Collection Description

Collection Overview

This collection consists of 128 letters and a few other items such as invitations, notes, and announcements collected by Lucy Sherman Clark. Lucy Clark Sherman was the recipient of the majority of the letters, although some are addressed to Eli P. Clark or Moses H. Sherman. The bulk of the items date from 1875 to 1891 when the Clarks and Shermans lived in Prescott, Arizona.

Most of the letters to Lucy are from Eli P. Clark, both before and after their marriage in 1880. Eli wrote these letters to Lucy when he traveled to carry out his duties as Territorial Auditor and to operate sawmills in Walnut Grove, south of Prescott. These letters shed light on their relationship, business dealings, health, and travel. Lucy received other letters from family members, primarily her father, Enoch Sterling Sherman of West Rupert Vermont and her sister Kate Sherman. Her brother, Moses H. Sherman, wrote on occasion after he moved to Phoenix in 1884 and Los Angeles in 1890.

A few of the letters from territorial officials sent to E. P. Clark in his role as Arizona Territorial Auditor are primarily of a transactional nature. These includes letters from John C. Fremont, John P. Hoyt, John J. Gosper and John S. Vosburg.

Biographical Notes

Lucy Sherman Clark (1847-1942)

Lucy Helen Sherman was born on February 11, 1851 in West Rupert, Vermont to Enoch Sterling Sherman and Miranda Wright Warner. She was raised on the family farm. In addition to farming, E. S. Sherman worked as a teacher on several occasions during Lucy's youth. The family placed a significance on education and the teachings of the Congregationalist church. Following in the footsteps of her father and brother, Moses Hazeltine Sherman, Lucy trained as a teacher at the Oswego Normal School and taught in schools near the family home.

In 1876, Lucy moved to Prescott, Arizona to teach alongside her brother Moses at the Prescott Free Academy. She worked as a teacher in Prescott until 1880, when she married Eli P. Clark, a local merchant and the Auditor of the Arizona Territory. Lucy and Eli had three daughters and a son -- Lucy Mason born July 17, 1881; Mary Sherman born May 12, 1884; Katherine T. born July 31, 1886 and Eugene P. born September 26, 1890.

In 1891, the family moved to Los Angeles, where Eli and Lucy's brother Moses founded the Los Angeles Consolidated Electric Railway and later engaged in many business ventures, including the Los Angeles Pacific Railway and the Clark and Sherman Land Company.

Lucy Sherman Clark passed away on June 10, 1942.

Eli P. Clark (1847-1931)

Eli P. Clark was born in Solon, Iowa, near Iowa City on November 25, 1847. At a young age his family moved to Grinnell, Iowa. He attended Iowa College and taught in local schools. Around 1867 Clark moved with his father to Neosho in southwest Missouri where they farmed.

In 1873, Clark was incapacitated by a "stroke of sciatica" and was advised by a doctor to move to a warmer climate. On May 5, 1875 Clark and his friend D. A. Adams departed for

Arizona by wagon. The pair arrived in Prescott, Arizona on August 11, 1875. After briefly moving to Williamson to farm, Clark took a position as clerk, working for Theodore W. Otis, the Prescott postmaster. It was during this time that Clark met the local schoolmaster, Moses H. Sherman. Both men became active in the Republican Party. Clark was also active in the Congregationalist Church. In August 1876, Clark began working as a clerk for C. P. Head & Company. About the same time, Lucy Helen Sherman, the sister of M. H. Sherman, arrived in Prescott to teach at the local school.

In 1877, Clark, with D. A. Adams, established the Clark and Adams lumber company [check official name]. In 1877, Clark was also appointed to the first of five two-year terms as Territorial Auditor of Arizona. It was also about this time that Clark began to court Lucy Sherman. The pair married in 1880 and over the next decade had three daughters and a son.

In 1891, the Clark family moved to Los Angeles, where Clark and M. H. Sherman developed the Los Angeles Consolidated Electric Railway, the Los Angeles and Pasadena Railway, and the Los Angeles Pacific Railway. The two men also invested in land through the Clark and Sherman Land Company. In 1906, Clark organized the Mt. Hood Railway and Power Company of Portland Oregon. And in 1913, Clark established Hotel Clark on Hill St. in Los Angeles.

Clark was one of the co-founders of the Better America Federation, a group founded in 1920 that opposed Communism, Socialism and organized labor. In his later years he was an active member of the Board of Trustees of Pomona College. Clark died on January 16, 1931.
