THE AGING POPULATION: STATE AND REGIONAL TOTALS, 1957

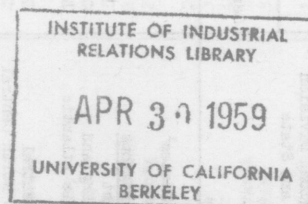

Presents the latest Census Bureau estimates of civilian population, by State, Census Regions and Divisions, and D/HEW Regions, for total population and for selected age groups, as of July 1, 1957, in comparison with data as of the April 1, 1950, census enumeration. The proportion of the total population in the age groups 45 through 64 and 65 and over, and the percent changes (1957 over 1950) are shown. For ease of comparison, the columns presenting the proportion of total population in each of the selected age groups in both years (columns 5 and 10 and columns 7 and 12) are outlined in heavy lines. The columns presenting percent change over the 7-year period in total population (column 3) and in each of the selected age groups (columns 8 and 13) are outlined in broken lines. Data for the larger age group, 45 and over, may be secured by adding together columns 4 and 9 and columns 5 and 10 for the number of persons and the percent of total population, respectively, for 1950, and columns 6 and 11 and columns 7 and 12 for 1957. The percent change columns cannot be added together; percent change would have to be computed from the sums of columns 4 and 9 and of columns 6 and 11.
