Aguayo-Garcia was active in the activist organizations Queer Nation/San Francisco as well as Bad Cop/No Donut. He went on to found efficy metals, an S and M and kink jewelry catalog where he sold his own designs. His company remains in business at .com

Bush as well as a series of posters that were part of a safe sex campaign illustrating various safe sex activities (the "Safe/Unsafe" campaign). Also in this collection are posters from the "Just Sex/Sex Is" campaign which "challenged viewers to deconstruct their own sexual ideology." In the first folder in the series contains a document produced by the Queer activist collective "Boy With Arms Akimbo/Girl With Arms Akimbo" about their activities.
