Introduction

"Where can I go to get more information on Labor Relations? Will they have the information I need to help me do a better job?"

Those of us who are active in Worker Education have had this question raised many times. Often it comes from a newly elected Union Officer who feels inadequate to cope with his new duties. We usually can come up with some addresses and a few suggestions which may be helpful but do not adequately cover the vast field of information which is available on Labor-Management Relations today.

In order to meet this need, I decided to see if it would be possible to compile a directory of sources where information is available, particularly at low cost or free. Fortunately, two graduate research assistants became available and I was able to utilize their services. Bonnie Cebulski compiled our first listing of sources. The major effort was done by Joseph Cigliano, who took her list and with the able assistance of the librarian for the Institute of Industrial Relations, Gwendolyn Lloyd, enlarged, corrected, eliminated and categorized the various sources. It is to Joseph Cigliano that credit for the completed directory should go.

While our original intention was a listing of sources which would provide guidance for Trade Union Officers, it has become apparent that the directory could be helpful to anyone seeking information about Labor Relations. It will be necessary in most cases for the reader to write to the listed organization and ask for a listing of available materials. Most of the organizations furnish publications lists and will send them upon request.

Our directory is not complete, we know, but we are confident that we have included the government agencies and educational institutions most active in providing information on Labor Relations. In addition, we have included the commercial services most active in the field.

The directory is divided into five sections as follows:

- I. Educational Institutions -- This section lists those colleges and universities most active in providing information relevant to labor unionists. Also summarized are the various publications and services that are available from these institutions.
- II. Private Services -- A description of the publications and services provided by the Bureau of National Affairs, Prentice-Hall, Commerce Clearing House, the Personnel Association, and the Labor-Management Relations Service.
- III. Statistical Sources -- Government agencies and private sources providing statistics useful for collective bargaining. This section also includes those sources useful for locating corporate financial information.
- IV. Unions -- A listing of those unions providing educational services and brief descriptions of the publications available.
- V. Basic Books and Periodicals -- This section contains not only the more popular texts, but also provides a listing of books on specific unions, automation, labor law, and other relevant subjects. Also included are the more important periodicals and a listing of publishers' addresses where one may obtain more information.
