Abstract

The Harold Q. Seitz Photographic Collection documents his personal life, family, and activities as a photographer in the Wilmington, California area between 1948 and 1958. The collection consists of studio portraits, snapshots, and photojournalistic images, and is arranged into two series organized alphabetically by topic.

Biographical History

Harold Quentin Seitz was born in Humboldt, Richardson County, Nebraska on December 27, 1919, to parents Henry A. and Violet A. Seitz (née Carsh). Following graduation from high school, Seitz worked as a clerk for a bakery. He married Ola Mae Cloyd on December 11, 1940. Cloyd was born in Thayer County, Nebraska on April 29, 1919, to parents Percy A. and Rosa Cloyd (née Zimmerman), and was a graduate of the Lincoln General Hospital School of Nursing. In late 1941, Harold and Ola Mae, along with Harold's parents, moved to California and settled in Long Beach. The couple had two sons, the first in 1943 and the second in 1950. Just prior to their second son's birth, the family moved to Wilmington, California.

Seitz began working as a salesman for the Western Auto Supply Company in Long Beach soon after his arrival to California. In 1944, he received a promotion to manager and was transferred to the Wilmington location. A few years later, he was transferred to the Compton location. Seitz was an avid photography buff and worked part-time as a professional photographer with many of his photos appearing in local newspapers. He was a member of Masonic Lodge #543 in Long Beach, Long Beach Elks Lodge #886, and was a charter member of the Wilmington Optimist Club. The family attended Calvary Presbyterian Church in Wilmington.

Harold Q. Seitz died in Arizona on January 2, 1988 and is buried at Green Hills Memorial Park in Rancho Palos Verdes, California.

Scope and Contents

The Harold Q. Seitz Photographic Collection documents his personal life, family, and activities as a photographer in the Wilmington, California area between 1948 and 1958. The collection is arranged into two series: Series I, Personal Photographs, and Series II, Professional Photographs (1948-1958).

Series I, Personal Photographs, consists of snapshots and studio portraits depicting pets, birthday parties, holidays, weddings, family gatherings and outings, and other events. This series is arranged alphabetically by topic.

Series II, Professional Photographs (1948-1958), consists of images related to community events such as charity drives, community theater, school activities, holiday parties, and beauty pageants, as well as businesses, civic organizations, and community groups. The series also includes publicity photos and a number of images depicting newsworthy events, such as automobile accidents and crime. This series is arranged alphabetically by topic.
