## BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

Tandy Beal, born March 7, 1948, is an American director, choreographer, performer, and teacher of dance. She has performed as both a solo artist and in an ensemble with the Tandy Beal & Company founded in 1974 in Santa Cruz, California. She originally started her career by dancing with The Alwin Nikolais Dance Theater, but has also performed with Remy Charlip, Carolyn Carlson, and done guest appearances with the Atlanta Ballet, MOMIX, Lisa Giobbi, The Oakland Ballet, as well as performing off Broadway. She has created works of dance for the circus, film, television, theater, opera, and animation. She wrote, directed, and choreographed the New Pickle Circus (1993-2001) and the Moscow Circus. She created the first alternative "Nutcracker" using dance and circus and has done several multimedia performances, namely "Outside Blake's Window". She has performed on the Emmy award winning "Voice/Dance", MTV's "The Garden", choreographed all the characters' movement in Tim Burton's "The Nightmare Before Christmas", and directed "Buried Light" a film on Hildegard von Bingen. She has collaborated with singers and musicians: Bobby McFerrin, Frank Zappa, Art Lande, Paul McCandles, John Adams, Jean Stapleton, and her husband Jon Scoville. She has had long term teaching affiliations with the Universities of Utah and California at Santa Cruz, as well as Cabrillo College. Beal has had residencies at the Centre de Danse Contemporaine in Angers, France, The Esalen Institute, Mills College, University of Louvain in Brussels, and has conducted dance workshops all over the world. She has received many awards for her work including: The American Council for the Arts Dance Artist of the Year, Dance Bay Area Award for Innovation, and a solo theater fellowship and three year choreography fellowship from the National Endowment for the Arts.

John Beal, father of Tandy Beal, born August 13, 1909 in Joplin, Missouri as James Alexander Bliedung (deceased April 26, 1997) was the son of Edmund and Agnes (Harragan) Bliedung. Beal was an actor of stage, film, and radio, as well as a director, a portrait artist, and the proprietor of the Actor's Hobby Market who graduated from the Wharton School of Finance and Commerce at the University of Pennsylvania in 1930. His first acting experience occurred in the Mask and Wig productions at the University of Pennsylvania and helped to solidify his interest in acting. He married actress Helen Craig on July 13, 1934 and had two daughters: Tita (Theodora) and Tandy. Beal also served in the United States of America Air Force between 1942 and 1945 as a S/Sgt member of the AEA (1940-47). Beal made his stage debut as Mephistopheles in a Mask and Wig Club musical "John Foust, PhD" (1930). As an actor, he played various small roles in the theater until he appeared as Jerry Hallam in "The Hallam Wives" which became "Another Language" in 1932. This production was taken to Hollywood and a movie was made which included most of the original cast thus starting his long and varied movie career. Some of Beal's stage appearances include: "Another Language" (1932), "Russet Mantle" (1936), "Soliloquy" (1938), "Liberty Jones" (1941), "The Voice of the Turtle" (1943), "Lend an Ear" (1948), "Jollyanna" (1952), "The Fourposter" (1954), "Teahouse of the August Moon" (1953), "Everyman Today" (1958), "Our Town" (1959 and 1969), "Calculated Risk" (1962), "The Crucible" (1991), and "Three Men on a Horse" (1993). His movie career includes: "Another Language"

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(1933), "The Little Minister" (1934), "Les Miserables" (1935), "Break of Hearts" (1935), "Madame X" (1937), "Arkansas Traveler" (1938), "The Cat and the Canary" (1939), "Ellery Queen and the Perfect Crime" (1941), "Atlantic Convoy" (1942), "One Thrilling Night" (1942), "Edge of Darkness" (1943), "The Vampire" (1957), "The Sound and the Fury" (1959), "Ten Who Dared" (1960), "Amityville 3-D" (1983), and "The Firm" (1993).

Helen Craig, mother of Tandy Beal, born May 13, 1912 in San Antonio, Texas (deceased July 20, 1986), was the daughter of Edward and Emily (Cauthorn) Craig. Craig was an actress and teacher of primarily live theater, but also an actress of television and film. Helen Craig married actor John Beal July 13, 1934 and had two daughters: Tita (Theodora) and Tandy. She made her New York debut as Manuelita in "Russet Mantel" (1936) with actor/husband John Beal. She is best known for her role as Belinda McDonald, a deaf mute, in "Johnny Belinda" (1940). Other stage productions include, but are not limited to: "Julius Caesar" (1937), "Soliloquy" (1938), "Johnny Belinda" (1940), "The Unconquered" (1940), "As You Like It" (1941), "Lute Song" (1946), "Land's End" (1947), "Antigone" (1949), "The House of Bernarda Alba" (1951), "Maya" (1953), "Tower Beyond Tragedy" (1956), and "More Stately Mansions" (1967). Helen Craig also performed in movies such as: "They Live by Night" (1948), "The Snake Pit" (1948), and "Rancho Deluxe" (1975). She also appeared in several television shows and made for television movies.

The New Pickle Circus (1992-2000), originally the Pickle Family Circus (1974-1992), specialized in performances that combined music, drama, dance, and humor with traditional circus skills without the use of animals. In 1992 Tandy Beal signed on as artistic director and choreographer saving the Pickle Family Circus from bankruptcy through her Friends of Olympia Station nonprofit organization which jointly owned Tandy Beal & Company as well. In addition to Tandy Beal's contribution, aerial acrobatics and other circus-like performance feats fell to master trainer Mr. Lu Yi, formerly the head of the Nanjing Acrobatic Troupe. The New Pickle Circus featured versatile artists who juggled, tumbled, performed aerial acrobatics, and incorporated traditions of American and Russian Circus as well as Chinese acrobatics into a one ring, all human extravaganza. The New Pickle Circus also had a variety of clowns, primarily Pino (Diane Wasnak) and Razz (Jeff Razz) who also did solo shows without the entire circus. In 2000 Tandy Beal sold the new Pickle Circus to the San Francisco School for Circus Arts (1984- present) in 2001. The New Pickle Circus has retained its' name, but is now part of the Circus Center and puts on performances under the billing of The New Pickle Circus.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Tandy Beal Family Papers document the careers of John Beal, Helen Craig, and Tandy Beal from 1930 to 2001. The collection includes personal and business materials, correspondence, publicity ephemera, press kits, press releases, newspaper clippings, programs, scripts, photographs, and scrapbooks. In particular the John Beal and Helen Craig portion of the collection includes movie stills, headshots, and scrapbooks on various movies/plays they performed in. The New Pickle Circus Collection contains booking information, tour site location information, and performance specifications. The Tandy Beal & Company Collection contains primarily publicity materials of the dance company.

## SERIES DESCRIPTION

### **Series I : John Beal and Helen Craig**

13 cartons, 8 flat boxes.

Contains materials relating to John Beal and Helen Craig, primarily relating to their careers on the stage and on film. Includes 13 series: Personal, Business, Publicity, Press Kits, Press Releases, Newspaper Clippings, Programs, Programs Attended, Scripts, Photographs, Correspondence, Scrapbooks, and Audio/Video Recordings.

#### *Sub-series 1: Personal*

18 folders.

Contains biographical material, including: pencil/pen sketches, a journal, random notes, an address book, awards, and theater magazines.

#### *Sub-series 2: Business*

49 folders.

Contains various resumes for both John and Helen, actor cabinet cards, materials relating to Actor's Hobby Market, contracts, and notes/schedules relating to particular productions that John Beal and Helen Craig performed in.

#### *Sub-series 3: Publicity*

59 folders.

Contains printed publicity materials relating to stage and movie production that John and Helen were in. Items include: table tents, posters, flyers, postcards, and etc.

#### *Sub-series 4: Press Kits*

2 folders.

Contains press kits which include images and quotes from particular productions.

#### *Sub-series 5: Press Releases*

17 folders.

Contains press releases related to different productions acted in by John and Helen. Also includes press releases relating directly to John Beal, Helen Craig, and the Actor's Hobby Market.

*Sub-series 6: Newspaper Clippings*  
4 Cartons.

Contains reviews, newspaper advertisements, and notifications of productions acted in by John Beal and Helen Craig. Also contains personal interviews, articles relating to the Actor's Hobby Market, and Tita and Tandy Beal.

*Sub-series 7: Programs*  
114 folders.

Contains programs from stage performances John Beal and Helen Craig performed in. This series also includes broadcast radio and t.v programs. In addition, this collection also contains programs in which Helen Craig directed school performances, Tita Beal acted in, and Tandy Beal performed in as a child.

*Sub-series 8: Programs Attended*  
96 folders.

This series contains programs which the Beal family attended and may have been influenced by.

*Sub-series 9: Scripts*  
1 carton.

Contains full scripts and partial scripts performed by and submitted to John Beal and Helen Craig. This series also contains sheet music for "Dragons: The Musical", "The Edge of Darkness", and from the Mask and Wig Club.

*Sub-series 10: Photographs*  
4 cartons.

Contains headshots of John Beal and Helen Craig at various points in their acting careers, movie stills from movies and plays from productions such as "Another Language", "The Little Minister", "Soliloquy", "The Great Commandment", and "Voice of the Turtle".

*Sub-series 11: Correspondence*  
1 carton.

Includes both personal and business correspondence to and from John Beal and Helen Craig. Included in the personal correspondence are: Florence Rice Butler, Lynn Redgrave, Carol Stone, and Paula Stone. Also

included are signed cast cards, telegrams, letters from agents, and letters regarding the Actor's Hobby Market.

*Sub-series 12: Scrapbooks*  
8 flat boxes.

Contains scrapbooks of both John Beal and Helen Craig documenting their stage and movie performances by means of clippings, programs, magazine images and etc. Twelve of the scrapbooks documents the career of John Beal, while five of the scrapbooks document the career of Helen Craig. There are two scrapbooks documenting the Actor's Hobby Market bringing the total number of scrapbooks to 19. One excessively large scrapbook labeled Beal sbk XII contains information about Beal's early life while in Joplin, MO.

*Sub-series 13: Audio/Video Tapes*  
3 reel to reel audio tapes.

Tapes include: Mr. Lincoln/Broadway Version 2/13/1980; John Beal 4/23/1993; and Tails Out 4/23/1993. Stored together with videos from other parts of the collection in box 23.

**Series II. New Pickle Circus**  
6 cartons.

Contains items related to the running of the New Pickle Circus. Includes 13 series: Business, Financial, Tours/Performance Data, Publicity, Publicity Reports, Press Kits, Press Releases, Programs, Newspaper Clippings, Photographs, Correspondence, Circus Related, and Audio/Video Recordings.

*Sub-series 1: Business*  
43 folders.

Contains information relating to company biographies, assessment reports, employee handbooks, itineraries, newsletter materials, the San Francisco Circus Center, radio spots, outreach and education programs, and etc dealing with the running of the New Pickle Circus.

*Sub-series 2: Financial*  
25 folders.

Contains information concerning the financial running of the New Pickle Circus which also include grant applications, box office statistics, and the Pickle Family Circus bankruptcy.

*Sub-series 3: Tours/Performance Data*

1 carton.

Contains contracts, site information, performance dates, maps, and other general information about each performance given by the New Pickle Circus between 1992 and 1999.

*Sub-series 4: Publicity*

26 folders.

Contains advertising mark-ups, flyers, post cards, brochures, and newsletters for the New Pickle Circus and some Pickle Family Circus all of which is arranged by year.

*Sub-series 5: Publicity Reports*

3 folders.

Contains publicity reports (a gathering of clippings reviewing the show at one particular location) for both Mountain View and the Cowell Theater, San Francisco.

*Sub-series 6: Press Kits*

7 folders.

Contains press kits for the Pickle Family Circus as well as the New Pickle Circus. Included in the press kits are: clippings, history of the Pickle Circus, brochures, posters and etc.

*Sub-series 7: Press Releases*

1 folder.

Contains all the press releases for the New Pickle Circus in the collection.

*Sub-series 8: Programs*

10 folders.

Contains programs from 1990 to 2000 for both the Pickle Family Circus and the New Pickle Circus. Also contains undated programs and mark-up copies.

*Sub-series 9: Newspaper Clippings*

16 folders.

Contains clippings from both the Pickle Family Circus and the New Pickle Circus from 1983 to 1999. This subseries also contains mark-ups of clippings used in the publicity packets.

*Sub-series 10: Photographs*  
20 folders.

Contains photographs, slides, and negatives of the New Pickle Circus. Includes cast photographs of the Pickle Family Circus as well as cast photographs of the New Pickle Circus and publicity shots from shows such as "Jump Cuts!", "The Big Bang", "Pickle Slices", and Jingle Pickles". This subseries also contains photographs of outreach programs and advertising for the Infiniti car.

*Sub-series 11: Correspondence*  
5 folders.

Contains correspondence and memos relating to the daily operation and booking of the New Pickle Circus. This subseries also contains several letters of support and thank you cards.

*Sub-series 12: Circus Related*  
4 folders.

Contains articles, advertisements, and questionnaires relating to other circus groups such as: The Big Apple Circus, Cirque du Soleil, Cirque Eloize, and the circus performer Masha.

*Sub-series 13: Audio/Video Tapes*

31 VSH tapes, 27 Beta tapes, 5 3/4 inch tapes, and 1 reel to reel audio tape.

VHS tapes are in box #22. All other tapes are in box # 23. This collection consists primarily of New Pickle Circus commercials, t.v. guest appearances, and radio spots.

**Series III.: Tandy Beal and Company**

1 carton.

Contains items relating to the history and publicity for the Tandy Beal and Company dance company. Includes 8 series: Business, Publicity, Press Kits, Newspaper Clippings, Programs, Correspondence, Dance Related, and Audio/Video Recordings.

*Sub-series 1: Business*

Contains the annual report for the Center for the Arts at Yerba Buena Gardens, 1993-1994. Tandy Beal & Company is mentioned inside.

*Sub-series 2: Publicity*  
22 folders.

Contains publicity materials such as brochures, posters, flyers, mailings, and etc. from 1978 to 2003.

*Sub-series 3: Press Kits*  
1 folder.

Contains the information that should have been in a folder with the press kit. Included in this folder is a Tandy Beal profile, a company history, and some critical responses to the company.

*Sub-series 4: Newspaper Clippings*  
20 folders.

Contains newspaper clippings relating to either Tandy Beal or the Company from 1981 to 1998. Also included in this subseries are the mark-up copies used for publicity kits.

*Sub-series 5: Programs*  
21 folders.

Contains performance programs for Tandy Beal & Company from 1976 to 2001.

*Sub-series 6: Correspondence*  
1 folder.

Contains letters of support for Tandy Beal & Company as well as for Tandy herself.

*Sub-series 7: Dance Related*  
5 folders.

Contains newspaper clippings relating to other dance companies such as: Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Alwin Nikolais Dance Theater, Dancers, and the New York City Ballet.

*Sub-series 8: Audio/Video Tapes*  
2 VHS cassette tapes.

Contains "Outside Blake's Window" and "Excerpts From Nightlife".
