2. DeWitt C. Carter (1864-1947), portrait, c. 1860s.
Son of George C. Carter (1835-1915) and Nancy Jane Lanterman (1837-1928).
3. Jonas Crisman(1785-1876), portrait, c. 1900s.
Father of Ammoretta Jane Crisman Lanterman who, with her husband Jacob Lanterman, brought her family to California in the 1870s.
4. Lawson Marcellus La Fetra (1844-1907), portrait, undated.
Husband of Stella Bell Lanterman La Fetra. She was the aunt of Frank (b.1901) and Lloyd Lanterman.
5. Lawson Marcellus La Fetra (1844-1907) in front of Glendora home, undated.
Husband of Stella Bell Lanterman La Fetra. She is the daughter of Jacob and Ammoretta Lanterman, who brought the family to La Canada where it became one of its founding families. She is also the sister of Roy Lanterman (1869-1948), who built El Retiro in La Canada, now known as the Lanterman House Museum.

Emily Lanterman sitting in a chair at 2125 Granada Ave., "El Retiro Mar."
19. Frank Dexter Lanterman (b. 1862), portrait, c. 1880s.
Portrait of a Frank Lanterman as a young man, taken in San Jose, California. He is the son of the Jacob Luce Lanterman (b.1827) and brother of Dr. Roy S. Lanterman (b. 1869). This image was probably taken after the Lanterman family moved to California in the 1870s.
20. Frank Dexter Lanterman (b. 1862), portrait, c. 1880s.
Portrait of Frank Lanterman as a young man wearing a large mustache and suit. He is the son of the Jacob Luce Lanterman (b.1827) and brother of Dr. Roy S. Lanterman (b. 1869). The California State Assemblyman Frank Dexter Lanterman (b. 1901), his nephew, is his namesake.
21. Frank Dexter Lanterman (b. 1862), portrait, c. 1880s.
Cabinet card portrait of Frank Lanterman as a young man with a mustache and wearing a pinstripe suit. He is the son of the Jacob Luce Lanterman (b.1827) and brother of Dr. Roy S. Lanterman (b. 1869). The California State Assemblyman Frank Dexter Lanterman (b. 1901), his nephew, is his namesake.
22. Frank Dexter Lanterman (b. 1862), portrait, c. 1900s.
Clean-shaven Frank Lanterman in an oval-shaped portrait. He is the son of the Jacob Luce Lanterman (b.1827) and brother of Dr. Roy S. Lanterman (b. 1869). The California State Assemblyman Frank Dexter Lanterman (b. 1901), his nephew, is his namesake.

Portrait of a mature Frank Lanterman in a plaid suit and bow tie with silver hair. He is the son of the Jacob Luce Lanterman (b.1827) and brother of Dr. Roy S. Lanterman (b.

1869). The California State Assemblyman Frank Dexter Lanterman (b. 1901), his nephew, is his namesake.

24. Harriet Lanterman (1888-1965), portrait, c. 1900s.

In this portrait of young Harriet Lanterman, she is wearing a tailored dress and pearls. She is the daughter of Frank D. Lanterman (b. 1862) and granddaughter of Jacob Lanterman (b. 1827).

25. Harriet Lanterman (1888-1965), portrait, c. 1900s.

Studio portrait of a young Harriet Lanterman wearing a wide-brimmed hat and a white dress with a "natural" background. She is the daughter of Frank D. Lanterman (b. 1862) and granddaughter of Jacob Lanterman (b. 1827).

Possibly the first wife of Frank D. Lanterman (b. 1862). She is standing in a plaid dress next to a table with a small bust of a woman on it.

Tinted photograph on a translucent base of an unknown female Lanterman family member. She is wearing a pink flowered dress and an elaborate tiered necklace. Hand-colored/tinted negative.

Unidentified family member photographed on August 16, 1942, location unknown. Most probably one of Frank and Lloyd Lanterman's aunts, this woman is sitting outside in a dotted dress and black heeled shoes.

George Bulloch, most probably the child of one of the Lanterman family's friends. The photograph was taken on his first birthday.
44. Dorothy Clark, portrait, undated
Glamorous portrait of Lanterman family friend Dorothy Clark taken while she was visiting Italy.
45. Jeanne Clark Mills, portrait, age 6, 1928
Childhood photograph of Lanterman family friend Jeanne Clark Mills at age 6. She is sitting outdoors on a chair in a flowered dress.
46. Florence Pate, as infant with mother, c. 1904
Portrait of Florence Pate (1904-1956) as an infant being held by her mother, Mary. Florence would later be engaged to Lloyd Lanterman before her untimely death
47. Florence Pate as a young woman, portrait, May 12, 1927
Portrait of a young Florence Pate (1904-1956), in a sleeveless dress with a flower corsage. Florence and her family were close friends with the Roy Lanterman family and was later engaged to Lloyd Lanterman before her untimely death.
48. Florence Pate, standing with Roy Lanterman in background, c. 1920s
Photograph of a young Florence Pate (1903-1956) in a long-sleeved dress outside, probably in La Canada, where she and the Lanterman family lived. Roy Lanterman is standing behind her in the distance.
49. Florence Pate, portrait, c. 1950s
Portrait of Florence Pate (1904-1956) in a bright yellow blouse and glasses. The black and white image was tinted to give the image a more realistic look. Florence was a close friend of the Lanterman family and would later be engaged to Lloyd Lanterman.

50. Florence Pate, standing with unidentified friend, c. 1950s
Florence Pate (1904-1956) standing on the right in a plaid seersucker shirt dress and glasses. Florence and her family were close friends with the Roy Lanterman family.
51. Florence Pate, standing in front of a cross, c. 1950s
Florence Pate (1904-1956), probably on vacation, standing next to a large white cross on top of a hill. Florence and her family were close friends with the Roy Lanterman family.
52. Florence Pate, standing outside, c. 1950s
Florence Pate (1904-1956), probably on vacation, standing on top of a hill. Florence and her pioneer family were close friends with the Roy Lanterman family.
53. Brenda Peterson, portrait, age 2, undated postcard
Portrait of Brenda Peterson as a baby, most probably the child of one of Frank Lanterman's (b. 1901) friends. Lanterman traveled to Australia to work as an organist for silent movies during the late 1920s.
54. Albert G. Ralphs, portrait, undated
Portrait of a young Albert G. Ralphs (1897-1973), son of the founder of the Ralphs grocery store chain in Southern California. The Ralphs family lived on the same street as Roy Lanterman family during the 1900s when they lived on Arapahoe street in Los Angeles.
55. Albert G. Ralphs, portrait, undated
Portrait of a young Albert G. Ralphs (1897-1973), son of the founder of the Ralphs grocery store chain in Southern California. His family lived on Arapahoe Street in Los Angeles at the same time as the Lantermans.

Annabell Ralphs (b. 1904) is the daughter of the Ralphs grocery store chain in Southern California and sister of Albert G. Ralphs. Her family lived on Arapahoe Street in Los Angeles at the same time as the Lantermans.

Full-length portrait of Annabell Ralphs (b. 1904), daughter of the founder of the Ralphs grocery store chain in Southern California. She is posed in a white dress in front of a "Classical" background with an Arts and Crafts style vase.

Portrait of Helen Bobbie Shupe, Lanterman family friend, wearing a floral printed jacket.
60. Unidentified man in military uniform, portrait, undated
Portrait of an unidentified Lanterman family friend who was a pilot during World War I.

Portrait of Stella Bell Lanterman La Fetra (b. 1858) and her brother Frank D. Lanterman (b. 1862), the children of Dr. Jacob Lanterman and brother of Dr. Roy S. Lanterman. The Lanterman family moved to La Canada in the 1870s.
73. Ammoretta, Jacob, and Stella (?) Lanterman with unidentified man, Catalina Island, CA, c. 1880s
Photograph of Ammoretta Lanterman, her husband, Jacob, her daughter Stella, and an unidentified man, possibly her son Roy or Frank. The photo was taken while the family was visiting Catalina Island.

Photograph of Stella Lanterman La Fetra and her brother Frank Lanterman (b. 1862) standing in front of the La Fetra family home in Glendora. Stella and Frank are the siblings of Dr. Roy Lanterman owner of the Lanterman House in La Canada.
75. Roy Lanterman family portrait, c. 1917
Family portrait of the Roy Lanterman family, seen from upper left: sons Lloyd and Frank, with parent Roy and Emily Lanterman sitting in front. The Lantermans are sitting in the living room of their home, which they called "El Retiro," and which is now known as the Lanterman House.
76. Roy and Emily Lanterman, portrait, c. 1920s
Portrait of Dr. Roy Lanterman and his wife, Emily taken in the living room of their home, "El Retiro," in La Canada, California. They were the parents of California State Assemblyman Frank D. Lanterman and his brother Lloyd.

Family portrait of the Roy Lanterman family, identified from left: son Frank, mother Emily, father Roy, and son Lloyd. The Lantermans are sitting in the living room of their home, called "El Retiro," in La Canada, California. The Lanterman family moved to California in the 1870s.

Portrait of the Lanterman brothers, Frank D. (b. 1901) and Lloyd Lanterman. Frank was a California State Assemblyman for many years, and Lloyd was an engineer and inventor.

Photograph of Frank D. (b. 1901) and Lloyd Lanterman playing outside of the Lanterman family's Arapahoe Street home in Los Angeles. It is when they lived on this street that they were neighbors to the Ralphs family, who founded the Ralphs grocery store chain in Southern California.
80. Emily and Frank Lanterman outside the door of the Lanterman House annex, (now the office of the Lanterman Archivist), 1912.
Photograph of Emily and son Frank D. (b. 1901) standing next to part of what was to become the Lanterman's three car garage. The family lived there while their home, the Lanterman House, was being constructed. This area is now the Lanterman House Archivist's office.

Photograph of Emily and son Lloyd standing outside of the Lanterman House next to the pergola. Emily has her right hand on Lloyd's shoulder. Lloyd was an engineer and an inventor.
84. Emily, Frank, and Roy Lanterman posing in front of the wisterias at the Lanterman House, c. 1920s
Emily, Frank D. (b. 1901), and Roy S. Lanterman standing in front of the wisterias at the Lanterman House. The house has a pergola around it that supports numerous wisteria plants around it. Frank Lanterman later became a California State Assemblyman for many years.
85. Emily and Roy Lanterman standing by the sundial on the Lanterman House grounds, c. 1920s
Emily and Roy S. Lanterman stand next to a sundial that stood close to their home, "El Retiro," which is in the background. The Lanterman House was built in 1915 of reinforced concrete, a rarity during that time.
86. Emily and Roy Lanterman at the Billabeck's home, Santa Monica, CA, September 8, 1929
Photograph of Roy, Emily, and Lloyd Lanterman standing in the backyard of the Billabeck's home in Santa Monica, California. The image was a birthday gift from their friends, the Clark family.

Photograph of Roy and Emily Lanterman with their dog on their property in La Canada, California. In the background can be seen numerous roses planted as part of the landscaping for the Lanterman House.

Photograph of Roy and Emily Lanterman with their dog, and their home, "El Retiro" in the background. Now known as the Lanterman house, the home was built in 1915 and designed by Arthur Haley.
