This series contains books and pamphlets amassed by Gilbert and Sallie Reid during their time in Peking and Shanghai. The series reflects Sallie Reid’s involvement in social reform causes. Included are a report on the working conditions of Shanghai rickshaw drivers, a report on beggars published by the Shanghai Settlement House, a Chinese translation of an American cookbook, and reports of the Ladies’ International Club of Shanghai.

Series 4: Photographs and prints, circa 1890-1930

Scope and Contents

This series contains a photographic chronicle of Gilbert and Sallie Reid's experience in the besieged Legation Quarter during the Boxer Rebellion of 1900. It is not known whether or not the photographs or inscriptions were created by the Reids. However, the handwritten inscriptions on the photographs are likely those of Sallie Reid. This series also includes an extensive number of photographs of Chinese officials, most of whom are unidentified. The series also contains portrait and group photographs of Gilbert Reid, views of the International Institute of China, and portraits of the Reid family with Chinese attendants.
