Dear Publisher:

Our midyear catalog mailing is enclosed with this letter. Please help us keep things under control by sending new title information as soon as possible.

We've been growing tremendously the past year or so; we now carry over 15,000 titles from more than 1200 publishers, and we do business with more than 3500 bookstores and other retailers. We'd like to discuss several areas of mutual concern that have arisen as we have grown. We hope you will take a few moments to read through this letter; if you have any questions, feel free to call or write.

FAX

If you have a fax, please send or fax us your number. Faxes are extremely useful in this business and we urge you to consider purchasing one, if you have not already. Our fax number is printed above.

SHIPPING/RECEIVING

Many of the shipments we receive suffer from one or more deficiencies that make receiving them more difficult and, therefore, more costly for us. Please review the instructions below and follow them in all shipments to us.

1. Send one packing list with each shipment; clearly mark the box that contains or has the packing list attached. Always reference our original purchase order number(s). Please advise status of titles not shipped (i.e. out of stock, out of print, etc.).
2. Number all boxes in shipment as follows: 1 of 7, 2 of 7, etc. This is especially important for shipments sent via UPS or Book Post.
3. Never pack with newspaper.
4. When you ship multiple titles, mark each box with what is inside; this is absolutely crucial if you have more than one title in a box!
5. Do not ship freight collect! We will charge you back all costs plus a charge for advancing funds.

PURCHASE ORDERS

1. Do not ship anything to us we have not ordered!
2. Always backorder unless we have made specific arrangements with you to cancel and reorder.
3. Advise us at once when there are changes in a title, publication date, price, or when a title we have ordered is cancelled, postponed, or being reprinted. As far as we and our customers are concerned, timely receipt of such information is crucial.
4. Do let us know in advance about any events, reviews, etc. that will affect our ordering patterns.
5. If you cannot fill a purchase order, or any item on it, for whatever reason, please notify us in writing; give complete information as to reason and new date expected to ship. We will advise you if we cancel a purchase order; otherwise, it will remain open in our system until filled.

RETURNS/DAMAGED BOOKS/RECYCLING

We've been hearing some legitimate complaints from bookstores that our returns policies are too strict for them to be able to take chances on carrying small press books in their stores. We are very anxious not to lose our good relationship with booksellers, so we have begun loosening up our returns requirements. The net result to any publisher will be very small, but you may receive back from us a few books now and then that are clearly shopworn. We hope you will join us in considering this a reasonable cost of getting

books into the stores. If you have a problem with our returns to you, please call Nancy Brown at once.

A number of publishers have authorized us to dispose of books we receive damaged rather than bearing the expense of having us ship them back. Since we are now able to recycle unsaleable books, we urge you to agree; it saves a great deal of time, boxes and other shipping materials and postage. If you are willing to give us a blanket authorization to recycle your books, please let Nancy know; recycled books will appear as withdrawals on your sales reports.

SHIPTO/BILLTO

Once again, we have outgrown our current building. We are planning to move this summer, hopefully no later than August. We will let you know as soon as everything is firm. Meanwhile, please update your record of our mailing address - our P.O. box number was changed by the local post office.

Dear Folks: We have been hearing about you from bookstores and would be interested in discussing the possibilities of distributing your books. We don't know more than that you have produced a book and are offering it to bookstores, so whatever information you can supply us with would be appreciated. Inland is a small press/small publisher distributor, much like Bookpeople in Berkeley, though newer and smaller and limited to small pubs only (no mass market, no "commercial trade houses" like Pandem Fouse etc), and perhaps a bit more alternative than B! has become. We are strongest as a distributor of feminist, lesbian and gay publishers, but we are also one of the largest distributors of literary small presses, and we carry spiritual and political books as well; in general a thorough selection of the best small presses and publishers from the US, Canada and England. We work on consignment, issuing monthly sales reports that are payable 90 days from their dates, we need a minimum discount of 52% and prefer 55% (we give free ad space in our catalogs in return for the extra discount) and publisher pays freight to us. These terms are pretty standard at this point, ours being slightly more favorable to the publisher than most small press distributors. Anyway, we sell very well throughout the east, midwest and Canada and we think we would be able to do well by you. If you're interested, please let me know as soon as possible, as we have catalog deadlines approaching soon. Call or write if you have questions, etc. Many thanks

Publisher will provide Distributor with promotional materials as are mutually agreed upon, including advance or sample copies of new titles.




In preparation for the busy times ahead, we do ask that when you call us you have your order ready. We usually only need quantity and title. We can almost always give you a pretty


CALYX: A Journal of Art and Literature by Women, Vol. 8, #2, Spring 1984, \$4.50. This issue is titled "Bearing Witness/

We should note that Yellow Moon's cassette package is about the size of a trade paper book, which makes it suitable for any bookstore.

INTERNATIONAL FEMINISM: NETWORKING AGAINST SEXUAL SLAVERY, Report of the Global Feminist Workshop to Organize Against Traffic in Women, edited by Kathleen Barry, Charlotte Bunch, Shirley Castley, International Women's Tribune Center, \$6.00 (no ISBN). The testimony contained within this book is frightening and eye-opening. It serves as a means of calling attention to the sexual oppression and violence against women in all parts of the world, and helps to focus political action and attention to these issues in a useful and meaningful way.
