

Featured speaker was William Bechill, Executive Secretary of the California State Citizens' Advisory Committee on Aging. Mr. Bechill stressed the importance of ending discrimination in employment solely because of age and pointed out the responsibility of persons in industrial relations in this respect. Those in attendance had the opportunity to learn about the operation of the important work that this committee is doing in many fields in the interest of our older population, which in California now numbers over 1,550,000.
