Historical Note:

Gabriel Lopez Valencia (1929-2001) was born in Placentia, California on June 30, 1929 to Jesus and Modesta Valencia. After the death of his father at age two, he and his mother Modesta moved to Mexico where he was raised. As per Mexican law, Gabriel was conscripted and served in the Mexican Army when he became of age. Upon his discharge from the Army, he returned to the U.S. where he worked as a migrant field worker. He later settled in Nipomo Mesa where he met and married Elisa.

Together, they worked in farm labor and raised a family of eight children on the central coast, primarily in the Santa Maria Valley. Valencia joined the United Farm Workers Union in 1968, and in 1970 the family moved to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania to work with the UFW. He was a founder and president of the Mexican American Political Association (MAPA) Central Coast Chapter and helped raise money for educational scholarships. Valencia continued his volunteer work with the UFW until his death from cancer in 2011.
