### Guardian prices going up

---

Not since January 1968 has the Guardian raised its subscription prices. During that period of time our operating expenses have increased by leaps and bounds. Printing costs have risen over 60 percent and further increases are in the offing. Mailing costs are skyrocketing with a special vengeance for the second class newspaper rate. As our sustainers no doubt know, all other costs are going upward as the inflationary spiral continues.

Therefore, the inevitable has come to pass. Beginning February 1 subscription prices will be going up. Our new price schedule will be \$12.50 for one year; \$20 for two years; \$7.50 for students, unemployed, retired workers and GI's. Foreign postage rates will be raised to \$3 and \$4. Our \$1 trial subscription will be reduced from 10 to 8 weeks. The newsstand and bookstore price will rise to 35c.

The increase in prices will not make up for the large deficit under which the Guardian is forced to operate. Not in our entire 25 year history has the Guardian ever ended a year out of the red.

#### '74 YEAR OF GROWTH

Without our sustainers continued publication of the Guardian would have been at best difficult if not impossible. Now as we

begin a new year, what we feel will be a year of growth for the paper, your support assumes even greater political importance.

In 1974 we feel that we can continue to make progress in the circulation of the Guardian. During 1973 our subscription curve showed a slow but steady rise. We are now developing programs to reach what we believe is a large potential readership for the paper, a potential that has barely been touched.

Improving the quality of the Guardian's news coverage is in the forefront of our minds. We intend to build up our bureaus in Chicago, Atlanta and the Bay Area while moving forward with plans for the development of bureaus in Los Angeles, Detroit and Boston.

In the area of foreign coverage we believe that the addition of Martin Nicolaus to our staff will enhance our coverage. Judging from his first few articles we think our hopes are well founded.

To sustain this growth—we need you, our sustainers.

Many sustainers will be receiving renewal letters in addition to the newsletter, asking they renew their pledges for 1974. Thus far over 25 percent have done so in advance and we are hoping for 100 percent, by the time the results are in.



The possibility of renewed bombing by the U.S. of Vietnam is very real. This was pointed out by Richard Ward in the Guardian of December 12. The liberation forces in South Vietnam remain alert to defend the liberated areas.

## Nicolaus becomes foreign editor

A new by-line has been appearing in the pages of the Guardian for the past few weeks: Martin Nicolaus. Well known to people in the Bay Area and on the west coast generally, Nicolaus has moved to New York to join the Guardian staff. He replaces Barry Rubin as the Guardian's foreign editor. Nicolaus is an experienced Marxist who most recently completed translating the English edition of Karl Marx's "Grundrisse," now available in paperback from Penguin.

## '73 China tours conclude

The Guardian's 1973 China Tours concluded with the departure of our fifth tour December 19.

Made up of political activists from around the country, the China visitors will spend three weeks in The People's Republic. The group will visit Canton, Shanghai, Nanking, Changsha, Shaoshan (Mao's birthplace) and Peking. The 22-person group is led by Guardian staff writer Carl Davidson.

### 25th anniversary celebration nears

The Guardian's 25th Anniversary Celebration is less than a month away.

The celebration is scheduled for Saturday night, November 24th at Hunter College Auditorium in New York City. The hall seats over 2000 and we hope to fill the place with friends of the Guardian.

One important aspect of the program will be to place the Guardian in the context of the struggles of the past 25 years. Since its founding in 1948 the Guardian has participated in the crucial political struggles of the time. Whether it was taking up the struggle against McCarthy, supporting the struggle for Civil Rights in the early 60's, opposing U.S. intervention in Vietnam, or taking part in the struggle for freedom for political prisoners, the Guardian was there.

Not only our paper, but also our readers have been a part of the struggles of these 25 years. Therefore, another aspect of the program will be a salute to our readers. Through the use of slides

and introductions from the audience we will attempt to tie together the history of the Guardian and its readership.

The featured speaker will be the author and film-maker Felix Greene. In addition there will be a program produced by people's singer Barbara Dane. Featured in this program will be: El Grupo, Puerto Rican Independence movement singers; the Covered Wagon Singers, group of active duty and recently discharged Air Force people from Idaho who will be making their first New York appearance; and Barbara Dane and her electric band, The New World Rollers. Howard Da Silva, film and stage actor, will also participate in the program.

To make this program a success the support of our sustainers is necessary. We hope that as many as possible will attend the program. A special section of seats has been set aside for sustainers, contributors and friends of the Guardian at \$10 per seat. General admission is \$3.

It was great seeing you again and, of course, I'm especially appreciative of your hospitality while I was in San Francisco.




