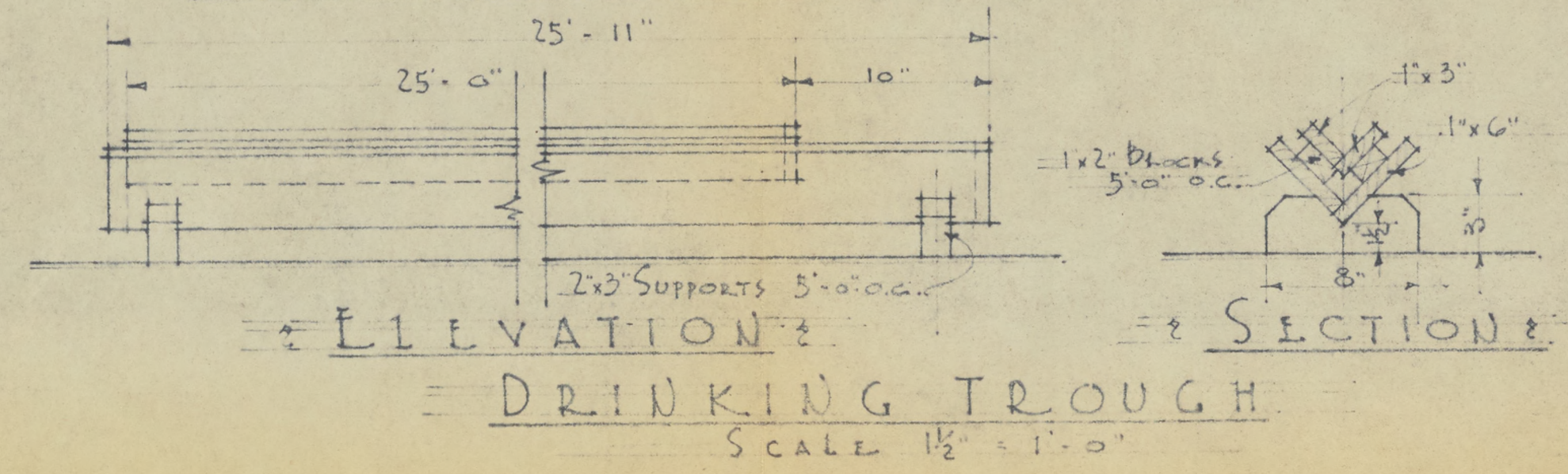
FLOOR PLAN

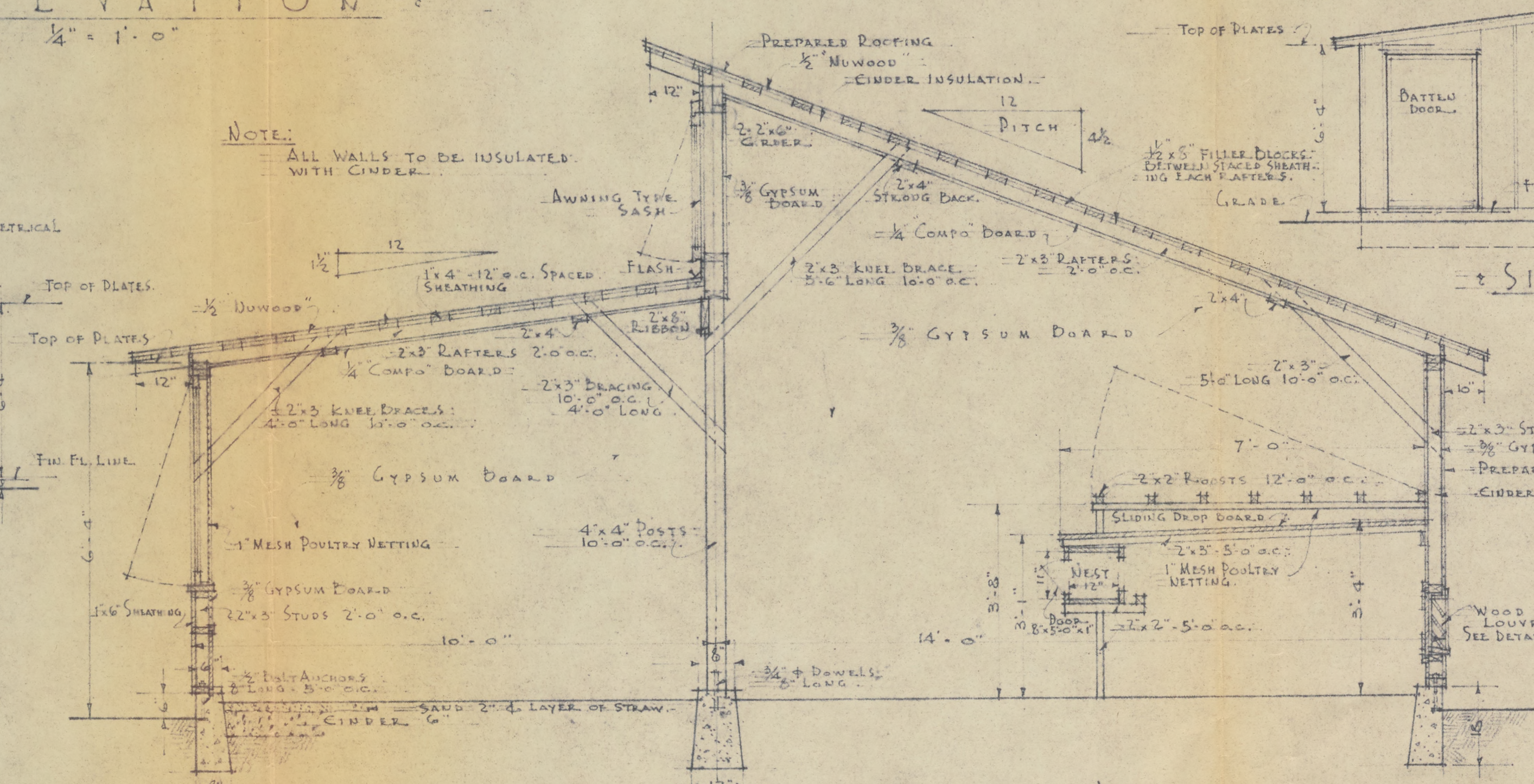
FRONT ELEVATION

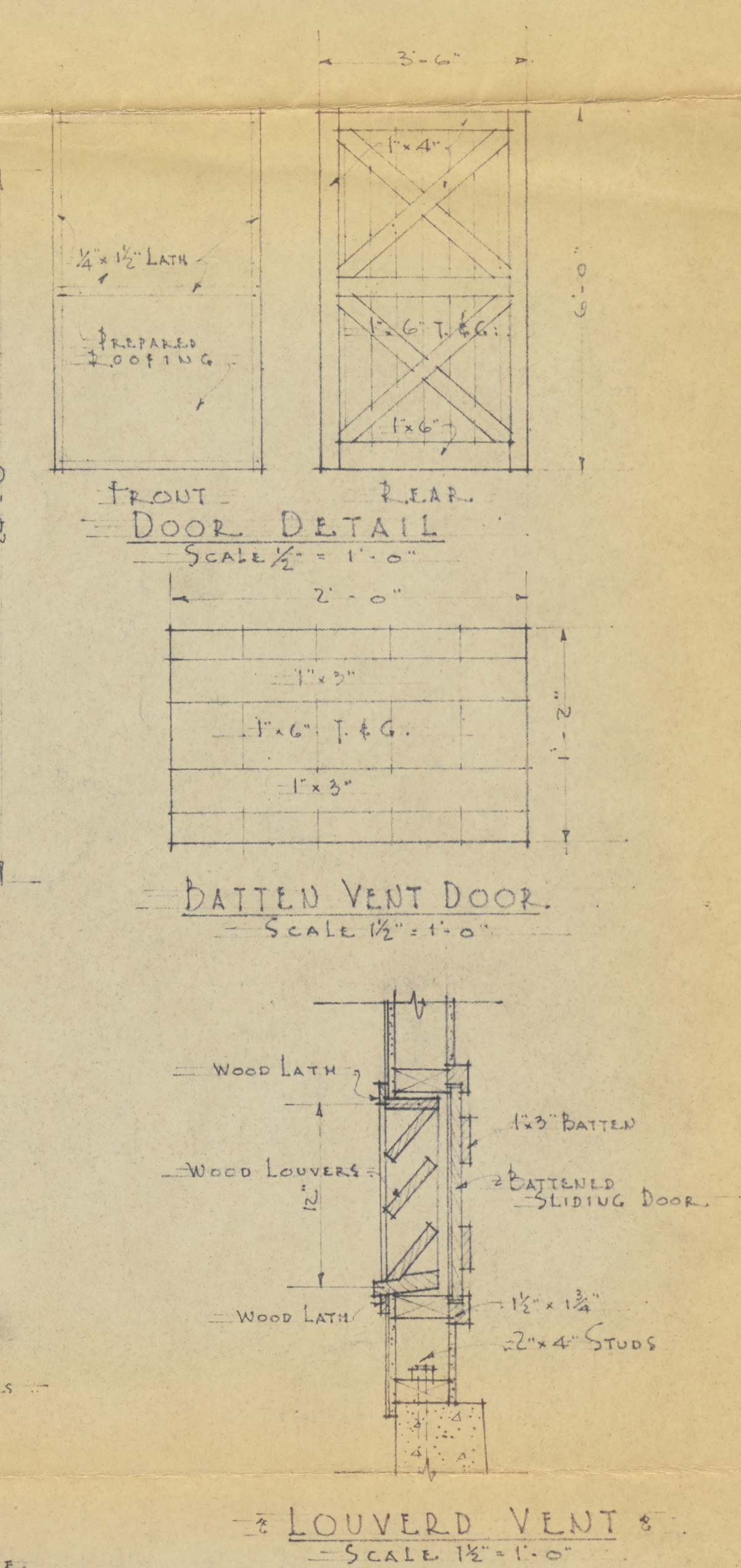
HALF REAR ELEVATION

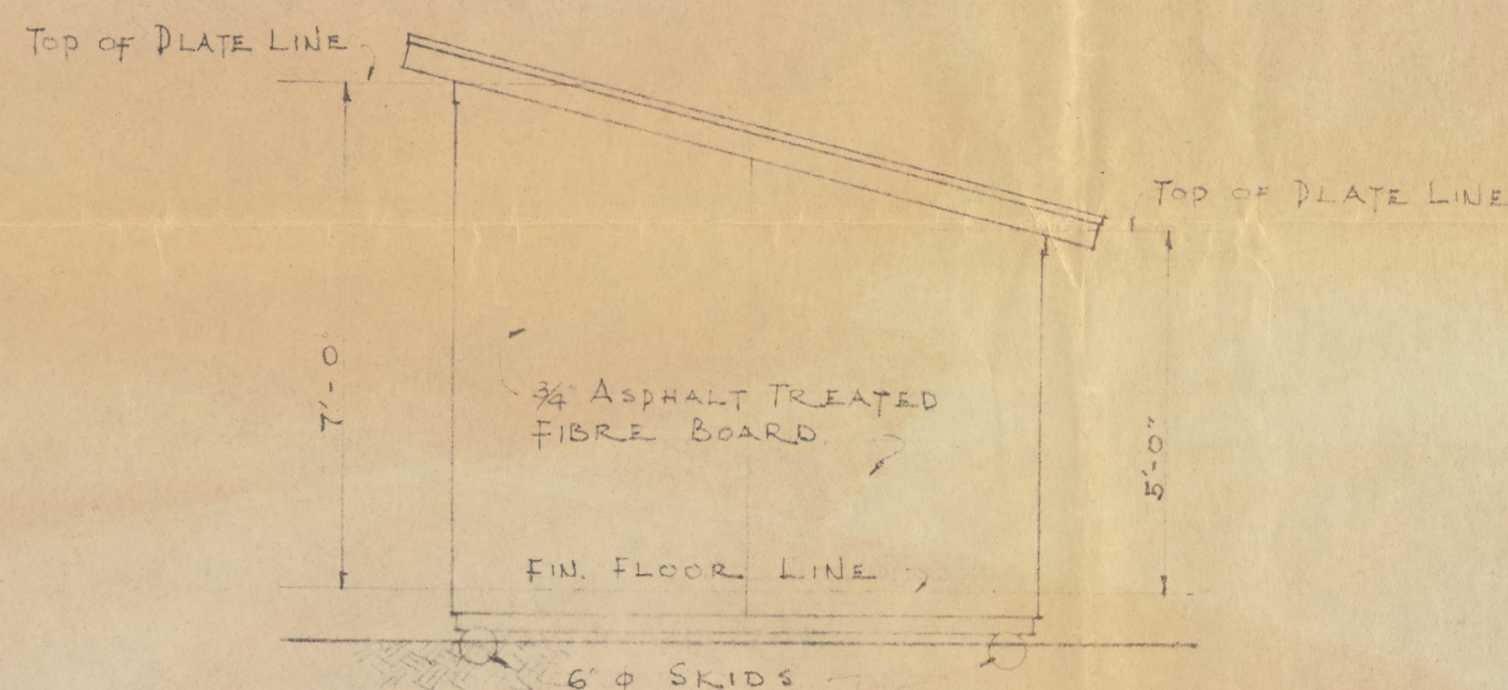
FLOOR PLAN

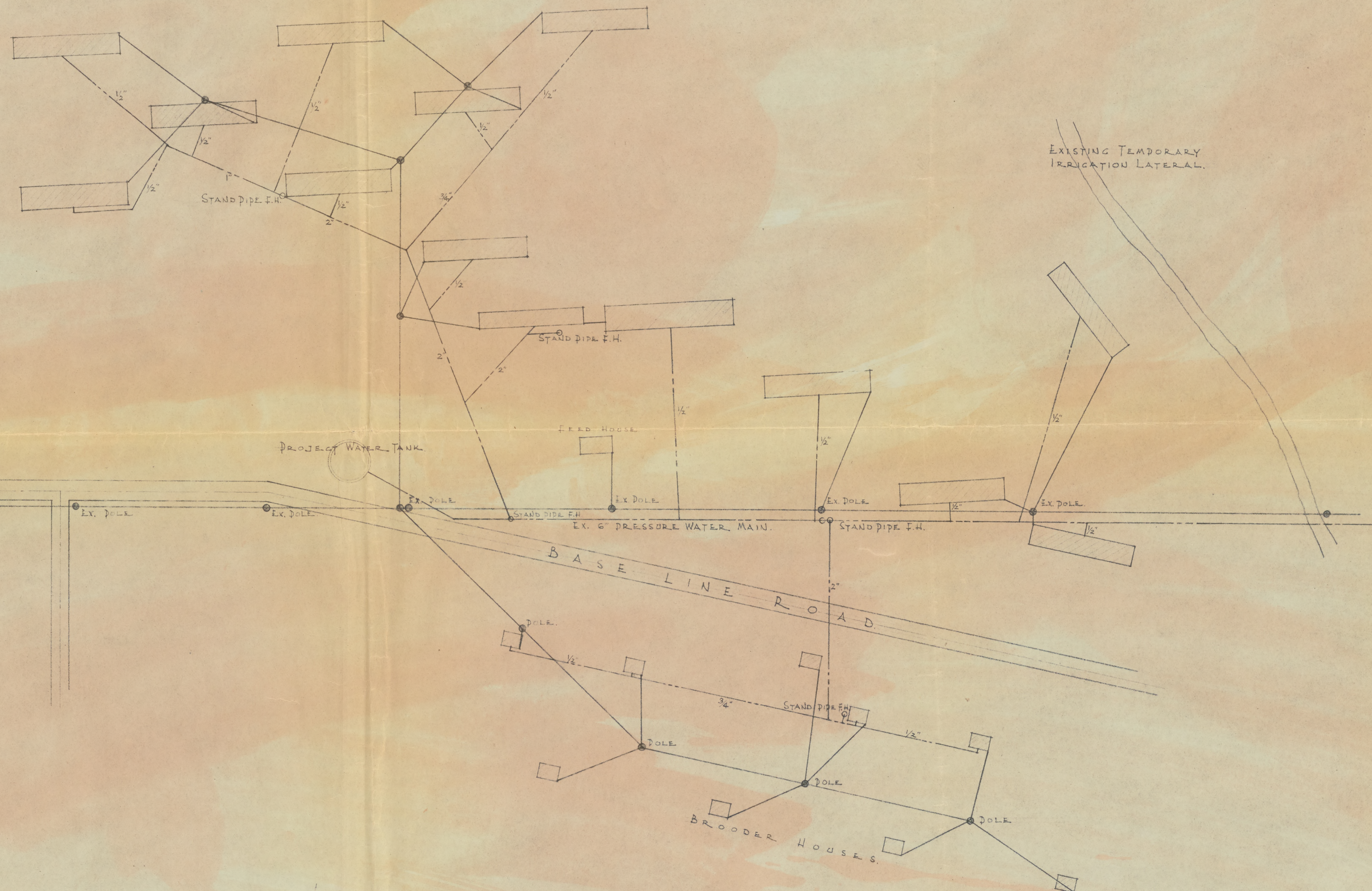

Your recent submission, WPB-617 supplement for the Poultry Project, Serial No. 113403 was reviewed by this office. We find the request for five portable feed houses which will be distributed throughout the Poultry Project to be quite in order as well as the need for additional quantities of wire and water pipe brought about by the necessary revision of the original approved project to conform to the fire regulations. However, your request for permission to use an additional 24,069 board feet of lumber is seriously questioned. We have carefully checked your plans and materials list in your original application (#113403) and find the amount of 95,000 board feet quite in order. We are at a loss to know just where the error was made.

In order to expedite the WPB approval of the five feed storage houses and additional wiring and water pipe material, we have made over your application and we are submitting a new set to the WPB to cover the above features of the project. A copy of the revised application is enclosed for your files.

If there is a need for the additional 24,069 board feet of lumber, we suggest that another WPB-617 be submitted with the proper justification including answers to the following questions:

1. The amount of lumber required and reason.
2. Plans and sketches showing where the lumber will be used.
3. Any additional information which will present a clear picture of the situation to the War Production Board.

We feel that proper justification and any supporting information is necessary as the demand by the armed forces on the nations stock pile has been such that WPB has drastically limited the use of lumber for other purposes and has been reluctant to even authorize the use of lumber on hand.
